## Circle Bar Racing Captures Third At Ft. Worth



Commissioners voted in an emer- care for Santiago Talamantez, 6) failgency called meeting Tuesday morning to approve the release and compromise settlement of all claims in the Talamantez litigation. This action comes afterrecent mediation of claims against the county made by the family of the late Santiago Talamantez, who was a resident of Crockett County Care Center.

The county is to pay \$75,000 to the Talamantez claimants and their attorneys while at the same time not admitting "any liability to any party to this agreement or anyone else by signing of this release but rather expressly deny any and all such liability.'

In a notice of claim sent to Crockett County, it was alleged that Santiago Talamantez's death was due to acts or omissions of Crockett County. The Talamantez claimants claim that Crockett County wrongfully caused Santiago Talamantez's death by 1) failing to provide residents with accurate assessment of skin conditions, 2) failure to provide treatment as ordered by the attending physician, 3) failure to provide aggressive nursing care and prevention and treatment of pressure sores, 4) failure to provide pain control for Santiago Talamantez's condition, 5) failure to incorporate Hospice to the execution of the release.

ure to provide Santiago Talamantez with medical attention in a timely manner, 7) failure to notify Santiago Talamantez's son and physicians of significant changes in his condition, 8) failure to provide proper care and treatment for skin conditions, 9) failure to properly train, instruct, and supervise its employees in prevention of skin breakdown, 10) failure to provide a plan of care to meet the needs of Santiago Talamantez, 11) failure to keep the family and physician of Santiago Talamantez informed of change in his medical condition, 12) failure to add sufficient staff or personnel available to care for Santiago Talamantez, and 13) failure to follow the accepted standards of medical care and treatment.

The Talamantez claimants and the county entered into the release and compromise settlement of all claims voluntarily and with the advice of counsel. As part of the agreement, the Talamantez claimants "release, acquit and forever discharge Crockett County... from any and all causes of action, claims, disputes, damages, rights and complaints" in the future for acts or omissions occurring prior State & Capital

Texans would prefer a governor who's effective," said Democratic Party Chairman Bill White. "He started too late on tax reform and failed to deliver the votes."

Despite the Legislature's failure to substantially reduce the school tax burden on homeowners, Bush indicated he is not ready to quit the governor's mansion. "We've delivered the largest tax cut in the state's history ... you ought to assume I'm going to run (for reelection)," he told reporters.

If voters approve a constitutional amendment on the Aug. 9 ballot, the average homeowner can expect a \$140 break by increasing the homestead exemption from \$5,000 to \$15,000. Sharp, Mauro Eyeing Race

Comptroller John Sharp, a Democrat, who may have gubernatorial aspirations, said Bush's proposed business-activity tax would have taxed the income of limited partnerships and was nothing more than a personal income tax.

"If any Democrat had proposed this to the Legislature, they would have been run out of town inside 12 hours," Sharp said, adding that lawmakers did Bush a favor when they failed to agree on a tax reform

Countering, Gov. Bush's spokeswoman, Karen Hughes, said Sharp had advocated a similar tax six years ago. And, she defended Bush's pre-session pledge not to raise taxes. She said it was "absolutely absurd" to portray the partnership tax as an income tax.

Meanwhile Land Commissioner Garry Mauro has hired a pollster and plans to travel the state, asking Texans "what they want in their next governor."

GOP Chairman Tom Pauken said Mauro is too liberal and Sharp doesn't have "any substantive issues" on which to challenge Bush.

The legislation was Lt. Gov. Bullock's top priority for the session. "Our future depends on this bill. Texans can now stand united on a subject that has long divided us," he said.

The bill will provide more than \$1 billion for upgrading substandard drinking water systems. It will protect freshwater flows into bays and estuaries and it creates obstacles for transfers of water from one basin to another. The measure will appear as a constitutional amendment on the Nov. 4 ballot.

Cities, water districts and other local governments will have to work together to create and manage a water-conserving drought plan due September 2000.

'Gangsta' Investment Ban Revived Texas could become the first state to prohibit agencies from investing in companies that produce or distribute "gangsta rap" music under a measure Gov. Bush will sign into law.

After a House committee threw it out, Sen. Bill Ratliff, R-Mount Pleasant, revived the measure by attaching it as a rider to the 800page state budget bill. Ratliff, chairman of the Senate Finance Committee, said he wanted to stop public money from going to companies he said poison the minds of children and teen-agers.

According to a report in the Austin American-Statesman, the rider prohibits the use of state money to invest in or buy securities of a business that owns 10 percent or more of a company that records or produces any song, lyrics or other musical work that explicitly describes, glamorizes or advocates:

Acts of criminal violence, including murder, assault, assault on police officers, sexual assault and robbery;

Necrophilia, bestiality, pedophilia;

■ Illegal use of drugs;

 Criminal street gang activity; ■ Degradation of women; and

■ Violence against sex, race, ethnic group, sexual orientation or



Blood donors are asked to bring identification, such as a UBS donor card or driver's license. Donors are







"Two-week camps can be overwhelming and miserable for children who do not fit easily into groups," Mock said. "For those children, shorter camps provide a good opportunity to learn how to mix well."

The right type makes a difference as well. Camps that help a child develop skills in an area of interest, such as horseback riding, sports, science or nature, are more likely to be a hit.

However, picking the right camp, and one that is well qualified, requires homework.

"Parents need to feel comfortable about how a camp is managed," she said. "Ask for the names of parents whose children have attended, and talk to them."

