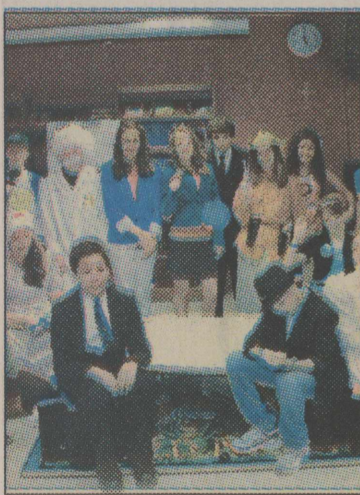

**Texas Economy Goes Global**

Gov. Rick Perry spoke at the Brazoria County Day Breakfast, highlighting his priorities to keep Texas the nation's economic leader by strengthening the state's competitive jobs climate, reducing the tax burden on Texans, and investing in infrastructure.

"Texas' economy has become the envy of the nation, due to the hard work, innovative spirit and dedication of entrepreneurs like those in Brazoria County, and the discipline of our state leadership in Austin," Gov. Perry said. "The foundation employers are building on is our job-friendly economic climate, which consistently draws the interest of top decision-makers across the business world, and gives them the opportunity to thrive and compete on a global scale."

The governor highlighted the importance of fiscal responsibility, and emphasized the principles outlined in the Texas Budget Compact - practicing truth in budgeting, creating a stronger constitutional limit on spending growth, opposing new taxes or tax increases and making the tax exemption for small businesses permanent, streamlining government by doing away with duplicative programs, and preserving a strong Rainy Day Fund. He also reiterated his call to provide tax relief to Texans.

Gov. Perry also discussed the need to invest in critical water and transportation infrastructure as Texas' population and economy continue to grow. He has called for the use of \$3.7 billion from the Rainy Day Fund for a one-time investment in water and transportation infrastructure projects.

## Would Your Child's Safety Seat Pass Inspection?

PERRYTON – The Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service office in Ochiltree County is hosting a child safety seat checkup event on March 28, and all parents are urged to attend to be sure they are properly installing and protecting their children, said Erica Hefner, AgriLife Extension family and consumer science agent for Ochiltree County.

Certified technicians will be available to provide on-site child safety seat inspections and education from 10 a.m.-1 p.m. at the Perryton Expo Center, 402 Expo Drive, Perryton. To make an appointment, call 806-435-4501.

Securing children properly in age- and size-appropriate child safety seats – in the back seat of the vehicle – is the most effective way to protect them in the event of a crash, according to the National Highway Safety Administration.

Highway safety statistics show child seats reduce the risk of fatal injury by 71 per-

cent for infants and by 54 percent for toddlers in motor vehicle crashes. From 1975 through 2010, an estimated 9,611 lives were saved by child restraints. Statistics show 41 percent of children killed in crashes are found to be unrestrained.

Even though the majority of parents buckle up their children in a child safety seat, booster seat or seat belt, most do not use them correctly. According to National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, nearly three out of four child safety seats are not used properly, which is a grave risk when traveling.

For a child safety seat to do its job right, it has to be:

- Appropriate for the child's age and size.

- Installed properly in the vehicle.

- Adjusted to fit the child securely.

"If you're a parent or caregiver, don't miss this opportunity to have a free child safety seat inspection by a certified child passenger safety techni-

cian," Hefner said. "Technicians can provide hands-on advice and instruction. Make sure your children are safe and you are in compliance with the current child safety seat law in Texas."

The law, which took effect in 2009, requires all children

under 8, unless taller than 4 foot 9 inches, to be in a child safety seat system, which includes traditional child safety seats with harnesses and booster seats.

## Sutton County is Winner of Texas Hog Out Challenge

Unfortunately, Texas has the largest feral hog population in the U.S. in recent years, and the numbers continue to increase due to their high reproductive potential and lack of predators. Feral hogs cause losses to property, livestock, crops, pastures and golf courses. Nearly 2.6 million feral hogs cause an estimated \$500 million in damage across Texas every year. Hogs are a problem to both rural and urban areas.

