Children don't need vitamin supplements

Children will get the vitamins and minerals they need if parents sidestep the supplements and focus on the four major food groups, says Dr. Kathleen J. Motil at the USDA's Children's Nutrition Research Center in Houston.

"Even the most finicky eater will get enough vitamins and minerals with a varied diet including meat, dairy products, grains, and fruits and vegetables," said Motil, assistant professor of pediatrics at Baylor College of

"Children's vitamin and mineral preparations really treat the parent rather than the child. They provide parental peace of mind," she said.

Motil urges parents to exercise caution if they insist on over-thecounter supplements.

Vitamins can be potentially toxic, she warns. More is not always better, and megadoses of vitamins can be harmful.

"Too much iron can be fatal, and there are cases where excess Vitamin A and D can damage the kidneys, heart and brain," she said.

Motil believes supplements should only be given under the care of a physician for specific medical

Measuring cholesterol: It is common practice to obtain a second total cholesterol reading in patients with high initial levels. Danish investigators found that a single measurement is a good predictor of future levels. They measured total cholesterol levels in early postmenopausal women at 3, 6, 9, 12, 15, and 18 months and at 2,7, and 12 years. Levels did not differ significantly, so investigators recommended immediately taking lipoprotein levels in people with high total cholesterol levels rather than taking another cholesterol measurement.

reasons such as chronic illness, teen pregnancy, or eating disorders.

However, she points out that a pediatrician may decide to recommend a fluoride supplement. available alone and in combination with vitamins, if there is insufficient fluoride in the drinking

Why are supplements so popular?

"We are only two generations removed from the era where vitamin deficiencies were real. Vitamins were even identified as required nutrients in the 1930s," Motil said.

"People began taking vitamins because they thought they were the cure-all for a number of ills. Like all things it takes two or three generations to see a change in

For parents who want to leave supplements behind, Motil provides the following dietary refresher:

To make sure your child gets adequate iron, serve red meat and liver, poultry and fish, legumes, fortified cereals, enriched wholegrain breads, dark-leafy vegetables and dried fruits.

Calcium is found in milk, cheese, yogurt, salmon and broccoli.

For Vitamin C, try citrus fruits, green peppers, tomatoes, broccoli and strawberries. Cantaloupe and apricots are rich in Vitamin A.

The B vitamins can be found in meats, fish, poultry, grains and cereals, sweet potatoes, bananas and

If parents are concerned about their child's eating habits, Motil encourages them to consult their pediatrician or a registered dietitian who specializes in children's nutrition.

You don't have to run a marathon. You don't have to swim across a lake. You don't

even have to set foot in a gym. But you should work out

Physical inactivity is a major risk factor for heart disease, according to the American Heart Association. And when combined with excess eating, physical inactivity may lead to obesity and high blood cholesterol, two more risk factors for heart disease.

These are only some of the reasons why the AHA suggests you engage in physical activities at moderate intensity over a continuous period. For example, aerobic exercise 30 to 60 minutes three or four times a week can condition your heart and lungs. It can also help you reduce other heart disease risk factors. These include high blood cholesterol, high blood pressure and cigarette smoking.

You can help yourself feel, look and work better. You can improve your circulation and your ability to breathe. And you can better fight anxiety, stress and depression.

Activities good for your heart include: hiking, stairclimbing, brisk walking, jogging, running, bicycling, rowing and swimming; and sports such as tennis, raquetball, soccer, basketball and touch football.

But even daily low-intensity activities can lead to longterm health benefits and lower the risk of cardiovascular disease, the AHA says. These include walking, golf, badminton, croquet, shuffleboard, lawn bowling and ping-pong. Some chores around the house such as mowing the yard are also good

ways to get in a little exercise. Even your job can help you shape up. A recent study found that middle-aged men and women who work in physically demanding jobs or perform moderate to strenuous recreational activities have less coronary artery disease than their less active peers. So if your job and lifestyle are sedentary, be extra aware of the need to be active.

Before you start, you might want to get a physical checkup. The AHA especially suggests you get a check-up if you're older than 40, already at risk for heart disease or you haven't exercised in recent years. The tests can help determine how long, hard and often your workout should be.

Whatever it is, exercise for your heart's sake.

Visitors to Texas are spending more

Auto visitor spending is up by 23 percent for autumn 1992 as compared to 1991, according to the Texas Auto Visitor Survey just released by the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) for September, October and November.

Visitors this year averaged 8.7 days per trip, compared to 6.5 days last year, resulting in \$712 per party expenditure per trip, compared to \$577 last year.



