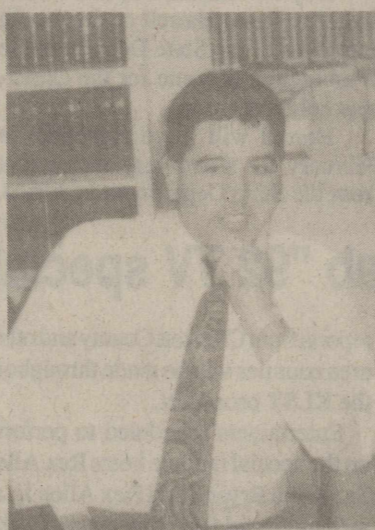

### DeHoyos files for re-election

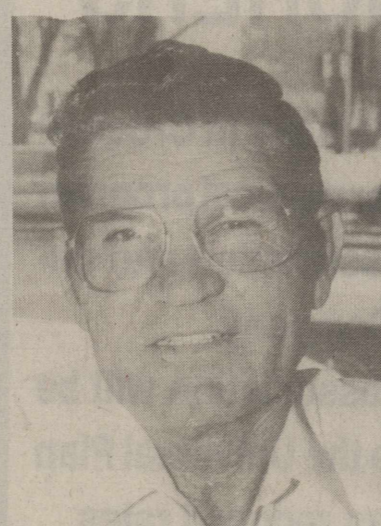

## Commissioners seek extended filing period for 1992 primary

Commissioners voted on Dec. 20 to seek a judicial order in Federal Court to extend the filing period for 1992 general primary and to seek interim approval for Crockett County's redistricting plan.

Approval of the redistricting plan, earlier expected by Dec. 20, is now expected no earlier than Jan. 6, after the filing period ends.

Court members approved a request from the water district to subsidize garbage pickup by \$2,000 per month. Specifications for a computer system for the hospital and care center were approved with revisions. Bids will be opened at 10 a.m. on Jan. 24.

Bids will be opened for medical and hospital insurance on Jan. 24, also.

Commissioners examined a list of bills to be paid by the office of Sandy Stokes, county auditor, without court review. After discussion, commissioners approved payment of non-submitted bills in the following areas: salaries/employee benefits, contract obligations, Chronically Ill and Disabled Children care which is reimbursed by the state, utilities, telephones, county attorney trust fund and state deeds which are pass through accounts, jurors, election judges, postage, motel occupancy tax and freight charges.

The court requested that the hospi-

tal board address the reimbursement process for personnel attending seminars. The court will then consider whether or not payment will be made directly by the auditor without court approval.

Mr. Ortiz has been employed by the county for almost 41 years. He began work as a laborer in 1951 under Damon Davis, then spent 10 years as a heavy equipment operator.

