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



Austin, Dec. 14.—"It is a great mistake to treat even light cases of measless, chickenpox, mumps, scarlet fever, or any other of the communicable diseases of childhood as though they did not amount to much," states Dr. Geo. W. Cox, state health officer. "Treatment of that sort makes it possible for these distoses to spread and cause serious outbreak among children whose impaired resistance makes them easy victims to any form of infection cases."