Color and leaf variegation were the most important purchasing factors for all five markets studied, while price was the least important.



good health. Fats supply energy and essential fatty acids and promote absorption of the fat-soluble vitamins A, D, E and K. More Americans are now cating less fat, saturated fat, and cholesterol down from about 40% of total calories to 34% of calories. The Dietary Guidelines for Americans recommends diets low in fat, saturated fat and cholesterol so that over time, total fat comprises no more than 30% or calories.

What are saturated fats, unsaturated fats and cholesterol?

Saturated fats are usually solid at room temperature, and occur in larger amounts in food from animal sources such as meat, poultry and dairy products. Unsaturated fats are usually liquid at room temperature, and are found in larger amounts in vegetable oils and fish. Cholesterol is a fatty substance found only in animal products. It is especially abundant in eggs and organ meats such as liver. This does not meat you can't eat a specific food you like. For example, eggs and liver contain cholesterol, but they also contain many essential vitamins and minerals. Most foods can be eaten in moderate amounts, provided your overall fat and cholesterol intakes aren't exces-

Foods high in fat should be used sparingly.

Some foods and food groups in the Food Guide Pyramid are higher in fat than others. Fat and oils, and some types of desserts and snack foods that contain fat provide calories but few nutrients. Many foods in the milk group and in the meat and beans group (which includes eggs and nuts, as well as meat, poultry and fish) are also high in fat, as are some processed foods in the grain group. Choosing lower fat options among these foods allows you to eat the recommended servings from these groups and increase the amount and variety of grain products, fruits and vegetables in your diet without going over your calorie needs.

Remember, whether fat comes from plant or animal sources, it contains more than twice the number of calories of an equal amount of carbohydrate or protein. Choose a diet that provides no more than 30% of total calories from fat, however; this does not mean that every food you choose must contain only 30% calories from fat. A quick way to keep percent of calories from fat at or below 30% is to look for products that contain 3 grams or less of fat per 100 calories.

The upper limit on grams of fat in your diet will depend on the calories you need. Cutting back on fat can help you consume fewer calories. For example, at 2,000 calories per day, the suggested upper limit is about 600 calories. Sixty-five grams of fat contribute about 600 calories (65 grams of fat x 9 calories per gram = 585

> Partially hydrogenated vegetable oils, such as those in many margarines and shortenings, contain a particular form of unsaturated fat known as transfatty acids that may raise blood cholesterol levels, although not as much as saturated fat.

The body makes the cholesterol it requires. In addition, cholesterol is obtained from food. Choosing foods with less cholesterol and saturated fat will help lower your blood cholesterol levels. The Nutrition Facts Label lists the Daily Value for cholesterol as 300 mg. You can keep your cholesterol intake at this level or lower by eating more grain products, vegetables and cholesterol foods.

### Fuel Surcharge To Be Added To WTU Customer Bills

West Texas Utilities Company electricity at their power plants. crease in the total amount of their electric bills beginning last week. The surcharge is being added to customer bills over the next 12 months to collect unrecovered fuel costs and interest.

The Public Utility Commission of Texas approved WTU's request to recover approximately \$13 million in unrecovered fuel costs and interest that are the result of unforseen and significant increases in the cost of natural gas that have occurred over the last year throughout the country.

Implementation of the surcharge will result in a 1.6 percent increase in customers' bills over the 12-month period. Typical residential customers using 1000 kilowatt-hours of electricity a month would see their bills increase, on average, by approximately \$1.22. The effect of the surcharges on customers' bills will vary depending on the rate schedule under which they take service.


Investor-owned electric utilities in Texas, like WTU, use fuel factors based on cost estimates to collect the projected cost of fuel used to generate

When the actual costs of fuel significantly exceed the fuel charges that customers are paying in their monthly bills, PUCT rules require that the utility request permission to surcharge the additional amount. When the actual costs of fuel are significantly lower than what customers are paying in fuel charges, the electric utility is required to issue a refund.

Since this fixed fuel cost recovery mechanism was placed into effect in the late 1980s, WTU has refunded over \$49 million in fuel cost reduc-

Unforseen and significant increases in the cost of natural gas occurred over the last year throughout the country. The cost of natural gas was 38 percent higher during 1996 than it was in 1995. The increases were even more significant during colder months. For example, the actual cost of natural gas in December 1996 was 82 percent higher than the December 1995 cost.

Approximately 55 percent of WTU's annual generation of electricity is produced by power plants fueled

volunteer fire departments access to Services Office," said Turner. firefighting equipment that normally would be destroyed because of liability concerns. House Bill 680 will protect companies from liability when they donate used or obsolete firefighting equipment to the Texas Forest

Service. The Texas Forest Service already operates a program whereby donated equipment is recertified, where applicable, and distributed to volunteer fire departments around the state. "House Bill 680 already has resulted in the donation of hundreds of air packs," said Turner. "Most volunteer fire departments cannot afford to buy these, and they are absolutely critical breathing equipment for firefighters who enter burning structures," Rep. Turner

"A lot of industrial and chemical companies have fire brigades on site at their plants. OSHA requires them to upgrade their firefighting equipment periodically, and a lot of this equipment never even gets used. Until now, companies would actually destroy the obsolete equipment rather than donate it because of the liability. I am talking about things like breathing apparatus, bunker gear, hose, nozzles and gas metering devices - equipment that could save a volunteer firefighter's life and that was literally going into the trash heap," Turner explained.

"I am very proud of this legislation. I know it will save lives. Moreover, it will reduce insurance premiums in areas served by volunteer fire departments, because more VFDs will
