

CROP INSURANCE WILL STATE

The Agricultural Adjus ment act of 1538 set up the Federal Crop Insurance commission, with a capital stock of \$100,000,000 subscribed by the United States of America, and an appropriation by the fibral year ending June 30 was provided not to exceed \$25,006,000.

More fram \$,500 Texas growers lave paid prendums for such insurance on the winter wheat crop to be harvested in 1939, and about \$35,000 acres in Texas are safeguarded against crop failure, according to information sent to the Texas A. and M. cellege campus headquarters of the AAA by E. R. Duke, state crop insurance supervisor with offices in Amarillo.
