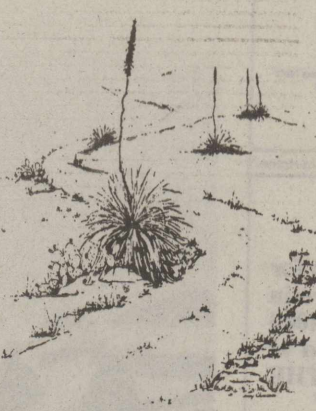
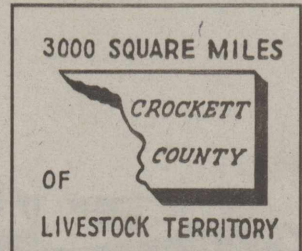

## DeerFest Feeds 1000 Plus

The sixth annual Crockett County DeerFest fed 1011 people through the serving line, packing the main room of the civic center and filling all available space in other rooms with diners Friday night. In the kitchen, guests took their meals standing up around the counters.

"We were very, very pleased," said organization secretary treasurer Laurie Hale. "I just can't say enough. I didn't even mind going over to clean up on Saturday."

The only criticism Mrs. Hale said she had heard of the event was that the building is just too small.

At one time the line was reported to have stretched to the Lutheran

Church, but serving was fast, and one hour and 10 minutes after the 6:20 p.m. opening, everyone had gone through the line.

Robert Roden of Bayou Vista was the big winner of the evening, taking home the Honda 4x4 and also winning a gun. In addition to a large variety of prizes, 82 guns were given away at the 1993 DeerFest.

Winners who were not present are being notified of their prizes. Items may be picked up at FESCO.

An estimated 50 to 75 cooks prepared 65 deer, eight feral hogs, 17 briskets, 70 pounds of beans, 70 pounds of potatoes and 50 boxes of vermicelli. Also on the menu was 100 pounds

of pen-raised alligator. The alligator was obtained from Cameron Parish, LA, sheriff Sono Savoio by Judge Henry Politz who hunts at the Seahorn Ranch. Hunter Bucky Reeves of Shreveport and helpers boiled six alligator tails most of a day, de-boned the meat and then marinated it all night at the ranch before bringing it to DeerFest for frying.

In addition to the cooks, many people worked in the serving lines filling plates and encouraging everyone to eat their fill.

Master of Ceremonies for the evening was Sheriff Jim Wilson who kept a running commentary going as prizes were given away.

## New Voter Registration Cards To Be Mailed

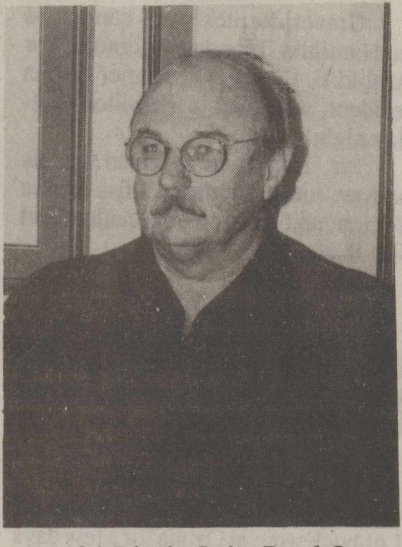
Registered voters in Crockett County will soon be receiving new voter registration cards by mail. These cards have an effective date of Jan. 1, 1994, through Dec. 31, 1995, and are bright yellow in color. Any previously issued cards should be destroyed. New cards are mailed every two years.

Tom Stokes, voter registrar, asks that you verify all information on your new cards. If there are any errors or changes that need to be made on your card, please contact the tax office, located in the courthouse annex, or call 392-2674 or 392-2675 for instructions on how corrections and changes are to be handled.

Also, if you receive a voter registration card in your post office box for a person who is no longer a resident of Crockett County or no longer lives in your household, the card should be turned back in to the post office so that it can be stamped as "Undeliverable"

## Three Ozona 4-H'ers Win At District Food Show

Crockett County 4-H had one of its best showings ever at the 1994 District VI 4-H Food Show in Fort Stockton on Saturday, as three 4-H'ers took top honors in their respective categories.

First place winners from Crockett County included junior entries Laramie McWilliams in the bread and cereals category and Codi Richardson in the snacks and desserts category. Ashlee Ramos topped the intermediate breads and cereals category with two perfect scores.

"Every Crockett County 4-H'er was extremely competitive," said Tedra Ulmer, County Extension Agent-Home Economics. The agent noted that junior Amanda Carson placed second in the lamb category and Lauren Wilkins was second in the intermediate pork category. Third place finishes went to Kyle Richardson in junior fruits and vegetables and to Adrienne Dickerson in senior breads and cereals.

