and throat can be spread by a cough or a sseeze or just by touching foods.
Once in the food, the bacteria may Once in the food, the bacteria may
multiply rapidly at room temperature mult produce a toxin.
Cooking does not destroy the toxin
and reheating leftovers that have been and reheatitng leftovers that have been
at room temperature for hours is not a at room temperature for hours is not a
safeguard against staphylococcus toxin poisoning.
When preparing foods, be sure to
keep hands, utensils, cutting boards
and counter tops clean by using hot,
and counter tops clean by using hot,
soapy water
While preparing or storing food,
keep hands away from mouth, nose keep hands away from mouth, nose
and hair. Do onot use hands to mix
foods. Avoid using fingers or utensils you are cooking with to to taste food.
Persons with infectious illnesses skin infections should not prepare
food. For a safer, happier holiday, take precautions in your food prepar-
ation. Cleanliness in the kitchen is just one way to insure your family's health and happiness during the holidays.
