Poultry is a family favorite and can be enjoyed in many ways. Here is one that is new and different.

Lemony Baked Chicken
2 tsp. freshly grated lemon peel
2 tbsp. fresh lemon juice
1/4 c. margarine, melted
1 c. cracker crumbs
1/2 tsp. onion salt
1/4 tsp. paprika
2-2 1/2 lb. pan ready chicken parts

Combine lemon peel, juice and butter. Combine crumbs, salt and paprika. Dip chicken pieces in butter mixture; then coat with crumb mixture. Arrange in baking pan. Loosely cover with foil. Bake 400°F, for 40 minutes. Remove foil, turn chicken pieces and continue to bake uncovered approximately 20 minutes or until tender and lightly browned.

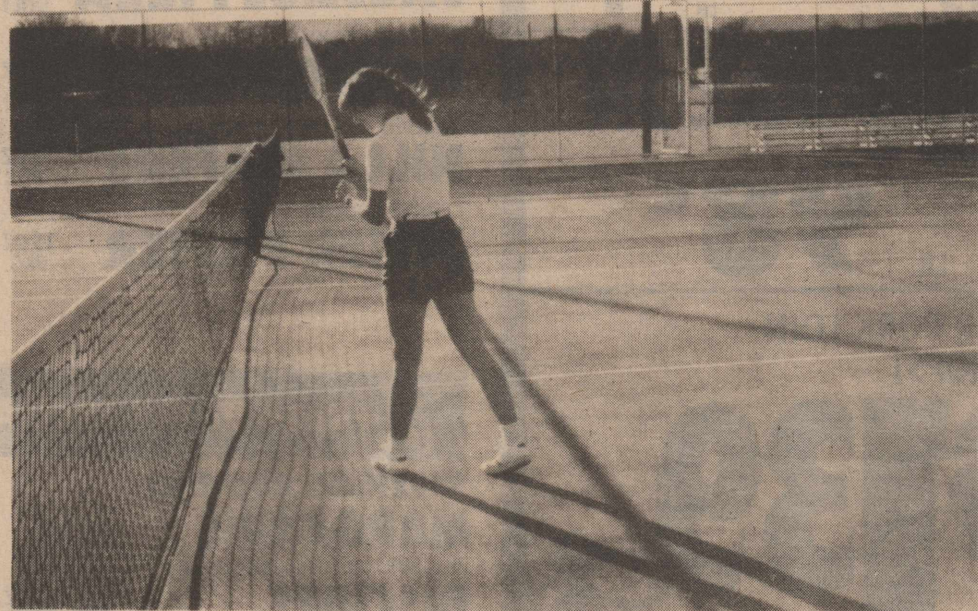

Wednesday morning reading and Thursday morning beauty shop was conducted by our usual faithful volunteers as was our Thursday Bible study.

Our crew on the evening shift gets an extra special thanks for their efforts in getting all our residents out and the living room arranged for two band performances last week. The Ybarra Band on Sunday has already been mentioned. Then on Wednesday at 6:30 the Jamie Knox Band entertained.

Our week that included all these musical groups ended with a sing-along with Edith Owens from Barnhart on the piano. She is a friend of Leona Harris. Leona invited several other friends to join us. Helping with the harmony were: Alma James, Billie Jean Baggett, and Dorothy Montgomery.

Several projects planned for Co.

Cities Service Co., Midland, will drill the No. 1 University 35-5, an 11,500-foot wildcat in Crockett County, 1 7/8 miles north-northwest of the depleted Quantos (Ellenburger) field, 3 1/4 miles southwest of the current two-well M.A.G. (Pennsylvanian oil) field and 10 miles north of Iraan.

Location is 800 feet from the south and 2,400 feet from the west lines of 35-5-University Lands.

The M.A.G. field produces from 9,406 feet.

The Quantos opener, H.L. Brown Jr. No. 1 Ruth Schlinke, drilled to 11,420 feet, was finished Sept. 3, 1968 for 204 barrels of 44.5 gravity oil, no water, with gas-oil ratio of 451-1, through a 24-64-inch choke and perforations at 11,368-386 feet. It became depleted May 1, 1969.

J. Cleo Thompson, Dallas, will drill the No. 1 University 30-2, a 9,500-foot wildcat, 3/4-mile south-southeast and the same distance northeast of the University 29 (Strawn detrital gas) field and 20 miles west of Ozona.

Location is 1,115 feet from the north and 832 feet from the west lines of 2-30-University lands. Ground elevation is 2,494 feet.

J. Cleo Thompson will drill the No. 4 University 34 as a 1 1/8-mile south-southwest southpost to the four-well Queen gas area of the University 31 (Strawn detrital and Queen gas) field, 15 miles west of Ozona.

Location is 1,320 feet from the south and 1,980 feet from the west lines of 34-31-University Lands. Contract depth is 1,500 feet.

Strawn detrital gas production was extended 5/8-mile west in the University 31 field with completion of J. Cleo Thompson No. 2 University 31-21W, 12 miles west of Ozona, for a calculated, absolute open flow of 1,620,000 cubic feet of gas daily, with gas-liquid ratio of 1,300,000-1. Gravity of the condensate was 55.4 degrees.

Production was through perforations at 8,600-745

feet, which had been acidized with 5,000 gallons. Location is 1,320 feet from the north and west lines of 21-31-University Lands.

Canyon gas production was extended 7/8-mile northeast in a southwest section of the Ozona multipay field, with completion of J. Cleo Thompson No. 1 University 30-9, 19 miles west of Ozona, for a calculated, absolute open flow of 1,900,000 cubic feet of gas daily, with gas-liquid ratio of 66,455-1. Gravity of the condensate was 61.4 degrees.

Production was through perforations at 6,569-7,334 feet, which had been fractured with 22,400 gallons and 26,000 pounds of sand.

Location is 1,980 feet from the north and east lines of 9-30-University Lands.

Pandale study club meeting

Measurements of by-gone days and today were described by Myrtle G. Everett for the Pandale Study Club at the meeting in the Pandale Community Center with Mrs. Larry Arledge presiding.
