| Effects of House Bill \#72 recently passed by the Texas Legislature in a Special Summer Session are still not totally known; however, the local. toudgeting process has begun and will be based on estimated financial figures furnished by the Texas. Education Agency. <br> The Crockett County Cons. CSD is on a list of eighty-four school districts in the state which will be classified as Budget Balanced Disaricts for the 1984-1985 school year. The effect of being classified as Budget Balanced results in the loss of state financial support. <br> Provisions of the recently enacted law will allow for a three-year, transition in the total loss of funds which will allow for some relief; menting the education reform bill must be borne by the district. <br> The district's loss will be incurred through a reduction in State Available per Capita earnings from $\$ 473,870.00$ to an estimate $\mathbf{\$ 2 1 8 , 2 7 0 . 0 0}$. ## FAST FOOD FRACAS

Those of us who watched he recent De ocratic Convention coulan help but be impressed by the "fruits and nuts" roaming around outside
the convention hall: the transvestite nun, Sister Boom Boom; punk rocker Jello Biafra; and someone calling himself Jesus Christ Satan, campaigning Well, San Francisco city beset with "problems." In the hot-bed of Far East canitalism, Taipe howling of a different variety has commenced over the opening of two McDonald's hamburger franchises
That's right, McDonald's - which gave Sister Boom Boom and other
Americans the fast-food habit — has met with some disapproval in Taiwan's capital city, namely because of things we Americans have long neglected to even think about (especially in an election year): Is fast food replacing traditional food? How does fast food affect society? What is the nutritional value of fast food? And, in Taipei' case, how will McDonald's affect he economy?
Of the two
Of the two McDonald's outlets in Taipei, one has already become the
op selling of some 7,500 McDonald's franchises worldwide. No wonder On a recent trip to Taipei, I observed lines of eager Big-Mac attackers flowing around the block from McDonald's. At \$2 a burger, in a city where the dollar is very strong, that's quite a sight.
In a recent issue of Asiaweek, the Far East's answer to Time and Newsweek, two of aiper's academic experts debated the meris of bringing
Hsiao Juei-chang. of Taipei's Chinese Culture University insists that Hsiao Juei-cheng of Caiper's craze for fast food caused by McDonald's will only be a temporary phenomenon.... However, since the company is spending heavily on advertising, it may have a large impact in the long run, especially on
children.: Professor N. Y. Lee of Ju-jen Catholic University insists that the opularity of Western fast food may spur Asian fo
develop more Asian-style fast food to attract customers.
Mr. Hsiao argues that allowing McDonald's into the country will greatly damage the Taiwanese economy, since McDonald's imports everything
from food ingredients to packaging. "The overall costs to (Taiwanese) agriculture, animal husbandry, the food-processing industry, and the fast ood business would be too high to estimate," he says.

of prison construction became so
excessive that an alarmed Legislature launched an investigation.
