



Comedy named All-American in intercollegiate archery

Jennifer Comedy of Haskell was a member of the archery team at Texas A&M University that swept the U.S. Intercollegiate Outdoor National Championships at Michigan State University, May 13-18.

Comedy, a freshman agricultural development major, won the outdoor national title in the compound division and was also named a member of the All-American team and "Newcomer of the Year." The win entitles her to a week long stay at the Olympic Training Center this winter.

She received recognition on the All-American team for her combined placings in the indoor national tournament earlier in the spring in Las Vegas where she placed second. That score, combined with the first place outdoor score, placed her in first place on the All-American Team. She had also won the first place state indoor title earlier in the year.

In team competition, Texas A&M won the men's, women's and co-rec recurve bow division as well as the men's, women's and co-rec compound divisions. There were a total of 17 universities in the competition.

"I'm extremely pleased with how well our team has done," said Texas A&M coach Frank Thomas. "We won everything under the sun. Everybody has put a lot of time and effort into preparing for this tournament. It's great to see all of their hard work pay off." A&M also had twelve archers named to the All-American team.
