

This contest is free to play to anyone over the age of 12. Entries need to be at the Muleshoe Journal by noon on this rule.



"The reason is that tropical winds generally blow from east to west, meaning that storms that do form off the Pacific Coast get carried away from our West

Coast." "It's not uncommon for storms to turn and hit the Mexican coast, but the water farther north in the Pacific is cold, and those storms tend to weaken quickly. In fact, Hawaii doesn't get many hurricanes, either. The last big one to hit was Iniki in 1992," he says.



"It's believed to be strongest storm to hit of 1962," he says. the area since the 1880s. The storm — and it was a storm, not a hurricane - hit Oregon with 130mile per hour winds, with gusts over 160. Western Washington state also had winds over 90 miles per hour, and Seattle had gusts clocked at over 80 miles per hour," McRoberts explains.


