

Makes three 9" or 10" pie crusts

3 c. flour

1 tsp. salt 1T sugar

1 c. shortening 1 T butter

9 T water

Mix flour, sugar, salt; cut in shortening and butter with a pastry cutter until mixture is coarse. Add water one T at a time. Mix with a fork to form a ball. Divide into equal balls. On a floured surface, roll each ball to size needed for pie plate. Flute as desired and bake according to pie recipe.

CHOCOLATE CAKE

Mix together: 2c. flour, 2c. granulated sugar

In microwave, melt together: 1 stick butter, 1/2 c shortening, 4 T powdered cocoa, 1 c water

Add microwave mixture to sugar and flour; mix, then add: 1/2 c buttermilk, 2 eggs, 2 tsp. soda, 1 tsp. ground cinnamon, 1 tsp. vanilla.

Mix until smooth. Pour into a large 13x9 greased and floured pyrex dish. Bake at 350 degrees until tests done. Cool slightly and frost.

FROSTING FOR CHOCOLATE CAKE

In microwave, melt together: 1 stick butter, 6 T milk, 4 T powdered cocoa.; add: 1 lb. powdered sugar. Mix well, add: 1 c. chopped pecans, 1 tsp. vanilla. Spread on warm cake.



It's Grubtime

For those of you who have been asking about the proper time to treat for grubworms (especially those with St. Augustine lawns), now's the time.



The target date for grub treatments are mid-July thru late August. For those who want to use Oftanol, now's the time to apply. Oftanol is a slow release long lasting insecticide; so you need to apply before the target date in order to ensure good control. If Diazinon is what you use, you will need to wait and apply around mid-July. There will need to be 1-2 follow up treatments of Diazinon, depending on the amount of rainfall. If you apply Oftanol, the 1 follow-up treatment around mid to late August will be all that's needed. Remember, by the time you can tell if you have grubworms, it's too late. The damage has already been done. Grub treatments are like fungus disease application, preventative in nature. We apply grub control to prevent problems instead of curing the







The increase was adopted in Austin June 5 by the Texas Parks and Wildlife Commission as part of the 1997-98 Migratory Gamebird Procla- remain at four birds per day and eight mation - Early Season Provisions.

Wildlife biologists say whitewings are expanding their range in Central Texas and population densities continue to increase. Since 1991, the daily bag limit for whitewings was no more than six birds in the aggregate dove bag limit. The department has asked the U.S. Fish and Wildlife service to lift this limit so the entire 15 bird daily bag limit could be whitewings. TPWD officials say that an answer from USFWS is expected by the first of July. This would make enforcement of an aggregate bag limit easier for game wardens. Proposed season dates for mourning doves are Sept. 1-Oct. 30 in the North Zone; Sept. 1 -Oct. 19, Dec. 26 - Jan. 5 in the Central Zone; and Sept. 20 - Nov. 7, Dec. 26 -Jan. 5 in the South Zone. The daily bag limit is 15 doves.

The proposed white-winged dove season is Sept. 6, 7, 13 and 14 in the Special White-winged Dove Area of South Texas. Bag and possession limits in the Special White-winged Dove Area are 10 white-winged, mourning and white-tipped doves in the aggregate, including no more than five mourning doves and two whitetips per day. Shooting hours will be noon to sunset.

Social Security taxes pay for disabil-Medicare hospital insurance. Four out of five workers are covered and would receive benefits if they became disabled and unable to work.

Even if you are aware of the coverage you may not know that you need recent work to keep the disability protection current. The amount of recent work you need for disability benefits depends on your age at which you become disabled. It varies from as little as 1 1/2 years out of the past three years for people disabled under age 24 to a maximum of five years out of the last 10 for people disabled after age

A typical case is that of Mary Jones, who left the workforce at age 21 to raise her twin daughters. When she was diagnosed with breast cancer three years later, she found out that she could not qualify for disability benefits because, even though she had worked for four years, at age 24 she needed at least a year and a half of

work out of the preceding three years. It's easy enough to keep your disability coverage current. You get a credit of coverage for a certain amount of earnings - \$670 in 1997, with a maximum of four credits in a year. This means you only need earnings of \$2,680 during a year to qualify for a year of coverage in 1997. The amount of earnings that constitute a credit of coverage increases annually with increases in general wage levels.





Disabled Person Placards Will Begin To Expire Soon

abled person placards that were issued of a placards is available only through their donations. in 1992 will begin to expire on June the county tax offices. 30. The Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) reminds citizens disabled person placards should be remain in compliance with state and or to the local county tax assessorfederal laws.

Permanently disabled person placards are hung from a vehicle's rear view mirror and entitle the holder to certain parking privileges. Placards may also be displayed in any vehicle used by or for the transportation of a disabled person.

"State law requires that permanently disabled person placards be renewed after five years," said Jerry Dike, director of TxDOT's Vehicle Titles and Registration Division. "We started issuing placards in July 1992 through the county tax assessor-collectors. Five years later, the first wave of these placard holders must get replacements. Citizens should pay close attention to the expiration date because there won't be any renewal notices for placards."

