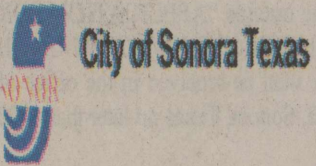

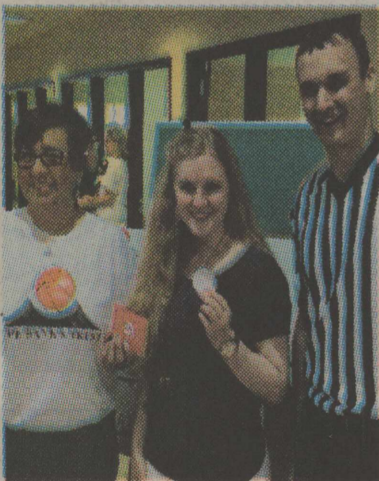


### Important Message:

#### Baseball-Softball Age Groups

T-ball & Baseball Age of player on April 30, 2015, MUST BE 4 years old by 04/30/2015

Tee Ball Baseball is for boys and girls 4-6 years old who want to learn the fundamentals of hitting and fielding. In Tee Ball, players hit a ball off a batting tee. Rules of the game may be varied to accommodate the need for teaching. The primary goals of Tee Ball are to instruct children in the fundamentals of baseball and to allow them to experience the value of teamwork. Rosters may be composed of between 10 and 12 players.

Minor League Baseball programs for boys-players with less experience. The minor league may be players ages 7-9. By local option, a player who is league age 6 for the current season and has played two years in Tee Ball may be "moved up" to minor division.

Major Division Baseball is for boys ages 10-12.

#### Softball - Age of girl on January 1, 2015

Girls Minor League Softball programs may be operated within each division for younger players with less experience. The minor league may be players ages 7-10. A player who is league age 7 for the current season and has played two years in Tee Ball may be "moved up" to Girls Minor League Softball.

The Girls Major League Softball Division is a program for girls ages 11-14.

## Spring Is 4-H Judging Team Season!

With the stock show season behind us, it is time to begin the projects that the spring season brings. One of those is the opportunity to compete on 4-H judging teams. These will be wool, mohair, range evaluation, and plant id. teams. Participants will get an understanding in the areas of livestock, rangeland and wild-life needs, as well as resource management skills. Hands-on activities provide visual examples and opportunities to learn subject matter, but also decision-making skills.

For those with interest in sheep or goats, there are wool and mohair judging contests. Wool and mohair judging are two separate contests. Participants learn to evaluate fleeces with regard to grade, texture,

length and yield. Teams compete at various contests throughout the spring.

Range science itself has two contests: Range Evaluation and Pasture Grass Identification. They offer an opportunity to learn rangeland ecology and practical application and decision making that are essential to range management. The contestant must learn to identify plants as well as longevity (annual or perennial), season of growth, origin, and economic value for wildlife and grazing. Youth will also learn which plants are toxic.

For kids who enjoy the outdoors, this is one to consider. Participants compete in 4-H teams of 3 to 4 members, according to age divisions. Contests are held throughout

the spring in our area: Ozona, Eldorado, Kerrville, Boerne, and Del Rio. There is also a district contest. The top 3 senior (high school age) teams advance to Texas 4-H Round-Up (state competition) held at Texas A&M each June. While there, participants will get to take part in contests, assemblies, dances, as well as make friends from across the state. Senior 4-H contests consist of ages 14 and up.

These events also offer fun learning experiences aimed at ranching practices common in our range production area. If you'd like to have your kids explore these activities, please call the Sutton County Extension Office at 387-3101.