These walking milk machines provide a primary ingredient for Nanny's Best, a soap made from goat milk, lard and lye that is finding its way into stores across

Arvel Boatner said. "It's a homemade, hands-on soap that gets you clean."

And homemade it is, because everything from the milking and mixing to the marketing and mailing is done by Arvel, Sharon and their two sons in their home near Hamilton, which is between

Using a recipe that is more than 100 years old and a large cooking pot on the stove, the Boatners started making soap for their personal use about a year ago. They began commercial production in July, but instead of the large cooking pot, they now use 5-gallon buckets. The Boatners make about 1,500 bars a week.

has started selling the soap, and manager and co-owner LaVonne Bradford says that people have heard about the product and are intrigued

"It's a marvelous product," Bradford said, "and I'm very impressed with the soap because it's all natural with no fragrance or

Currently, the soap is sold only at the Sunflower Shoppe on Camp Bowie, but Bradford intends to start selling it at the 8th Avenue

Through a contact established by the Texas Department of Agriculture, the Boatners have started test marketing their product at The Whole Foods Market on North Lamar Avenue in Austin.

Rose Hullings, body care buyer for the downtown store, said, "The homemade soap fills an important market niche. It's a good soap, plus the package is simple and recyclable. The Whole Foods Market wholeheartedly supports cottage industries, and we see a real potential for the product."

"Nanny's Best is just one example of what our 'Make It Texas' initiative is all about," said Agriculture Commissioner Rick



No one would or could stop the brotherhood of Christmas.

And at midnight, both Germans and Britons fired warning shots: Return to the trenches behind your

"Compulsive gamblers think they have a way to beat the system," Pate says. "They spend time, money and energy perfecting their winning technique, but inevitably it fails."

Pate cites the following danger signals of problem gambling: ¶ Neglect of personal, family or

job responsibilities in order to gamble. Depletion of finances.

Need for increasingly larger stakes to achieve excitement. ¶ Gambling to win back losses.

¶ Frequent attempts to quit or cut down. ¶ Not being accountable for

periods of time. People experiencing these

problems can get help through treatment programs and support groups like Gamblers Anonymous, Pate said. These programs help gamblers rebuild self esteem and avoid involvement in substitute addictive behaviors like alcoholism and drug abuse.

Remember where you came from

(As coordinator of the Conservative Democratic Forum, Congressman Charles Stenholm offers advice to President-elect Bill Clinton in this article which appeared Nov. 20 in the Washington Post.)

I remember election night 1978. Although I was enormously excited to face the challenges of a newly elected member of Congress, I tasted a bittersweet joy, wishing that my parents could be present to share in that amazing moment. They both had passed away years earlier, but I easily could imagine what they would have said to me that night: "Son, just remember who you are, where you come from and the people who brought you here."

There is no better advice I could give to President-elect Bill Clinton and the Democratic party today.

The "New Democrat" persona with which Bill Clinton fired the imagination of Middle America may not be so novel. Often, what appears to be a new model is really a classic design, rediscovered.

For a dozen years, the members of the Conservative Democratic Forum have been just this kind of "New Democrat,:" representing the Main Street America views that elected Bill Clinton. We have a history of developing fresh ideas like those Bill Clinton has talked about, rejecting the tired, predictable refrains of both the right wing of the Republican party and left wing of our own. In recent years, we have proposed alternative approaches to health care, child care, congressional reform, the budget process, welfare reform, campaign finance and other issues.

While we old hands think we have been "New Democrats" for quite a while, what is different this year is to have this sort of leadership at the top of our party. After a 12-year drought, our party has remembered what America believes in, and we in the CDF were comfortable campaigning for this Democratic ticket.

We at CDF look forward to working with our new president and invite him to work with us on those issues that show we Democrats remember who we are and where we came from.

First, we belive the best medicine we can give our country's ailing economy is to put our fiscal nouse in order. A recent GAO report concluded that continued deficit spending "will damage our competitiveness and influence in

the world and hamper our ability to address pressing national needs . . . Continued deficits are likely to seriously inhibited the growth of the economy under current and . . . foreseeable economic conditions."

Deficit reduction needs to be a priority in the first 100 days and beyond. Whittling down the burden of debt on our economy would provide more money for job creation and investment. Indeed, reducing our deficit would do more to strengthen our economy than any other step the president and Congress can take.

Is that what the people who brought Clinton to office believe? In CNN election exit polls, 56 percent of the voters said that reducing the deficit should be the top priority of the next president, easily surpassing demands for new domestic programs or tax cuts.