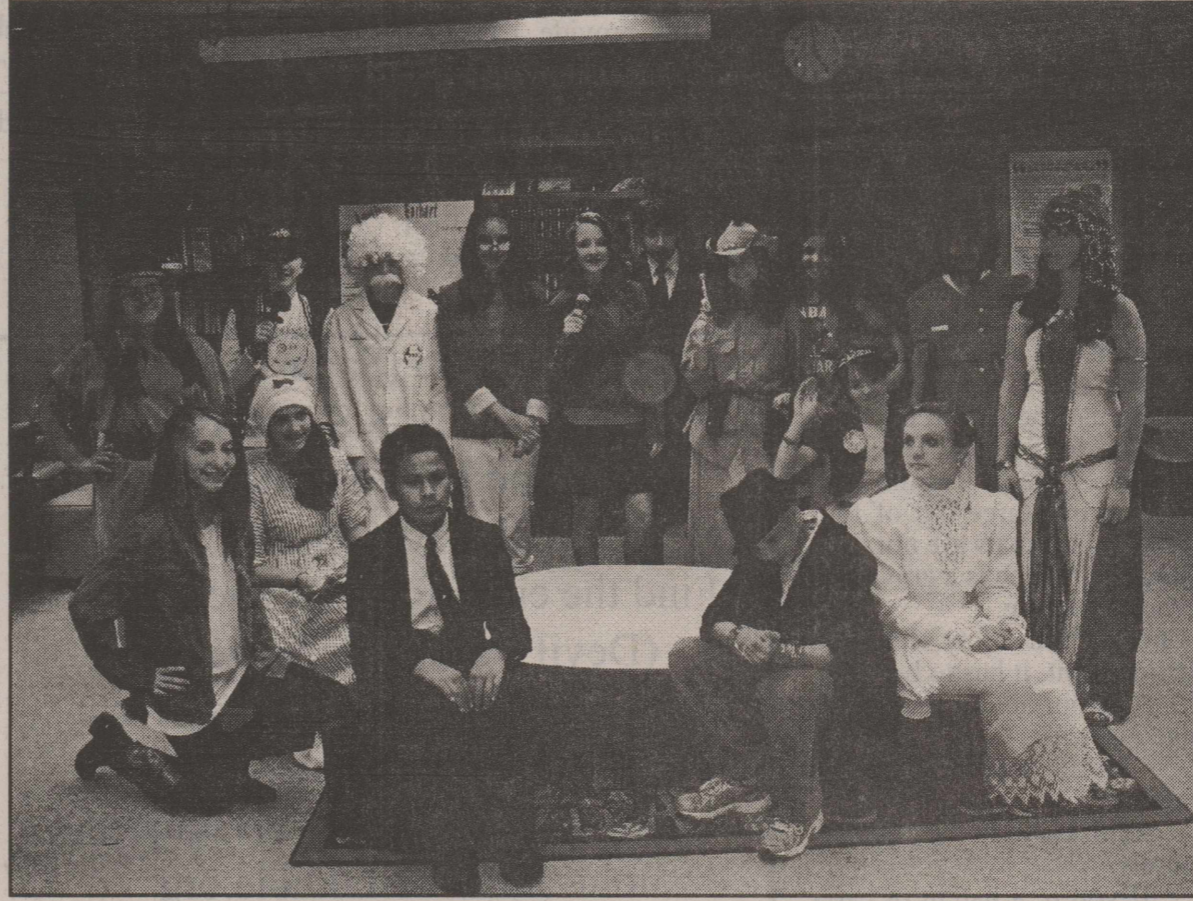
So, since 2010, the Texas Department of Agriculture has offered the Hog Out Challenge which lasts from October through December. Counties compete for funding on the basis of several performance metrics, including the number of hogs removed and number

of participants in educational events. To date, the challenge has resulted in the removal of 27,934 feral hogs. The top six counties of the 2012 statewide Hog-Out Challenge will divide up \$60,000. With the top-ranking, Sutton County will be receiving \$20,000!

The \$20,000 award will help continue or support current abatement activities. Funds will be available to winning counties on April first.

An immense word of thanks is owed to Jimmy & Sharon Holman, and the Sutton County Predator Management Association for their leadership, as well as Sutton County government for their support of the efforts.

## Gov. Perry Renews Proclamation Extending Drought Emergency

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME:

I, RICK PERRY, Governor of the State of Texas, issued an Emergency Disaster Proclamation on July 5, 2011, certifying that exceptional drought conditions posed a threat of imminent disaster in specified counties in Texas.

WHEREAS, record high temperatures, preceded by significantly low rainfall, have resulted in declining reservoir and aquifer levels, threatening water supplies and delivery systems in many parts of the state; and

WHEREAS, prolonged dry conditions continue to increase the threat of wildfire across many portions of the state; and

WHEREAS, these drought conditions have reached historic levels and continue to pose an imminent threat to public health, property and the economy.

THEREFORE, in accordance with the authority vested in me by Section 418.014 of the Texas Government Code, I do hereby renew the disaster proclamation and direct that all necessary measures, both public and private as authorized under Section 418.017 of the code, be implemented to meet that threat.

As provided in Section 418.016 of the code, all rules and regulations that may inhibit or prevent prompt response to this threat are suspended for the duration of the state of disaster.

In accordance with the statutory requirements, copies of this proclamation shall be filed with the applicable authorities.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I have hereunto signed my name and have officially caused the Seal of State to be affixed at my Office in the City of Austin, Texas, this the 22nd day of March, 2013.
