### SONORA, Texas (Tuesday, Dec. 31, 2014) — John A. Graves was selected as Chief Executive Officer of Lillian M. Hudspeth Memorial Hospital (LMH) during a noon Board meeting on Tuesday,

December 30, 2014. Mr. Graves is currently Senior Administrator of American Anesthesiology of North Carolina where he is responsible for anesthesia services for six hospitals and five ambulatory surgery centers in Raleigh and Wilson, NC. He retired from the United States Air Force as a Lieutenant Colonel in the Medical Service Corps.

Mr. Graves was chosen from a panel of five candidates developed by the hospital's search consultant. The Board selected three candidates who were interviewed by the hospital managers, the medical staff, community leaders and the board during day-long visits to Sonora.

In making the announcement, Preston Faris, board president, said the directors were impressed with Mr. Graves scope of prior leadership experience in operations, human resources, and medical practice management as well as his depth of experience in overseeing hospital financial operations. ### Sonora Broncos Named to THSCA Academic All-State

The Texas High School Coaches' Association recently released the list of football athletes named to the 2014 Academic All-State list. To be nominated, a student must be a football athlete, student trainer, or manager in good standing with the team, of good moral character, a senior, and have an overall grade point average of 92 or above (in-

completed in grade 12).

The head coach of the sport, who must be a member of the THSCA, makes the nomination. The THSCA considers each student's GPA, class rank, and SAT or ACT scores. Points are assigned to each criterion. The total number of points determines which team (Elite, 1st, 2nd or Honorable Mention) each athlete's placement. The Elite Team Member must have near perfect scores in all categories.

The following Broncos were nominated by Coach Phillips and met the THSCA criteria for Academic All-State: Santi Garza and H.L. James made 2nd Team while Elijah Cross, Hunter Hughes, Ethan Patlan, and Gabe Rollert were Honorable Mention.

### **Notice of Availability of Electronic Communications**

Sonora- Chief appraisers of county appraisal districts and appraisal review boards (ARBs) may communicate electronically through email or other media with property owners or their designated representatives. Written agreements are required for notices and other documents to be delivered electronically in place of mailing.

How does it work? Certain guidelines must be followed for this local option communication:

- Written agreements with the county appraisal district must be entered first, ensuring what electronic means of delivery are acceptable. If you are interested in receiving communications in electronic format, you should contact your local appraisal district.
- Public notice regarding the availability of agreement forms authorizing electronic communications may be published in a newspaper of general circulation in the district on or before Feb. 1 each year, or agreement forms may be delivered on or before Feb. 1 each year to property owners shown on the certified appraisal roll for the preceding tax year.
- The chief appraiser may determine the medium, format, content and method to be used for electronic communications other than notices required by Tax Code Section 25.19 which are prescribed by rule.
- A decision by the chief appraiser not to enter into agreements may bot be the subject of an ARB protest, a lawsuit or a complaint to the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation.
