## Sonora 6Th Graders Get Hands On Agriculture Experience



On April 28th, the Edwards Plateau Soil and Water Conservation District (SWCD) and the Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) hosted the Sonora Independent School District sixth graders and their teachers to learn about agriculture first-hand. The Sawyer Ranch has hosted this event every year since its inception 34 years ago.
More than 60 students and teachers attended the annual event to expose the children to natural resources and agriculture in an outdoor setting. Speakers included representatives from NRCS, Texas AgriLife Research, Sutton County Underground NRCS, Texas AgriLife Research, Sutton County
Water District, and Texas AgriLife Extension.

The students were able to get their hands dirty while learning about soil texture and the importance of soil and soil conservation with Amanda Bragg, NRCS Soil Scientist. Cliff Kinnibrugh, Agronomist, used a rainfall simulator to demonstrate the effectiveness of conservation-minded management on water infiltration and runoff on different land uses such as farmland and rangeland. The children also learned about the relationships between runoff and loss of precious topsoil and between soil infiltration and aquifer recharge.
Nick Garza, Research Associate with Texas AgriLife Research at the Sonora Experiment Station, taught the students about the different flora of the area and how to preserve the plants using a plant press. The students were able to walk