We applaud President-elect Clinton's commitment to reduce the cost of operating the executive branch by 25 percent, and we support comparable self-discipline by Congress. The sacrifices necessary to balance the budget must begin at home---in Congress and the White House. Similarly, a modified line-item veto---which would require Congress to vote, with majority rule, on presidential proposals to eliminate specific spending items---should also be a part of our strategy to reduce the deficit. While much more is required for deficit reduction, both of these steps would do a good deal to restore the confidence of the American people in their governmental institutions.

Second, we should adopt a balanced budget amendment as an enduring constitutional guarantee that we will adhere to a deficit reduction plan. In the past, a changing cast of characters, new statues or one more summit agreement have failed to offer anything but false hopes. Congresses and presidents, wanting to write home about how fiscally responsible they are, have begun every "reform" plan by postponing the tough decisions for another couple of years, and have found a way to avoid the pain before the day of reckoning arrived. A

constitutional amendment would force Congress and the president to make the tough choices to reduce the deficit and stick by those choices.

In overwhelming numbers, the public has expressed its support for a constitutionally protected right to

a balanced budget, illustrating again that good policy is good politics. The people know that our crushing national debt is robbing their quality of life, depriving them of the liberty that economic opportunity brings and certainly is stealing their property, with \$300 billion of their tax dollars thrown down the drain this year in interest payments. Our children and grandchildren deserve a constitutional amendment to restore long-term responsibility to our

budget process. Third, CDF members want to show that our party is able to respond constructively and with long-term wisdom---not a shortterm fix---to our health care needs. An old adage observes that to every complex problem there is a simple solution---and it is usually wrong. Nowhere is that more true than in the health care debate. Simply shifting the costs elsewhere, as "pay or play" plans would have us do, or pretending that arbitrary caps will magically attack the systemic causes of health care costs, as global budges purport, is not the visionary response the public deserves. Rather, we should enact managed competition mechanisms that empower consumers to make good decisions, embrace individuals now left out of the health care umbrella, encourage high quality and utilize the positive aspects of our current system. Players in the health care field must realize that if they do not make this last attempt at free-market competition, work in bringing down health care costs, the heavy hammer of government intervention will be on their heads.

Finally, we must insist that meaningful, non-cosmetic reforms of Congress occur this year. Nothing speaks to the breach of confidence Americans feel toward Congress more than the primary and general election cycle we have just completed. The public simply will no tolerate "business as usual" from its elected officials, whether the business involves the daily operations of Congress or an incumbent's unfair financial advantage in campaigns. Insetting out his own transition team ethics rules, President-elect Clinton has provided us a noteworthy model. It's up to Congress to follow with our own serious campaign finance and congressional reforms.

The Democratic party has been handed a golden opportunity. We are fully responsible for running the government and, rightfully, we will get the credit or blame for the results. At this high mark, we have political capital to invest in each of the four areas just mentioned. Unlike the outgoing administration--- which, during record high levels of approval, had enormous political capital and allowed it to dissipate through inaction---it is up to us to show that we can govern, that the gridlock is over and that progress will be made. The decisions will not be easy, but if we are not able to make them during this next year, when will be ever be able to do so? We in the CDF do look forward to working with our new president and our House leadership on a Democratic agenda. But above all else, when it comes to deficit reduction and economic responsibility, health care and congressional credibility, we are going to remember who we are and where we came from.

Employment tax increase to be slight

"Texas employers can breathe a sigh of relief because their tax rates are not going to escalate significantly," TEC Commissioner Mary Scott Nabers said as the Texas Employment Commission released tax rates for 1993.

"This has been a trying year. The state's economic woes have caused thousands of businesses to downsize and the result has been massive layoffs throughout Texas. Employment prospects have been so bleak that unemployment benefits have been extended on an emergency basis numerous times. These factors have greatly concerned Texas employers about their 1993 TEC tax rates," Nabers said.

The maximum rate that could apply to any Texas employer in 1993 will be 6.35 percent, according to Nabers. That is up only slightly from last year's maximum rate of 6.30 percent. The lowest rate any business will experience in 1993 will be .35 percent, up from .30 percent in 1992. The new rates become effective Jan. 1, 1993.

Employers should begin receiving their individual tax rate notices the second week of February. Payment will be due for the first quarter of 1993 in April.

Employers in Texas pay taxes for every employee's first \$9,000 in wages. Depending on an employer's tax rate, the amount could vary from a low of \$31.50 per person to a high of \$571.50 per person.

