





Is this due to a sheer love of hairsplitting on the part of law-nutrients. yers? Not at all. Law is like that because life is like that. Anyone who has watched a Little League baseball game knows that it is the "close ones" which start the squabbles and test the mettle of the umpire.

And the world of law is, largely, a world of close ones. It is a world where ifs and maybes abound, and yeses and noes are few and far between. The law, willy-nilly, must provide answers to questions like these:

At what point does "indifference" shade into "mental cruel-

speed"? When does a man cross the line

between "high" and "drunk"? No wonder one harassed judge said that deciding such questions is like deciding "when a young

lady gets to be an old maid." Perhaps the questions are closest of all in the cases that reach the United States Supreme Court Chief Justice Charles Evans Hughes once estimated that at least one third of the Court's cases are so close that unanimous decisions are humanly impossible.

So why shouldn't hairs be split in the pursuit of justice?