Fifth place finishers from Crockett County included Ty Porter in intermediate main dish, Marsha Maskill in junior beef, and JoLynn Vannoy in senior main dish. Claressa Tambunga placed 7th out of 22 contestants in the junior main dish category. "Our goal every year is to at least place in the top half of every class, and we did this again—even with some of our contestants being among the youngest and least experienced in their respective

divisions," Ulmer said. The agent gave credit for the excellent performance to the 4-H'ers and their parents. "Unless these young people are willing to study their nutrition information and practice making their dishes, they cannot be competitive—and this takes a lot of support and help from the parents," she noted. Contestants at the district food show have advanced from one of the 23 counties in District VI by winning their categories at their county food show. They are judged on their nutrition knowledge, the taste and appearance of their dish, and their communi-

cation skills in an interview with judges.

Adult leaders Nancy Vannoy and Dena Porter served as judges from Crockett County at this year's district contest.

Typical questions the 4-H'ers have to answer include the food groups included in the U.S.D.A. nutrition pyramid, number of servings needed daily from each group, and an example of each. In addition, they must know the main nutrients in their dish, what each nutrient does for the body, and what can happen if they do not get enough of each nutrient.

"In addition, the 4-H'ers have to plan ahead how they will prepare and carry their dish to preserve maximum quality and flavor, and how to serve it most attractively while limited to edible garnishes only," Ulmer said.

First place contestants received a \$50 savings bond from various donors across the district, as well as a food show medal. Second and third-place contestants received an iron skillet. Ulmer noted that Crockett County National Bank and Ozona's Wool Growers Central Storage were bond donors for the three first place lamb awards at the District contest.

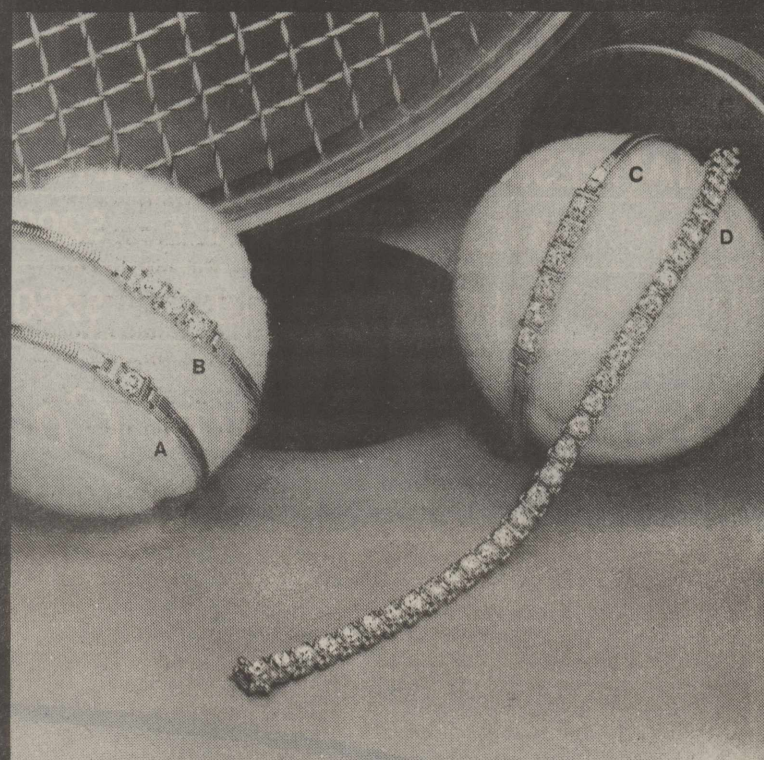

The following article is from the Texas Department of Commerce's tourism division.

Two indicators that point to growth trends in Texas tourism are the number of Texas travel information requests received and the lodging indicators.

According to the Texas Department of Commerce's Tourism Division, the number of requests for information about Texas travel and tourism set a record this year with almost one million inquiries. Approximately 992,000 inquiries were made during the 1993 fiscal year, Sept. 1, 1992, through Aug. 31, 1993, an increase of nearly 70,000 inquiries over the previ-

ous fiscal year.

Most of the inquiries were generated through the state's advertising campaign promoting a toll-free telephone number, 800/888-TEX. Those calling the toll-free number receive a highway map, an accommodations guide and a full color 264-page *Texas State Travel Guide*. In addition to the number of inquiries, the Tourism Division reports an increase in the total number of visitors, lodging revenues, and state and local taxes generated by travel. Texas is currently the number two travel destination in the country.

