Here is a reminder of where and when this rule applies.
Under the Federal Trade Commission's "cooling-off" rule, you have three business days to that you have made in your home or somewhere other than the seller's usual place of business, such as a rented hotel room. The rule also provides protection for consumers who purchase items at a prdouct party given in a private home.
