Ken Armbrister, on a $16-15$ vote. <br> Armbrister's amendment would allow school districts to choose not to teach sex education and would have stricken a provision providing information on contraceptives. <br> The vote was $15-15$ on a motion to table the amendment before Hobby voted to table it. <br> Jury Trial Retained <br> Sen. Bob Glasgow last week unveiled his compromise workers' compensation bill. His reform jury trial and puts tougher safety requirements on businesses. <br> The proposal retains many of the changes in benefits already approved by the House. <br> Glasgow's measure will be presented as a complete substitute for a bill by Rep.
