## State's first hospice

 given ok by board| AUSTIN. Texas (AP) - The state's first hospice to provide medical and emotional support for dying patients and follow-up care for the bereaved has been approved by the Texas Health Facilities Commission <br> Patients would be seen in their homes by a team including a cancer specialist. nurses. ministers and a medical social worker <br> The commission voted 2.1 to override a recommendation of hearing examiner John Neel and grant a certificate of need to Southeast Texas Hospice. Inc., of Orange. <br> The certificate limits the hospice to patients with written prognoses of three months or less to live. It will provide in-the-home care in Jefferson. Orange. Hardin. Newton and Jasper Counties. <br> Dan McNery, the commission's general counsel. said the area has "one of the highest cancer death rates in the state" -187 deaths per 100.000 population in 1976. compared with 154 statewide. <br> protested the health care agencies in the area appeal the commission's action to a district court. <br> His voice shaking. commission chairman Melvin Rowland announced that he had "after much study and thought" decided that the hospice should be approved. despite Neel's finding it was not needed. |