Confirming the vitality of Texas tourism and the Texas lodging industry, the *First Quarter 1993 Texas Hotel Performance Report* shows the highest first quarter total in history for Texas. A report commissioned by Commerce's Tourism Division shows revenue jumping 7 percent from the

first quarter of 1992. This gain is in line with the annual growth rate in lodging revenues that has averaged 7 percent in Texas since 1987.

The report, prepared for the Tourism Division by Source Strategies, Inc. of San Antonio, noted that all growth reported in the first quarter of the year was reported by higher priced under \$60 per night. Facilities offering lodging at more than \$60 experienced a gain of 13.8 percent.

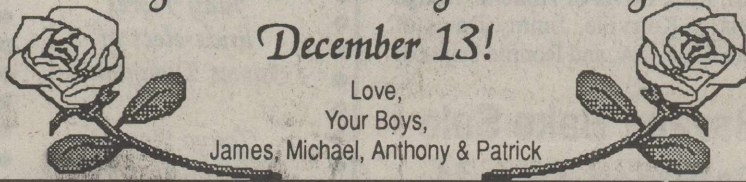

### Dr. Joe B. Logan Retires After 50 Years, Donates Equipment To Club

Dr. Joe B. Logan DDS (Doctor of Dental Surgery), and longtime Crockett County resident, has decided that 50 years is long enough and has retired his practice and has donated his equipment and supplies worth \$40-\$50,000 to the Champion Tooth Club of El Paso.

Dr. Logan was born in Sonora on July 14, 1916 where he attended school. He enlisted in the Navy after graduating from Baylor University School of Dentistry in March of 1944, and was stationed at Farrgut, Idaho. From Farrgut he attended the U.S. Naval Dental School at Bethesda, Maryland. After completing the school Dr. Logan sailed for Japan from Treasure Island in September of 1945 for a four month tour of duty before returning to Seattle on Dec. 31, 1945. He was discharged from the Navy in May, 1946 at San Diego.

Dr. Logan opened an office in Sonora with Dr. Tom White where he practiced for 10 years before moving to Ozona in September of 1946.

Dr. Logan's father, Joe F. Logan, lived south of Ozona on the Moss Ranch (later the Marge McMullan Ranch) before the county was organized in 1891. His father pumped water with a steam engine for the Moss cattle. He did this for 12 to 18 months and then moved to Kimble County.

Joe B. and Mary Logan have two children, Richard Ben and Sharon Leigh. Both children graduated from

