**A Royal Invitation**  
Matthew 11:25-30

During the summer months each year we get quite a few invitations through the mail, and before we open them we usually wonder WHO they are from and WHAT the big occasion is. If we were to receive an invitation with the return address of the White House - or Buckingham Palace, it would cause a lot of excitement around our house, wouldn't it? Yet in the Bible reading above, a far more important invitation comes to you to me. It is truly a ROYAL INVITATION, for it comes from Him who calls the Almighty and Eternal Creator of heaven and earth "My Father". This Invitation is from the "King of kings and Lord of lords" (Revelation 19, 16), the Son of God Himself!  
And WHAT is the big occasion? To those who are sick and tired of trying to make themselves "right" with God through their own efforts-staggering under the weight of the requirements of God's Law and the guilt of falling short, Jesus' invitation reads like this: "Come to Me... and I will give you rest". It is not a burdensome "yoke" of rules and regulations, but an invitation to walk with Him and be yoked to Him in bringing His Invitation to those who have not responded to His offer. May you and I together, as Christians, renew our acceptance of Christ's ROYAL INVITATION today; acknowledging by faith that He is our Lord and Savior, pull together with Him in bringing the Gospel to those around us, that we may finally greet one another in that eternal place of "Rest" which He's prepared for us.

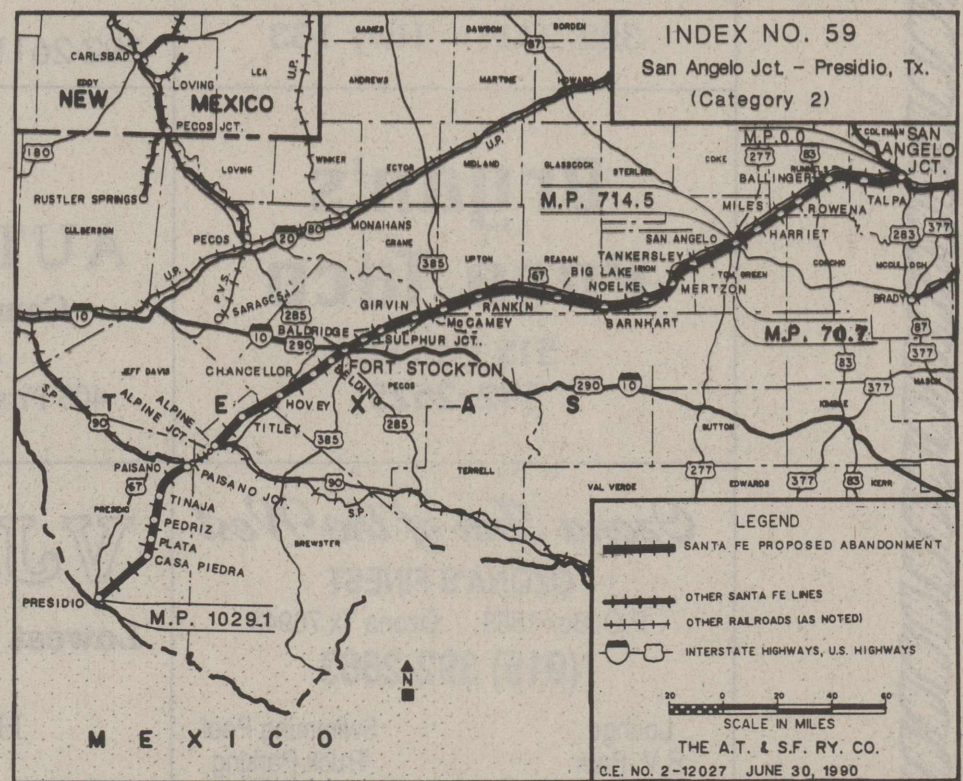

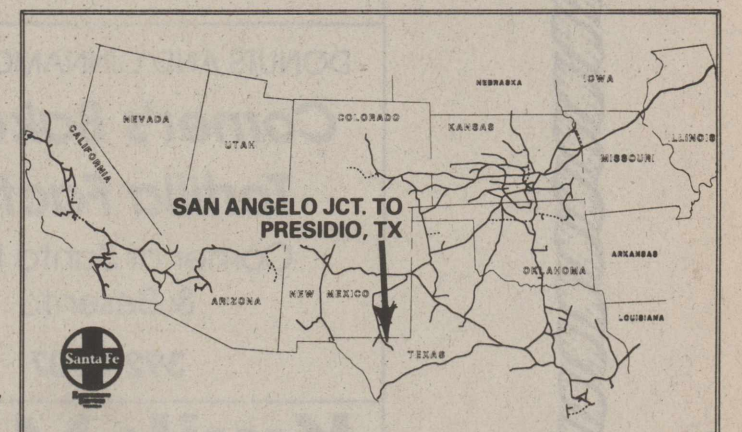

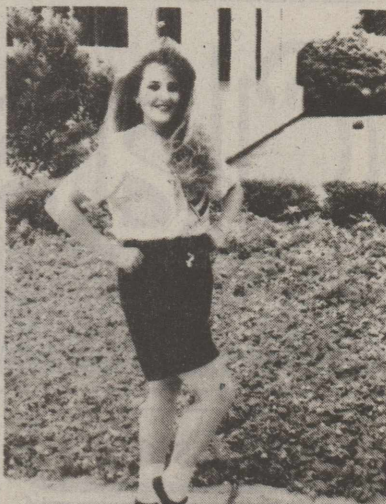

