

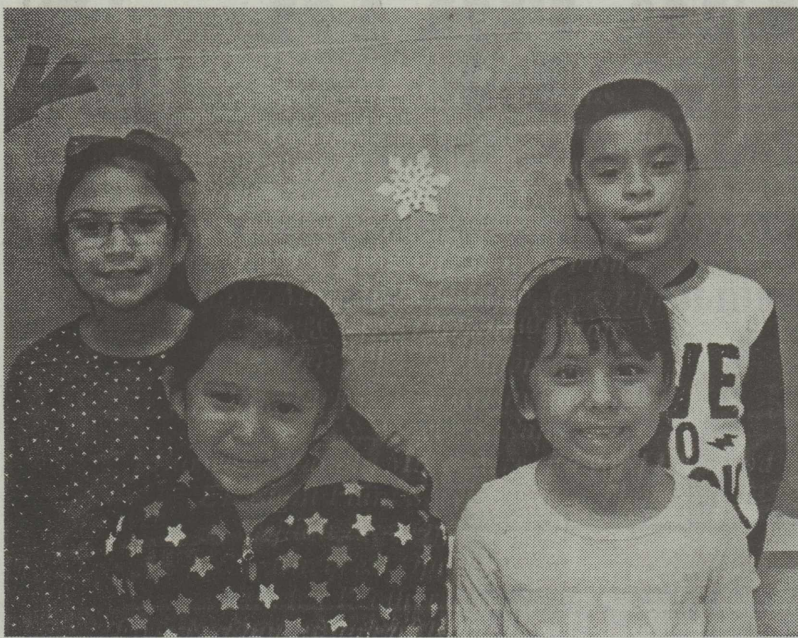

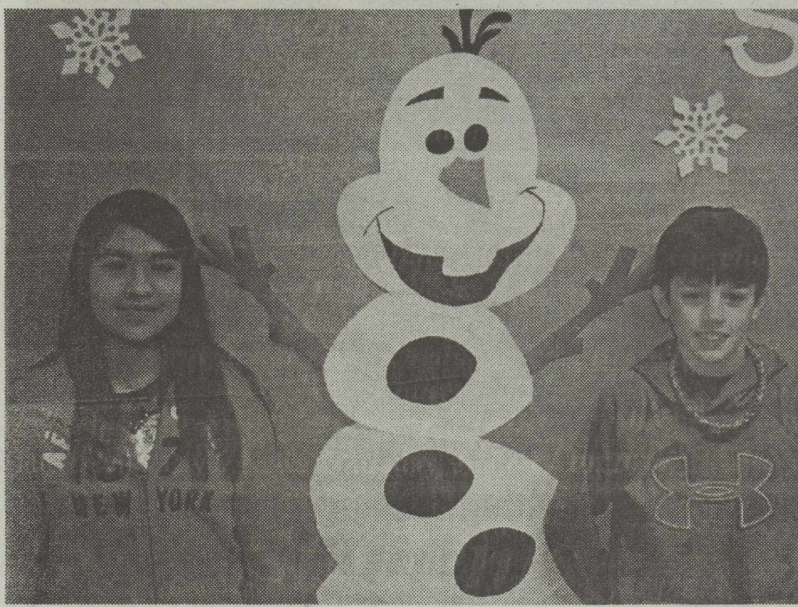

Important Deadlines All Producers Should Be Aware Of!!!

January 30th - The final date to sign up for the 2011, 2012, 2013 and 2014 Livestock Forage Program (LFP). If you have not been in the office to sign up or given us head counts or returned paperwork please get this done as soon as possible. Please call for an appointment.

Reallocating your bases and updating your yields are ongoing now. Make sure you are getting your records together if you are interested in doing either. Don't wait till the last minute.

March 31, 2015 is the final date to choose between ARC CO, ARC IC or PLC. Hopefully all of you have taken advantage of the informational meetings that have been offered and you are ready to make an informed decision. The decision that you makes locks your farm into the program you chose for the 2014 thru 2018 crop years so it is important that you make the most informed decision that you can.

Conservation Reserve Program (CRP)-There are early out provisions for those interested in withdrawing early from the Conservation Reserve Program without penalty. If this is something that you might be interested in please come by the office or call and we will be glad to discuss these provisions with you.

For those of you who have had changes for the 2014/2015 crop years please get your information into us so that we can be working on getting the changes completed.

If we have requested information or sent paperwork to sign and you have not gotten the information back to us please do so as soon as possible.
