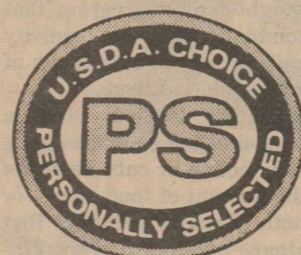

Tips For Gardeners From the Ozona Garden Club by Mrs. Bailey Post

With so many new flowers in the world, things can't be all bad as so many say or think. So as a gardener, you must take advantage of fair warm days, which means being ready to work when they come.

Southwest soils need all the help they can get, for the long growing season depletes the humus and the soil becomes lifeless unless more humus is added.

January is also an excellent time to prune fruit trees and summer flowering shrubs. Follow fruit pruning with a dormant spray on peaches, plums, apricots, roses and grapes.

This and next week I will give you a list of some of the new flowers, shrubs, roses and vegetables. You may want to add a few of these All-American selections and other new varieties to your favorite plantings to see how they do for you here in Ozona.

Also, no matter how great some new item seems, its performance is still dependent on good gardening practices for our soils and climate.

All-America Roses for 1978 are Floribunda, 'Charisma' (scarlet and gold blend), Hybrid Tea, Color Magic (combination of rose-red tones and ivory). Another will get attention as Jackson and Perkins, 'Rose of the Year' named 'Pristine' classed as a white and pink picotee, it has ivory buds, pink tinged.

Start the New Year with a weight-control program that combines physical activity with eating regular meals of lower-calorie foods.

Weight is lost when a person becomes more physically active or cuts down on the amount of food eaten, or both. Experts estimate that almost one-fourth of the United States population is overweight to the degree that it actually shortens their lives.

People who eat small, frequent meals are more apt to lose weight than those who eat only one meal a day. Eating only one big meal a day makes dieters tired, irritable and unable to stay with the diet.

LOW CALORIE RECIPES

Banana Milk Shake: 1 medium banana, 1 cup instant milk, 1/2 cup water, 1 teaspoon vanilla, 10 ice cubes. Combine all ingredients in blender. Blend on low speed, adding 1 ice cube at a time.

Baked Chicken With Parsley

6 chicken breasts, salt and pepper to taste, 3 teaspoons parsley, 1 tbs. lemon juice, 1/4 teaspoon paprika, 6 small pats diet margarine.

Place chicken breasts in pan lined with aluminum foil. Season chicken with salt and pepper. Combine parsley, lemon juice and paprika; sprinkle on chicken breasts. Place pat of margarine on each breast. Bake, uncovered, in 375 degree oven for 30 to 40 minutes, depending on size and thickness of breasts.

New Hiway Designation For County

District Engineer D.R. Watson of San Angelo has announced that District Seven of the State Department of Highways and Public Transportation is gaining a newly designated Federal highway. DHT work crews will be out on the 17th and 18th of January erecting new U.S. 190 signs along old State Highway 29 through Menard, Schleicher and Crockett Counties and along F.M. 42 in Menard and McCulloch Counties.

U.S. 190 enters Texas at the Louisiana border and proceeds westward through Huntsville, Bryan, Temple and Killeen to its present terminus at Brady.

Under the new designation its route will extend from Brady along F.M. 42, join State 29 at Menard, and terminate at its juncture with Interstate 10 west of Iraan.

District Engineer Watson comments, "I am pleased that we have gained another Federal highway for District Seven, and feel that it will be of increasing benefit to the citizens of our West Texas area."