Wise men gathered round and wondered why

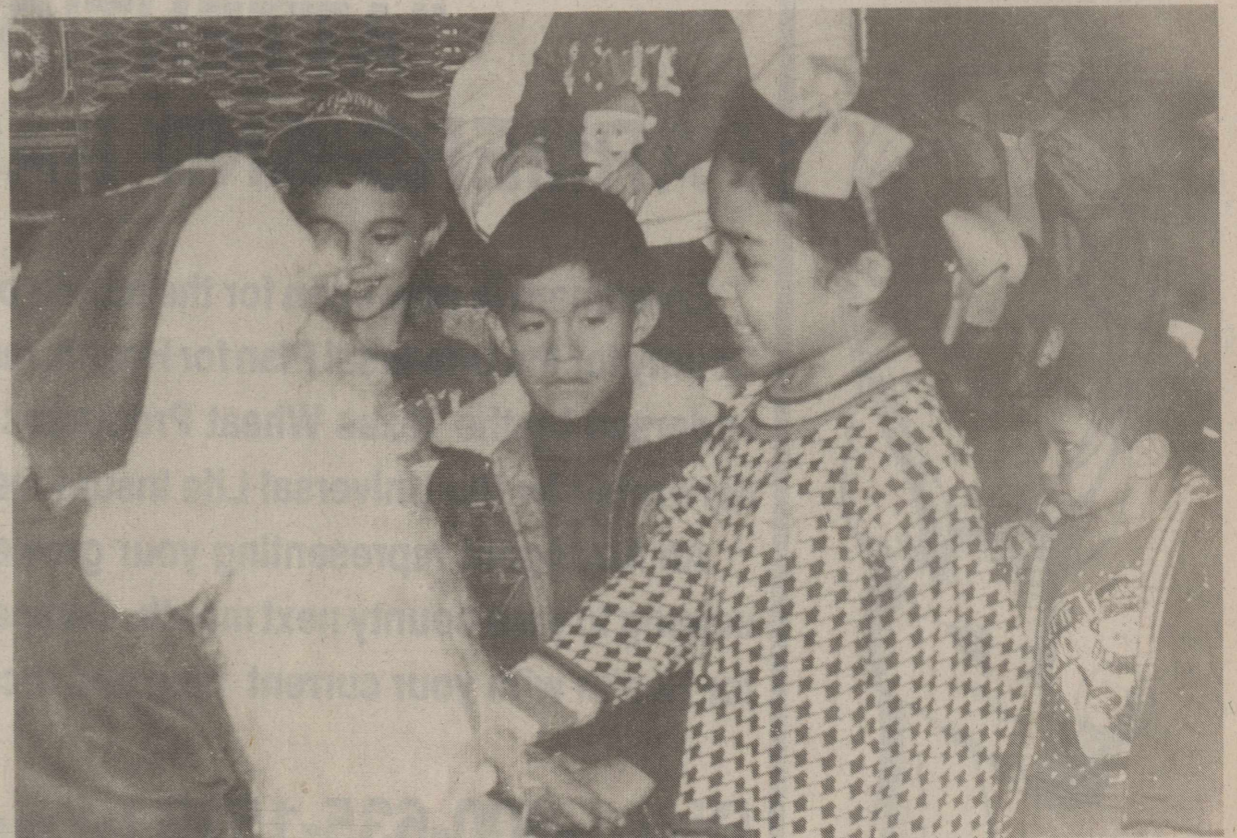

We have been blessed with fine spring rains and consequently have rank grass and fat stock. Most people have done shearing their sheep but are waiting for the money for their wool. Emerald is now progressing quite smoothly, aided by a good school under the charge of Prof. E.C. Moore, and a general merchandise business carried on by Sowell Bros., late of Sherwood. Bradford and Kendrick are drilling another well. Our town is frequently visited by prospectors who are highly pleased with the surrounding country and beautiful town site.

Emerald having all the natural advantages for a prosperous town, carries a bold front and nourishes bright hopes of carrying the day for county seat about the sixth of July.

Week of June 10, 1891

A picnic and barbecue will be held at Couch's Well, June 25, on Howard, Crockett County, to come to some understanding with regard to the best location for the county seat, candidates for county officers, etc.

Week of June 13, 1891

Powell's Well gets Boost Editor Standard:

Recognizing the influence that the Standard exerts in West Texas, in promoting the best interests of the people at large, and never having seen anything in print from our community, I thought that I would write you a short letter with the faint hope that you would not consign it to the basket de la waste.

Week of June 20, 1891 Powell's Well now Ozona

Last week I wrote you from Powell's Well. Since then the name of Powell's Well has been changed to Ozona, which is regarded by a majority of the voters of this county as the most practical place for the county seat.

Its proximity to the county's center, being nearly if not within the five mile limit, according to a survey that is now being made by the surveyors of Menard, Sutton, and Kimble counties, is one of the strong points in its favor.

A new windmill is now going up at Ozona, over the best well of water in Crockett County and lumber for the school house has arrived.

Several parties have been here since they saw my letter in the Stan-
