## Tips For Gardeners

From the Ozona Garden Club by Mrs. Bailey Post

It's time to plan your fall garden, so brighten it with colorful and long lasting Chrysanthemums. If you haven't already set out transplants, now is the time to do so. Planting mums in June produces busy, compact plants that do not need much staking. Grow mums in sunny site in well-drained, fertile soil. Prepare the bed by applying a complete fertilizer at the rate of 2 to 3 pounds per 100 square feet. Work the fertilizer into the top 6 inches of soil, and water thoroughly. Six weeks after planting, apply a side-dressing of ammonium sulfate fertilizer at the rate of 1/2 pound per 50 feet of row. Apply another side-dressing in mid-August, and be sure to water well after each application.

To produce compact plants with large numbers of flowers, pinch off the tips of new shoots after they reach 3 inches in length. Shoots may need to be repinned as they continue to produce new growth; however, no pinching should be done after July. Apply an organic mulch around the plants to help conserve moisture and reduce weed growth. Good mulching materials include wood chips, peat moss and bark.

Fertilize flowering annuals every six to eight weeks to ensure continued bloom. Use 5-10-10 or 6-12-12 at the rate of 2 pounds per 100 square feet of bed area. Avoid applying dry fertilizer closer than 6 inches to plants; otherwise, burning may result.

Plant bearded iris now to produce stronger plants and more attractive flowers next spring. They should be grown in a sunny site in well-drained, slightly alkaline soil. Plant the rhizomes just below the soil surface.

Set out Joseph's coat for a colorful landscape addition this fall. Growing best in moist, well fertilized soil.

### Final in a series

Use "search 'n destroy" tactics to avoid mildew damage.

During humid weather and flooding conditions, mildew growth can occur and damage clothing or furnishings, so keep an eye on all your belongings--it's easy to spot the villain mildew: its musty odor and its gray-to-black spottings give it away!

If there is mildew on clothing or household fabrics which you can wash, follow these steps:

Remove spots as soon as you discover them before the mold can weaken the materials.

Start by brushing off the mold outdoors so the mildew spores do not scatter in the house.

On washable fabrics, pre-treat first-by rubbing detergent into the dampened stain.

Then launder the items in hot water, detergent or soap and chlorine bleach if the fabric is bleachable.

If the stain remains, sponge it with hydrogen peroxide. Rinse and launder again.

If the fabric is not bleach-safe, soak the items in an oxygen bleach, according to directions. Then wash.

Take non-washables to the dry cleaner, and tell them the stain is mildew.

For upholstered pieces, mattresses, rugs or carpets, treatment is different than above, since mildew penetrates these items deeply.

When possible, start by taking the mildewed item outside and brush the mold away with a broom.

Next, use the upholstery attachment of a vacuum cleaner to take away even more mold. Run it over the surface to draw out more of the mildew.

Remember, mold spores are going into the vacuum, so throw the bag away outside to avoid scattering mold spores inside the house.

If the upholstered item is still damp, dry it with an

electric heater or fan. Sun and air it thoroughly to stop mold growth.

If mildew remains on upholstered furniture, wipe it with a cloth wrung out of a dilute solution of alcohol and water--one cup denatured or rubbing alcohol to one cup of water.

Dry the article thoroughly in the sun, if possible.

For rugs and carpets, if mildew remains, sponge them with a rug shampoo, or use an electric shampoo machine. If possible, let them dry in the sun.

Wipe mildew from leather with a cloth wrung out of a dilute alcohol solution.

Dry it in a current of air-use a fan for better circulation.

If mildew remains, wash with saddle soap. Wipe with a damp cloth and dry in an airy place.

Remember, the best tactic against mildew is prevention--be ready for humidity and flooding. Water-proof where possible, ventilate and keep your home clean.

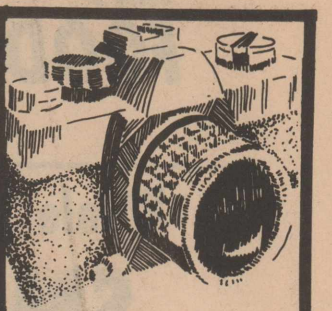
Games will begin on June 6 at the Ozona Senior League Field with Clayton's Village Drug Pirates meeting Mayfield Construction Bucca-

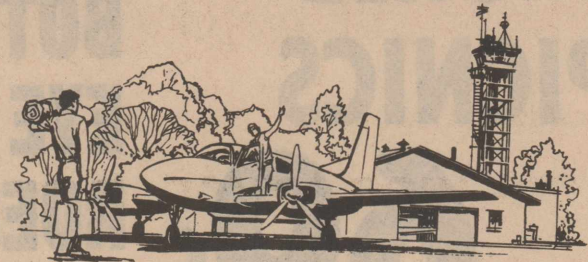

The couple will be at home in Lubbock after a trip to Santa Fe N.M.

