## GLOOMY GOOD NEWS

Judging by what you read in the newspapers and see
on the network only is it responsible for nearanomecord high unemployment and the continuing economic slump, the story goes, but it has heaped misery on the less fortunate through savage
cuts in social services designed primarily to widen the gulf separating rich and poor.
As fallacious as the above statements are, their constant repetition has begun to affect even many of the President's long-time supporters. Though the President's program went into effect less than a year ago - and the first really
meaningful personal tax cuts came our way just two months ago - Reaganomics has become the whipping boy for all of our economic ills.
But buried beneath this litany of gloom and doom is an untold story of progress in the war against inflation, federal budget. When the Reagan administration took office,
Americans were groaning under a 12.4 -percent inflation rate. Interest rates were running above 20 percent, and government spending was growing by 17 percent per year.
Bracket creep, moreover, stole an ever-increasing percentage of personal income in federal tax revenues. So as your wages were pushed up by inflation, the government took a bigger cut - and your buying power went down.
What has happened after a year and a half of
"Reaganomics"? Inflation has been more than halved, and in March of this year - for the first time in seventeen went down! Interest rates have fallen dramatically, though
not enough yet to reinvigorate the housing market. Still, ne prime interest rate is down to below 14 percent, a sharp drop from the 20 -percent high that Ronald Reagan least been slowed.
The so-called dog-food budget that President Reagan
submitted to Congress earlier this year was, of course, a liberal fiction. This "austere" budget provided for 95 million meals a day for needy Americans, medical care
for 47 million people, subsidized housing for 10 -million Americans, and 7 -million loans and grants for deserving and needy college studenis.
But the outrage with which this budget was met in
Congress led people to believe that the President intended Congress led people to believe that the President intended
to starve the poor and rob the elderly. barrage of distortions aired nightly on the network news, is there any wonder that the President has had a difficult time restoring public confidence in the economy?
The President has been doing a herculean job working well. Victory, we all know, is the tonic that makes life worth living to the politician. Sooner or later all politicians
find out that victory exacts a high price: compromise. Thus, find out that victory exacts a high price: compromise. Thus,
we have the specter of Ronald Reagan, the great tax-cutter, pushing a tax increase of historic proportions and Ronald Chinese, at the expense of our long-time allies on Taiwan. At a time when the economy is showing signs of real

Tips For Gardeners
From The Ozona Garde
Club by Mrs. Bailey Post

| With September well on its way into sudden changes for the next two months, we may still expect sweltering days, longer and cooler nights. <br> If any of your spring flowering shrubs need prun- ing this should be done now for the new growth to have time to mature before freezing weather. <br> Some have asked about their spider plant that is healthy looking and attractive, but the end of each leaf looks like it is dying. Fluoride in the water often causes tipburn on this plant. One way to prevent this condition is to add one teaspoon of dolomitic limestone per 6 inch pot, repeating the appliAnother way is to use only fluoride-free water for watering the plant using either rainwater or tapwater that has been allowed to stand for 12 to 24 hours. <br> Many are selecting evergreen shrubs for containers used as accents on a terrace, deck or an entry. Permanence and portability are among their assets. <br> Choose slow-growing plants that can remain in the same container for a number of years. Also look for a plant that is tolerant of wind and drought. Also one that suits the amount of sun or shade provided by location it will occupy. <br> Choose a container made of treated wood, stone, or concrete if they are to be subjected to wind and hard freezes. Planting your chosen evergreens in containers should be in a porous, welldrained soil mix composed of equal parts sphagnum peat den soil. The most important part of caring for these container grown plants is to Always water deeply, until | the water starts draining out the bottom of the container. Monthly applications of fertilizer will be needed in spring and early summer. Withhold fertilizer in late summer or fall. Among evergreens recommended for container growing in our area are; fraser photimia, leatherieaf mahonia, indian hawthorn, heavenly bamboo (nandina domestica), rosemary (rosmarihus officinals), and mound-lily yucca (gloriosa), and wheelers' dwarf japanese pittosphorum, swiss mountain pine (pinus mogo compacta) and many others. <br> PUBLCATION GUIDELINES <br> FOR WEDDINGS <br> Engagement announcements and pictures should be in this office not later than six weeks prior to the wedting.
