## Personal debts big but still manageable

## 

 At the end of last year, consumers' install ment credit (used to finance autos, appliances, etc.) and mortgage debt combined hit $\$ 927$ billion, up15 percent on the year.
It will probably hit $\$ 1$ trillion this year - particularly since the growth in installment credit has many economists worried.
In March, consumer installment credit expanded by $\$ 4.07$ billion the largest gain in history. In April, it shot up $\$ 3.72$ billion, in May, $\$ 3.86$ billion - the second largest gain. At the end of May, total consumer installment credit came to $\$ 227.56$
billion, up 18 percent from a year earlier. Over that period, consumers billion, up 18 percent from a year earlier. Over that period, consumers'
personal income had gone only up 12 percent.
Extensions of installment credit as a percentage of people's disposale personal income (purchasing power, or after-tax income) are run ning at 17.8 percent - a level exceeded only once in history (in the first quarter of 1973, just prior to the onset of the last recession.).
Similarly, people's combined home mortgage and installment debt as a percentage of their net worth (assets minus liabilities) has risen to an However, some statistics are not particularly worrisome. For instance, mortgage and installment credit as a percentage of disposable
income is high, but not much higher than it was in the middle 1960s. And repayments of install ment credit as a percentage of disposable income
has been running level for many years. In the light of such statistics, economists are aşking these two ques 1. Is consumer debt so high today that before long, people will star
pulling in the horns, perhaps sending the economy into a recession? pulling in the horns, perhaps sending the economy into a recession?
2. Or, have we simply moved into a new era in which consumers will egularly carry a higher level of debt than they once did?
Surprisingly, the answer to both questions can be "Yes." It's quite likely that consumers are now a little uncomfortable with their debt load, and will retrench, but on e other hand, they won't go back
to the old levels of the 1950s - and could quickly return to today's levels after the next economic downturn.
An explanation for the consumer's historically high debt level may lie in demographics:

1. There are relatively more families in which both husband and wife
2. There are relatively more childless families;
3. The percentage of young adults in the population is growing rapidly; in fact, the $25-34$ age group (the postwar baby boom childre grown up) has grown by a whopping 4.2 percent a year since 1972, and
will continue to soar. Young people of this generation may be more willing to incur heavy debt loads that were their parents.
Said S. Lees Booth, economist for the National Consumer Finance Association in Washington, D.C., "The ratio of installment credit (ex tensions) to disposable income could go from above 17 tod ay or 14 or 15
on the short run, but it won't go back to the old levels of World War II.
"The recessions which have occurred since World War II have no been severe enough to make people fear they could never pay off their debts. "Also, many more items - such as the TV set - are high-ticket items Booth thinks an economic slowdown is on the horizon: "Watch very
