| A preliminary meeting of county judges，city mayors and other officials was held in Lubbock Friday afternoon to canvsas the unemployment situation of West Texas，at which time it was decided to hold another meeting in that same city，at the Hilton hotel， Thursday afternoon，January 19，be－ ginning promptly at $1: 30$ oclock．The forthcoming meeting also has the sanction of Homer Bouldin，presiden＇t， West Texas County Judges and Com－ missioners association，and all county judges，mayors and other county and city officials are urged to attend． <br> Commenting upon the proposed Thursday meeting，M．G．Miller county judge of Bailey county said： <br> ＂Our information is that at present the WPA is having to lay off a goodly number of workers because of lack of money－that the number of unemploy－ | ed who are qualified for WPA work is increasing by leaps and bounds． <br> Because an effort is being made in Congress to reduce WPA－funds，and perhaps require local governmental units to assume more responsibility， both as to financial and managerial assitance，we believe there is a defin－ ite probability of the situation becom－ ing even more acute． <br> Because of the seriousness of this situation，we believe it the duty of county，city and school officials to get together and devise ways and means of presenting this matter to Congress． <br> The purpose of the meeting next Thursday will be to get the true facts in connection with this situation－to decide whether or not to present these facts to Congress，and how－and，in－ sofar as possible，to learn firsthand the present requirements of WPA and our responsibilties in connection therewith |

So here's a tip to follow for better lighting: See that every reading lamp has at least one 100 -watt Mazda lamp. two 60 's, or three 40 's.
Beccuse different sockets have different needs, wo have prepared a special carton of one 40 -watt, two 60 -watt, one 75 -watt, one 100 -watt and one 150 -watt lamps for only 95 c . Oi a carton of six 100 -walt, or any size smaller, for 90 c . All Marda lamp purchases will be added to next month's service bill if desired.
