On January 3rd, 1983, the Sutton County National Bank officially started conducting business in Sutton County. The original bank charter, owned by Westex Bancorp, Inc., was a sister bank to the Del Rio Bank & Trust. The bank was founded by S. W. Cauthorn, Chairman of the Board, with board members Jerry Don Balch, Randee Fawcett, W B McMillan, Doyle Morgan, James Parker, Walter C. Pope, III, John R. Tedford Jr., Lemuel Lopez, A.W. Bishop, President, and Ray Smith, Vice-President/Cashier.

In the 30 years since the Sutton County National Bank, now The Bank & Trust, has become an integral part of Sonora and Sutton County. Brady Johnson, President & CEO stated, "As a community bank we strive to assist our customers in every way possible, including their mortgage, consumer, business, ranch real estate and commercial loan needs. We want to be our customers' "go to" bank when they need financial products and services. Our goal is to go above and beyond their expectations. We call it E2, Excellent and Exceptional customer service." Even in the face of most recent economic downturn The Bank & Trust continued to grow and prosper while others banks struggled. Johnson commented, "Our credit quality was unaffected for the most part by the economic turmoil of the last 5 years due to the banks outstanding customer base and sound underwriting practices. 



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

The chief appraiser may determine the medium. format, content and method to be used for electronic communications than notices required by Section 25.19 of the Tax Code, which are prescribed by Comptroller rule.

A decision by the chief appraiser not to enter into agreements may not be the subject of an appraisal review board protest, a lawsuit or a complaint to the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation.
