Board reviews TEAMS results


#### Abstract

Brad White, dher the first presenter, explained that a "cafeteria plan" is a written plan "cafeteria plan" is a written plan under which all participants are employees, and the participants may choose to pay certain choose to pay certain after-tax expenses with pre-tax dollars, thereby increasing their take home pay. The cafeteria plan must qualify under Section 125 of the Internal under Section 125 of the Internal Revenue Code. After discussig the three proposals, the trustees voted to three proposals, the trustees voted to approve Brad White's proposal from National Plan Administrators. Assistant Superintendent Ted Cotton gave the members Cotton gave the members a report on ment of Minimum Skills (TEAMS) tests which were administered to students in grades three , five seven and nine in February, and he compared these results to TEAMS results from 1986 and 1987. Mr results from 1986 and 1987 . M. M. Cotton reported that $90 \%$ of the Cotton reported that $90 \%$ of the students in the third grade passed the mathe students in the third grade passed the mathematic section of TEAMS $(95 \%$ in 1986 and $89 \%$ in 1987) $85 \%$ (95\% in 1986 and $89 \%$ in 1987$), 85 \%$ passed reading $(91 \%$ in 1986 and $1987)$, and $62 \%(78 \%$ in 1986 and $70 \%$ in 1987$)$ 70\% in 1987 ) passed the total writing section of TEAMS The section of TEAMS. The total writiting section of TEAMS consists of multisection of TEAMS consists of multi- ple choice questions on English grammar, as well as a written composition composition. In the fifth grade, $94 \%$ of the students passed mathematics students passed mathematics ( $82 \%$ in 1986 and $80 \%$ in 1987), $93 \%$ in 1986 and $80 \%$ in 1987 ), $93 \%$ passed reading ( $91 \%$ in 1986 and $90 \%$ in 1987), and $91 \%$ writing (67\% in 1986 and $66 \%$ in 1987). In the seventh grade, $98 \%$ of the students passed mathematics $(79 \%$ in 1986 and $80 \%$ in 1987$), 93 \%$ passed reading ( $82 \%$ in 1986 and $70 \%$ in 1987 ), and $79 \%$ ( $72 \%$ in 1986 and $55 \%$ in 1987) passed writing. $86 \%$ of Ozona's ninth grade students passed mathematics $(79 \%$ in 1986 and $92 \%$ in 1987), $85 \%$ passed reading $(87 \%$ in 1986 and $74 \%$ in 1987), and $61 \%$ passed 1987). Mr. Cotton also gave a report on the October Exit-Level TEAMS tests which all eleventh grade students ble to receive their high school diploma at the end of their senior year. He said that $70 \%$ of $O$ zona's juniors passed the mathematics section of TEAMS during the first administration of the test last fall, and these results were compared t o $86 \%$ mastery of TEAMS at the same time in 1986 and $93 \%$ mastery in 1987. "The reason for the lower passing percentage this year is passing percentage this year is because the State Board of Educaion increased the passing standards (Cont. on pg. 4)