### Helping your child learn to write

Learning to write is an important task of childhood. The U. S. Department of Education has noted that "children who are encouraged to draw and scribble stories at an early age will later learn to compose more easily, more effectively, and with greater confidence than children who do not have this encouragement."

Parents can assist their children in acquiring writing skills in a number of ways:

-Provide a special place for writing and drawing which is equipped with paper, pencils, crayons, felt pens, envelopes, tape and staples, so that children can explore writing at any time.

-Provide bank forms, memo pads, prescription pads and pads for taking orders in restaurants for make believe play. Make believe play of this type will stretch the child's imagination and broaden their experiences.

-Help the child in writing letters to grandparents, sick friends, authors of books and famous people.

-Put little notes in lunch boxes and back packs. These can be picture notes or simple messages like "Hi! I love you are having a good day. I love you!"

-Help children write and illustrate

their own books by stapling the pages together.

-Model writing for children so they will recognize the importance of writing. You encourage this by writing them private notes, writing letters to family and friends (be sure to allow the child to draw a picture or write a letter to include), letting them observe you writing grocery lists or recipes.

-Praise children's attempts to spell as these show they learning the relationship between writing and speech. "Correct" spelling will come later.

-Avoid criticizing neatness, spelling or grammar. It is important that children learn that writing is communication and that it is fun.

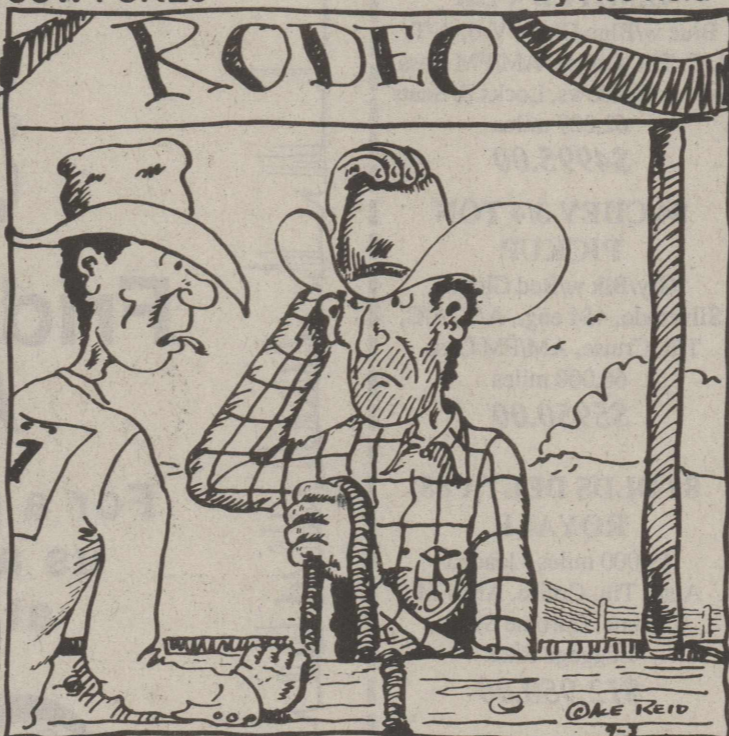
