Year end livestock, crop surveys on tap

The Texas Agricultural Statistics Service will begin contacting farmers
and ranchers across the state in late
November for 1988 November for 1988 acreage, yield
and production totals and end-of-
 tories. "Chang changes in the national farm
program and this summer's dry weather certainly had an impact on Texas agriculture, and these surveys should help us summarize where the
industry stands at the end of 1988 ," industry stands at the end of 1988,",
state statistician Dennis Findley state stati
explained.
"Informa
"Information from these confiden-
tial surveys conducted tial surveys conducted by mail,
telephone or in person will also help producers make their plans for the coming year.
"Sound pro
"Sound production and marketing
decisions require good, reliable indecisions require good, reliable in-
formation and some advanced planning, and our reports provide
producers with solid facts and producers with solid facts and
figures they can incorporate into figures they can incorporate
their plans," Findley added.
The Texas service will be trying to keep survey costs at a minimum this
year because of budget cuts, so year because of budget cuts, so
Findley is irging producers to return their mailed questionnaires as soon as possible.
"Remember, these are sample
surveys, so if you are contacted it is surveys, so if you are contacted it is
important to provide the requested important to provide the requested
information, since one producer represents similar operations of the
same type and size. Our estimates same type and size. Our estimates
can be no better than the numbers can be no better than the numbers
producers provide," Findley noted. Results of the surveys will be
published in early 1989. Anyone published in early 1989. Anyone

Phase one, the amnesty period Phase one, the amnesty period,
began May 5 , 1987 , when illegal
aliens who had resided in the United aliens who had resided in the United
States for a period of five years or more could begin the process by which they could obtain temporary legal residency status. That period
came to an end Nov. 7, 1988. Those aliens who now have temporary residency cards must now
work toward permanent residence status (green cards).
Temporary status may be con-
verted to permant status by verted to permanent status by an
individual demonstrating a minimal individual demonstrating a minimal
understanding of English and some understanding of English and some
knowledge of U. S. history and government.
These requi
These requirements have caused
a shortage of adult English classes a shortage of adult English classes
and civics classes. Some locations in Texas claim the have waiting periods
of two to three months for of two to three months
space in these classes.
About 1.8 million non-agricultural workers have applied for amnesty

## Fall spraying controls pests

Fall is often the time when fruit
tree care is forgotten or neglected, tree care is frorgotten or neglected,
but it's a critical time for controlling many peach and plum tree diseases
to ensure a good coron to ensure a good crop next year.
With the arrival of fall, there's With the arrival of fall, there's
often a tendency to forget our peach often a tendency to forget our peach
and plum trees that served us so well
last summer, said Billy Reagor, last summer, said Billy Reagor,
county anent with the Texas Agricul-
tural Extension Service. county agent with the Tex

The agent said that applying a
copper fungicide now can stop or
reduce three of the diseases that reduce three of the diseases that
attack peach and plum trees in
Texas. These are peach leaf curl, Texas. These are peach leaf curl,
bacterial leaf spot and bacterial
canker
canker.
Puckered and distorted peach tree
Puckered and distorted peach tree
leaves that were either bright red or
leaves that were either bright red or
light green in diseased areas last
spring
light green in diseased areas last
spring were due to peach leaf curl
fungus. The only time to effectively fungus. The only time to effectively
control this disease is in the fall with
a copper-containing fungicide. a copper-containing fungicide.
Timing of the fall spray is critical for
effective control and for avoiding
tree damage. Copper is a metal and tree damage. Copper is a metal and
may cause severe defoliation unless
applied correctly applied correctly.
He advises spraying when 70
percent of the leaves fall of the percent of the leaves fall off the tree.
Spraying too early will cause leaf
shed or spraying too early will cause leaf
shed or cause the spray to be
ineffective later. ineffective later.
Fungicides Fungicides containing chloro-
thalonil can also be used for the thalonil can also be used for the
control of peach leaf curl. Bacterial leaf spot and bacterial
canker can be partially controlled by canker can be partially controlled by
fall spraying with a copper fungicide fall spraying with a copper fungicide,
but not fungicides containing chloro-
thalonil, Reagor said but not fungicides containing chloro-
thalonil, Reagor said. But again, it's

copper fungicide.
Bacterial leaf spot affects both

develop angular spots which drop
out. Bacterial canker will kill trees out. Bacterial canker will kill trees
slowly. Infected trees will have gum or wax forming on the main trunk and main limbs.