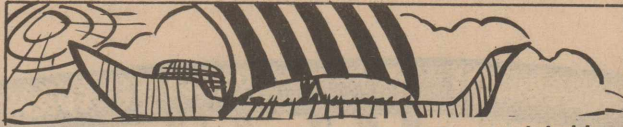

### Wildcats slated for county

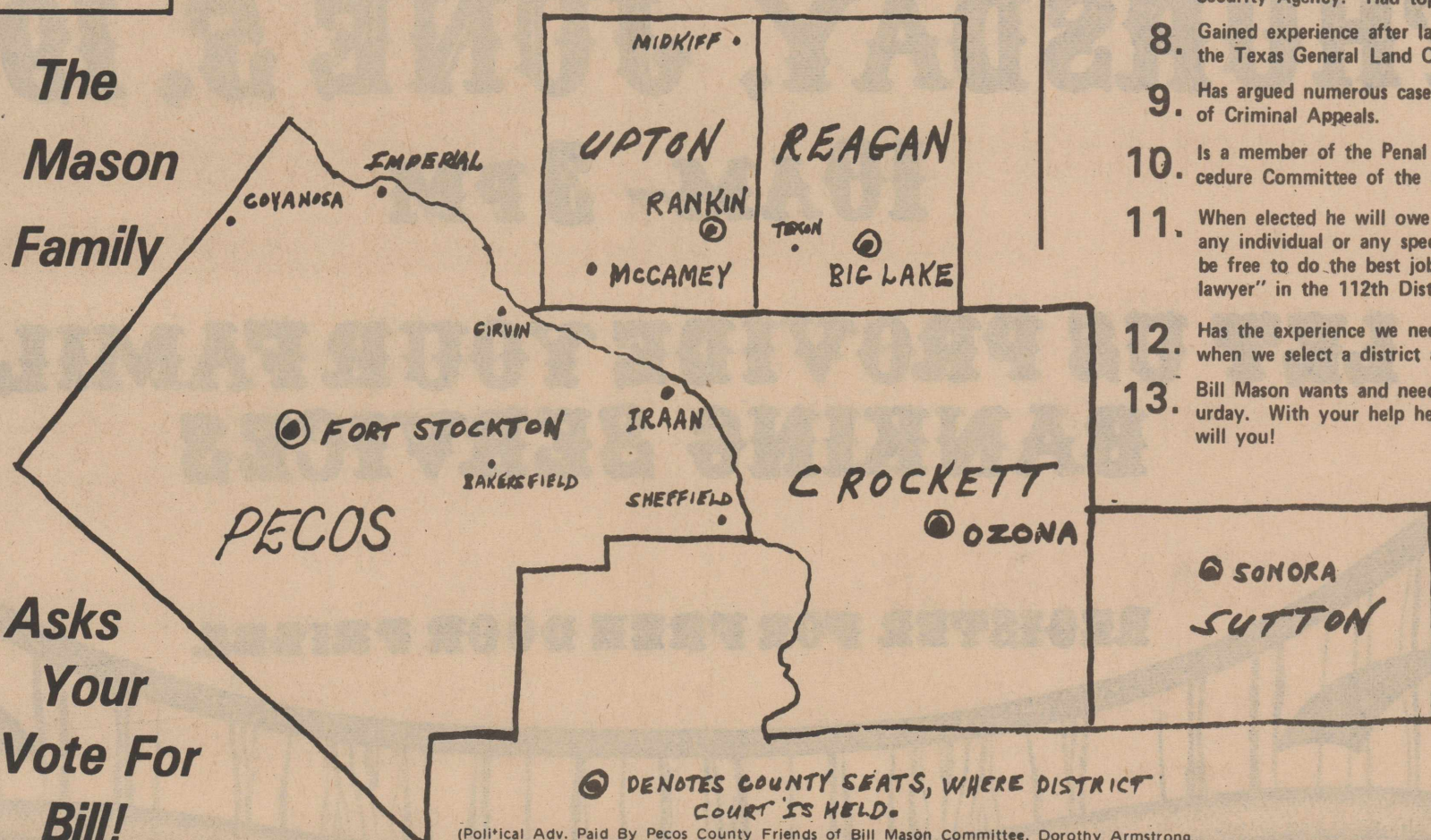

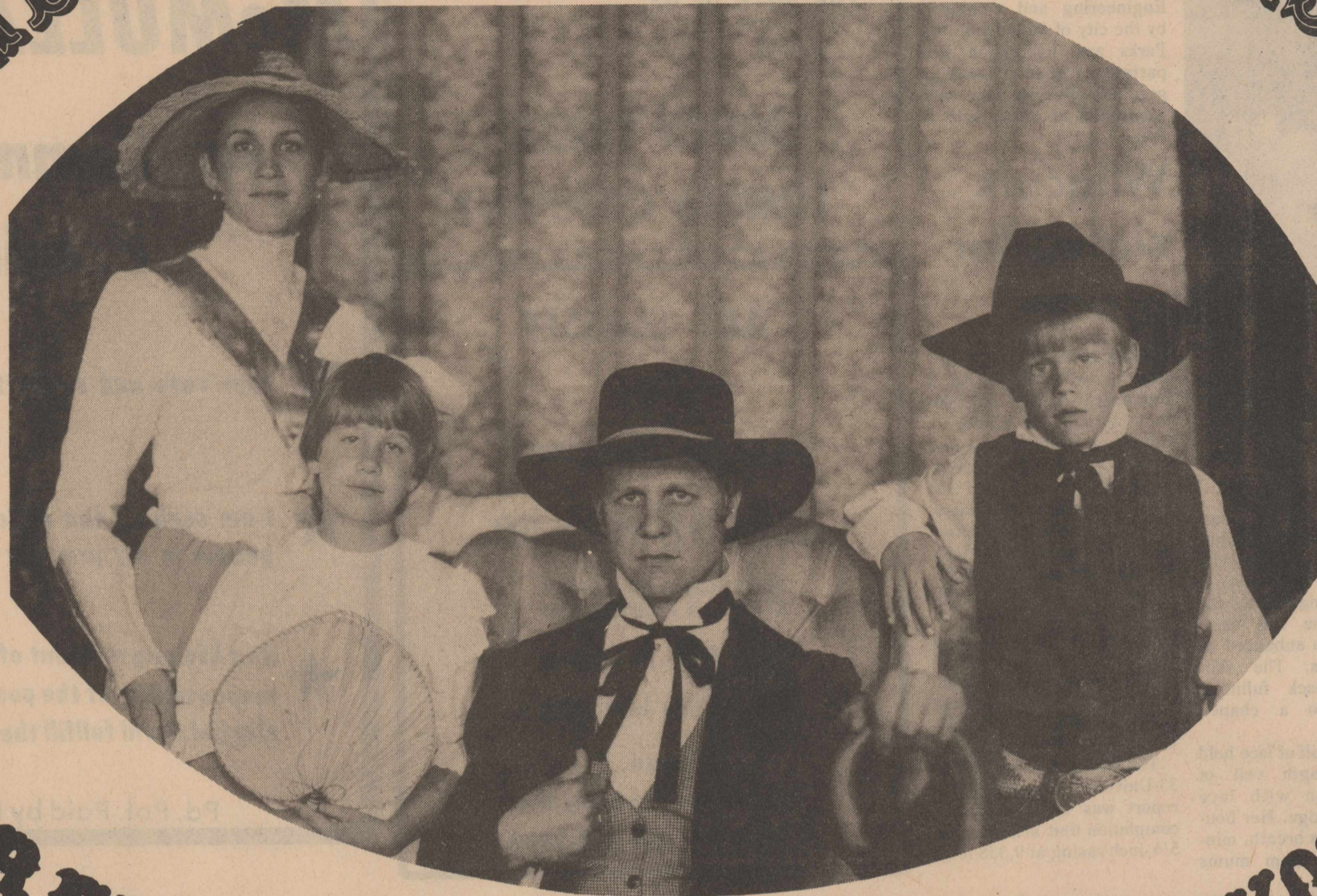

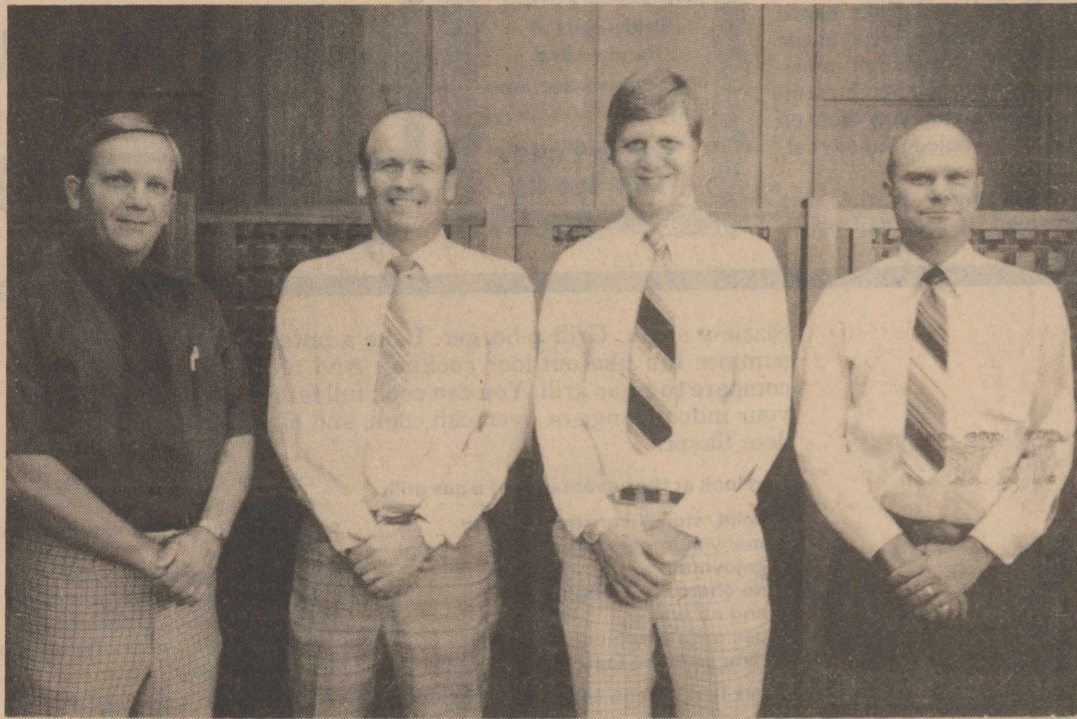

## Ex-GI's denied treatment while Cubans occupy beds

A White House directive which authorizes Cuban refugees to occupy beds at the Veterans Administration (VA) medical center in Tampa, Fla., while sick and disabled ex-GI's are being denied treatment, has drawn outraged criticism from the 670,000-member Disabled American Veterans (DAV).

The Carter Administration has ordered the Tampa VA medical center to reserve 40 hospital beds for ailing Cuban refugees. The VA medical center in Gainesville, Fla., has been told to reserve 50 medical and surgical beds for this purpose. On Monday, while 13 Cuban refugees were occupying beds on the Tampa VA facility's psychiatric wards, two American veterans applying for psychiatric care were denied admission due to lack of beds in the hospital's psychiatric care section.

The Tampa VA hospital has been hit particularly hard by Carter Administration budget policies in recent years. Underfunding and understaffing at the hospital were causing denial of treatment to many eligible Tampa veterans long before the massive influx of Cuban refugees into Florida began.