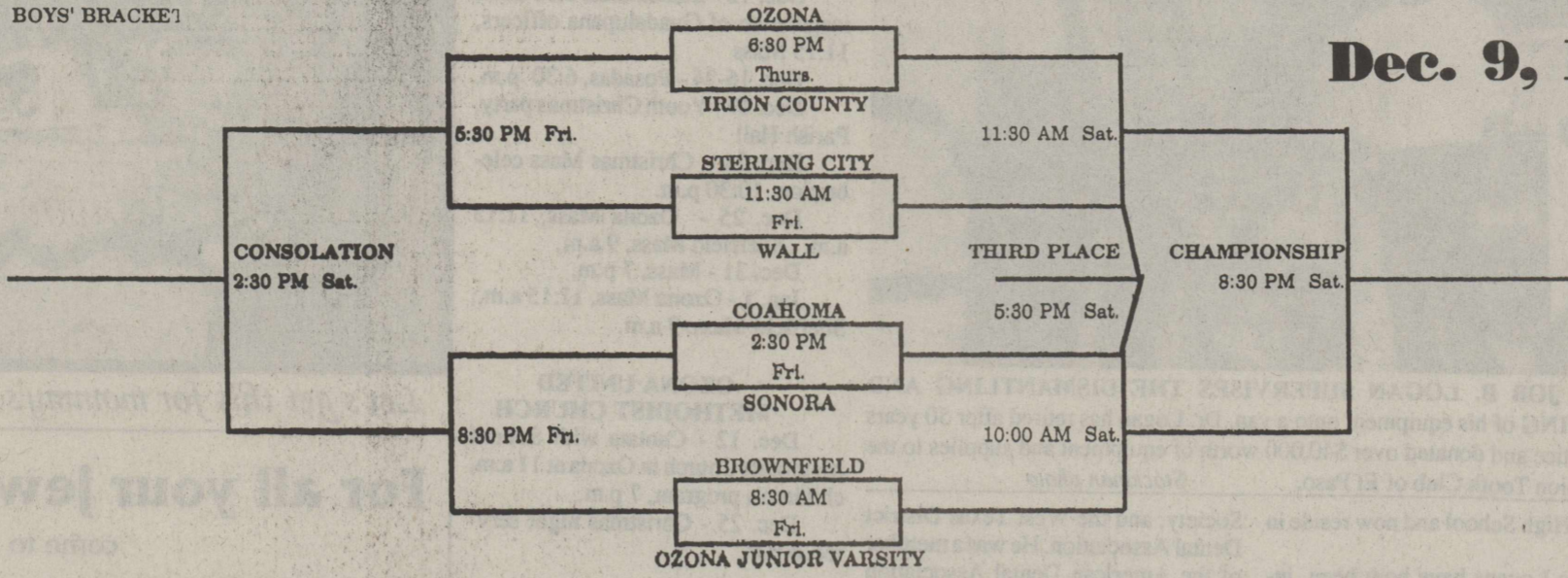

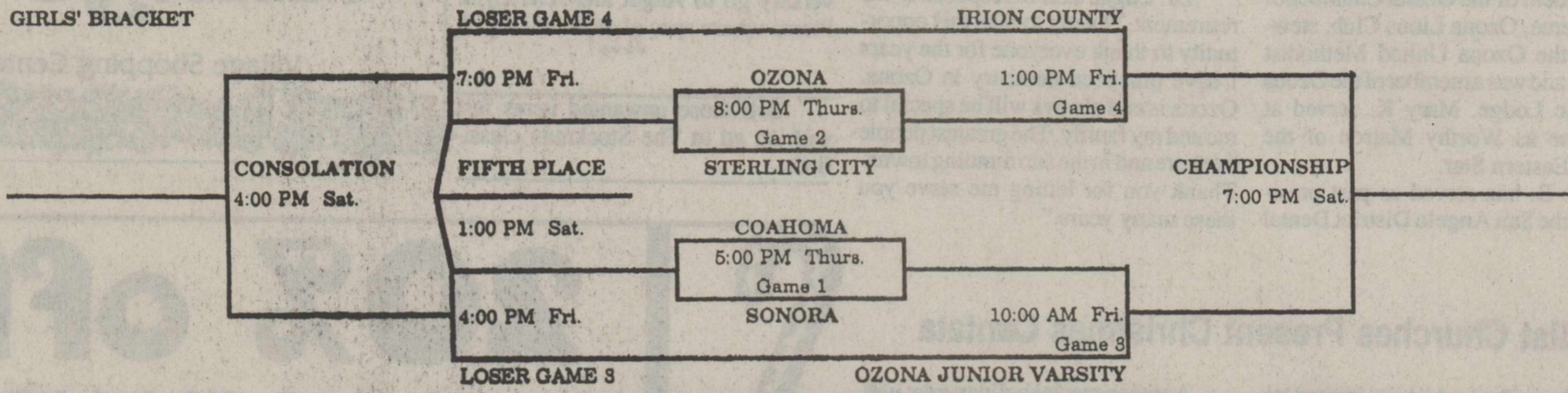

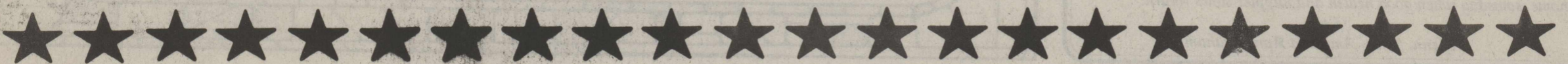

## OHS Varsity In Coahoma Tourney

Steady progress toward team goals and a decent showing in a "very competitive tournament" marked the Ozona Lions' weekend at the Coahoma basketball tournament.

The Lions, who placed seventh out of nine teams, were hurt by height disadvantages in key games but still managed to place one player, Chris Sanchez, on the all-tournament team.

In the tourney's first game, Ozona faced Merkel. After falling behind 14-20 in the first quarter, the Lions pulled to within one point at halftime with a 26-27 score. Merkel stayed ahead with a 3-point lead at the beginning of the third quarter, but Ozona poured in 17 points during the fourth quarter. Unfortunately, Merkel scored equally well, and the game ended with the score Ozona 57, Merkel 60.

Top scorers in the game were Tony Valencia with 13 points and Julio Martinez with 12, and both Ray Fierro and Chris Sanchez scored 11 points each.