Editor: I don't mind taking criticism for something I've done, but I don't like it at all when I am wrongly blame because lottery money doesn't go to the public schools.

My record on the lottery is clear and well documented. Long before I became Lieutenant Governor, I said that the lottery was a sleazy way of raising government money. I said it was an unstable source of revenue and I would oppose making our schools dependent in any way on such a flaky source of income.

I repeated my statements often while I was running for Lieutenant Governor and I repeated them again when the Legislature passed the bill letting the people vote on the lottery.

Even before then, as State Comptroller, I pointed out that the State of California had made a very serious mistake in dedicating lottery money to schools---because after the newness wore off, the income fell and the schools had to be cut.

And aside from my repeated statements, nobody---absolutely nobody---connected with the lottery bill ever said it would go to the schools. The author of the bill certainly never said it would. I have never seen a newspaper article that said it would. Those who campaigned for it never said it would.

Those who write letters to the editor and call radio talk shows ought to get their facts straight, particularly about something as well documented as my historic opposition to tying the education of children to a gambling game.

As one of the state's major daily newspapers said editorially last week, "Texans were repeatedly warned before they voted on the lottery . . . it's too bad more of you weren't listening."



Signs for icy bridges are changed

Bridges and overpasses freeze quickly in icy weather. The Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) reminds the public of this every year with its "Watch for Ice on Bridge" or "Ice on Bridge" signs.

This year, TxDOT has a slightly different schedule for displaying the signs. In the past, department employees displayed the signs when icy weather was imminent and removed them from view when bad weather ended.

Not any more.

To get the most personnel working on spreading materials on bridges to increase safety, the department has a new schedule for displaying the warning signs. The department used the State Climatologist's map to create a time frame for displaying the signs. The map provides the first and last days of freezing weather for every county in Texas.

TxDOT will display the signs seven to 14 days before the first expected freeze in each county, and remove them seven to 14 days after the last freeze

Leaving the signs on display throughout the icy winter weather allows TxDOT employees to concentrate on roadway safety.

The first signs went up in the Panhandle counties in October where they will remain on display through April. The last signs went up in South Texas counties in December.

According to the American Cancer Society, one out of ten women in the United States will develop breast cancer sometime in her lifetime. It is currently estimated that over 37,000 women die each year as the result of breast cancer.

The service is equipped with eight vans. Two vans are equipped to accommodate the needs of the handicapped and other features to make travel for all passengers more comfortable. The other vans are standard vans with many comfort options.

DMC services has been available for nine years and many residents of this area have derived a great benefit from it. It is the only means by which many area residents are able to keep doctor's appointments, etc. Passengers are picked up at their homes, taken where they need to go and returned back to their homes.

Drivers are Vance Morgan, Kathy Montez, Vicki Gilley, Marshall Conner, Gloria Cork, Melvin Scott and Rick Montez. All are trained in CPR, first aid, passenger assistance techniques and defensive driving

DMC trips include those to Abilene medical facilities such as clinics, hospitals, rehabilitation centers and other specialized treatment centers. Local service area trips are scheduled to fill a variety of transportation needs.

DMC is a demand-responsive, space-available public transportation system. Requests are taken Monday through Friday, from 8 a.m. to noon on a first-come, first-service basis. A 24-hour advance notice is required and trips are scheduled on a weekly basis, so interested riders are encouraged to reserve their seats as early as possible. Fares will be charged, but subsidized fares are available to those who qualify.







These loans are intended to assist businesses in offsetting working capital losses which they suffered as a result of the adverse weather reducing the crop income of the area farmers and ranchers.





SS card required for licenses

Since Nov. 1, Texans applying for a driver's license and those renewing their licenses or seeking a duplicate need to show their Social Security card.

Social Security numbers already are required for commercial driver's licenses, which the DPS began issuing in September 1990.

"We think this new policy will make it harder for an individual to fraudulently obtain a driver's license," explained DPS driver's license inspector John Hall. "This should pay off by reducing crimes where a fake identification is important, like hot check cases. It also should make it much more difficult for a minor to obtain a license with an incorrect year of

birth."
Only Social Security cards issued by the federal Social Security Administration will be accepted., Hall said.

"I realize almost everyone knows his Social Security number by heart, but we need to see the actual card issued by the U.S. government, not a commercially produced metal or 'flea market' card," the inspector said. "If you do not have the government-issued card, income tax documents, W-2 forms, payroll or other employer records may be presented.