While this situation has its parallels at VA health care facilities across the United States, the problem in Tampa became so severe a year ago that the DAV and a number of VA physicians, themselves, called public attention to it.

A headline in the Tampa Tribune-Times on June 24, 1979, stated that "Staff Doctors Call Some VA Policies

Medical Malpractice." A few of the physicians went so far as to charge that some veterans had died because of these policies, which resulted directly from inadequate budgeting.

"I'm astonished by the gross insensitivity of giving priority medical care in VA facilities to undocumented aliens at a time when men and women who fought in our nation's wars are being turned away at the door," said DAV National Commander Paul L. Thompson.

He noted that the situation could only become worse as more Cubans enter VA hospitals, filling the beds allotted them. The DAV has learned that Carter Administration officials have contracted other VA medical centers in Florida, searching for hospital beds in which to place Cuban refugees requiring medical attention.

"This is a clear indication of how the Carter Administration really feels about the nation's commitment to its war veterans-how its policies have become the complete opposite of what they should be," said Thompson.

"To show humanitarian concern for the refugees is one thing, but how much humanitarian concern has the Carter Administration shown for sick and disabled veterans needing health ser-

vices from the VA during the last 3 1/2 years? None?"

The private health care sector currently has 130,000 empty hospital beds, and DAV leaders are asking why the Carter Administration is not using these beds-rather than the already overburdened VA system-to treat the Cubans.

## Kite flying has hazards

Kite fliers in real life face several other problems besides trees. The effects of these hazards would not be funny even in a comic strip, the Texas Medical Association (TMA) says.

Electricity is the most serious problem. Benjamin Franklin used electricity to light up his life with his kite-flying experiment. But with a little bad luck the wise inventor would have been known today only as the first person to cook his own goose with electricity.