In the second game, Ozona faced perennial rival Reagan County. It was a hard-fought game for most of the way, as the first quarter ended 14-17 in Reagan County's favor. The second quarter saw the Owls take a lopsided lead 42-27, as Ozona scored only 13 points to Reagan County's 25.

The Lions made their usual third-

quarter comeback, outscoring Reagan County 14 to 8 and making the score 41 to 50 in the Owls' favor at the beginning of the fourth period. However, Reagan County continued to stay ahead, and the game ended with a final score of Reagan County 66, Ozona 54.

Top scorers in this game were Chris Sanchez with 15 points, Tony Valencia with 12 points, Julio Martinez with 10 points and Ray Fierro with 9 points. The Lions' final game of the tourney pitted Ozona against Colorado City. Again, the Lions started out slowly, scoring only eight points to Colorado City's 17 in the first period. In the second quarter, however, Ozona scored 17 points to the Bulldogs' five, making the score 25 to 22 in Ozona's favor at halftime.

The Lions never looked back, keeping a 38-34 lead at the end of the third period and holding on to make the final score Ozona 48, Colorado City 43. Chris Sanchez repeated as top scorer with 19 points, including a trio of three-point shots. Julio Martinez contributed eight points, Tony Valencia and Ray Fierro made six points each, Daniel Caldera scored four points, and Keith Miller sank one three-pointer. Doug Meador also scored two

points. "It was a very competitive tournament," commented Coach John Curry, "and overall I was pleased with the way we played, especially in the Merkel game. We had well-balanced scoring in that game, even with Merkel's height advantage." The coach noted Merkel had two players over six feet, five inches.

"We didn't play real well against Reagan County," however, the coach added, "I've seen some steady progress since we began. We're looking forward to a good tournament this weekend."

The Lions will play at home this week in the annual Ozona tournament, and fans are urged to support their home teams.

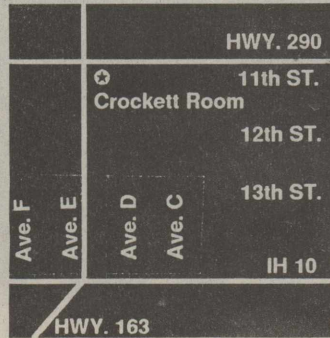

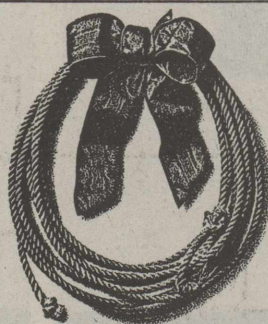

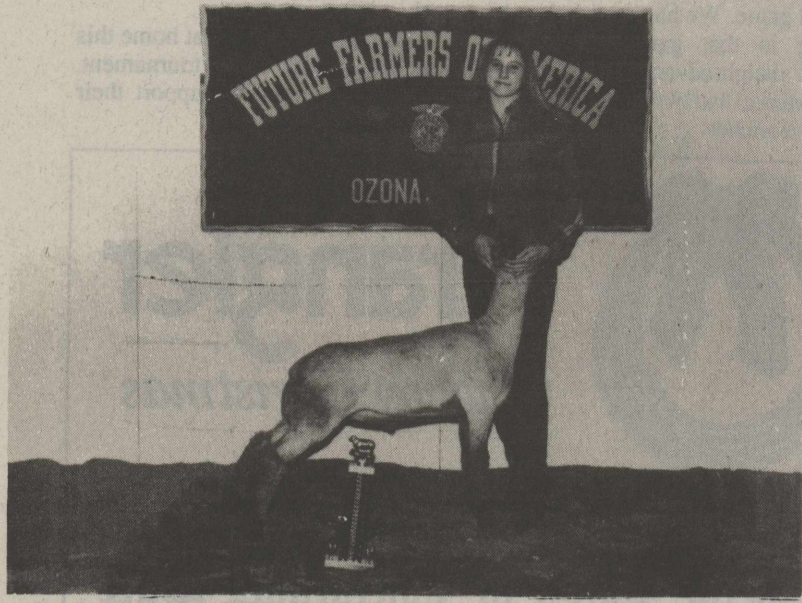

Some exceptions allowed in retaining these cards are if a person is out of the county on a temporary basis due to work, military service or attending an institution of higher education. Otherwise voter registration cards, by law,

are not to be forwarded.

The voter registrar's office apologizes in advance for any inconvenience caused if anyone happens to receive a card for a voter who is deceased. However, unless a family member of the deceased person notifies our office with information pertaining to the deceased voter, we cannot remove or cancel their name from the voter registration list.
