Dr. Logan was born in Sonora on July 14, 1916 where he attended school. He enlisted in the Navy after graduated from Baylor University School of Dentistry in March of 1944, and was stationed at Farrgut, Idaho. From Farrgut he attended the U.S. Naval Dental School at Bethesda, Maryland. After completing the school Dr. Logan sailed for Japan from Treasure Island in September of 1945 for a four month tour of duty before returning to Seattle on Dec. 31, 1945. He was discharged from the Navy in May, 1946 at San Diego.

Dr. Logan opened an office in Sonora with Dr. Tom White where he practiced for 10 years before moving to Ozona in September of 1946.

Dr. Logan's father, Joe F. Logan, lived south of Ozona on the Moss Ranch (later the Marge McMullan Ranch) before the county was organized in 1891. His father pumped water with a steam engine for the Moss cattle. He did this for 12 to 18 months and then moved to Kimble County.