Placard renewals are processed through the local county tax assessorcollector. Citizens are asked to take their expired placards to the tax office, where they will complete a form and pay a \$5 statutory fee per placard. Permanently disabled Texans may obtain up to two placards; they also have the option of getting one placard and one set of disabled person license

Approximately 800,000 permanently disabled placards have been issued statewide since 1992. First-time applicants for permanently disabled person placards or license plates have to meet certain eligibility requirements; their application must also bear the signature of a licensed Texas physician or optometrist. The county tax assessor-collectors issue placards locally to individuals, not motor vehicles. Because there's no centralized

collector's office.





Advance Fee Loans Are **Against The Law In Texas**

The Permian Basin office of the Better Business Bureau routinely receives calls concerning the advertisements "Guaranteed Loans, regardless of credit history" or words to that effect. When the consumer contacts the company, they find the company is then requesting a fee, up-front, before processing the loan.

"The Texas State Consumer Credit Commission tells us that's against the law," says Dick Rowland, BBB president. "According to all our conversations with the commission, Texas state law forbids charging private consumers an upfront fee for the mere promise of a loan."

A general information report, available from the BBB reminds that extreme caution should always be used when dealing with a loan broker in another state, also. "You might be told the loan is guaranteed, or your money. will be returned, but you also have to remember that a guarantee is only as good as the company behind it," Rowland stated. "And here's a real question to ponder. If you have a credit problem that's bad enough to make it impossible to get a loan with a local company, why would a distant company be willing to give you one?"

The Bureau also reminds consumers of similar promotions concerning debt consolidation loans. "Some of them turn out to be information on how to declare bankruptcy," Rowland

Property Tax Protest and Appeal Procedures

The law gives property owners the right to protest actions concerning their property tax appraisals. You may follow these appeal procedures if you have a concern about:

the value placed on your property

· any exemptions that may apply to you • the cancellation of an agricultural appraisal

• the taxable status of your property • the local governments which should be taxing your

· any action taken by the appraisal district that adversely affected you.

Informal Review

Call the Crockett County Appraisal District at 392-2674 or visit the office in the Courthouse Annex.

Review by the Appraisal Review Board If you can't resolve your problem informally with the appraisal district staff, you may have your case heard by the appraisal review board (ARB).

The ARB is an independent board of citizens that reviews problems with appraisals or other concerns listed above. It has the power to order the appraisal district to make the necessary changes to solve problems. If you file a written request for an ARB hearing (called a notice of protest) before the deadline, the ARB will set your case for a hearing. You'll receive written notice of the time, date and place of the hearing. The hearing will be informal. You and the appraisal district representative will be asked to present evidence about your case. The ARB will make its decision based on the evidence presented. You can get a copy of a protest form from the appraisal district office at 908

Note: You shouldn't try to contact ARB members outside of the hearing. The law requires ARB members to sign an affidavit saying that they haven't talked about your case before the ARB hears it.

Review by the District Court

After it decides your case, the ARB must send you a copy of its order by certified mail. If you're not satisfied with the decision, you have the right to appeal to district court. If you choose to go to court, you must start the process by filing a petition within 45 days of the date you receive the ARB's order. If the appraisal district has appraised your property at \$1,000,000 or more, you must file a notice of appeal with the chief appraiser within 15 days of the date you receive the ARB's order.

You can also get a pamphlet describing how to prepare a protest from the appraisal district or from the State Comptroller's Property Tax Division at P.O. Box 13528, Austin, Texas 78711-3528.

Deadline for Filing Protests with the ARB*

Usual Deadline

On or before May 31 (or 30 days after a notice of appraised value was mailed to you, whichever is later).

Late protests are allowed if you miss the ususal deadline for good cause. Good cause is some reason beyond your control, like a medical emergency. The ARB decides whether you have good cause.

Late protests are due the day before the appraisal review board approves records for the year. Contact your appraisal district for more information.

Special Deadlines

For change of use (the appraisal district informed you that you are losing agricultural appraisal because you changed the use of your land), the deadline is before the 30th day after the notice of the determination was mailed to you.

For ARB changes (the ARB has informed you of a change that increases your tax liability and the change didn't result from a protest you filed), the deadline is before the 30th day after the notice of the determination was mailed to you.

If you believe the apprisal district or ARB should have sent you a notice and did not, you may file a protest until the day before taxes become delinquent (usually February 1). The ARB decides whether it will hear your case based on evidence about whether a required notice was mailed to you.

*The deadline is postponed to the next business day if it falls on a weekend or holiday.

book is early in one's 4-H career - just ask parents of 4-H'ers who have waited several years. However, it's not impossible to put together a quality book later on - but some information will invariably be lost over time if it's not written down.

Why have record books? They are invaluable when it comes time to apply for any scholarship - 4-H or non4-H, college applications, resumes and job applications, and simply for the sense of self-satisfaction youth receive from seeing what they have accomplished. They are also used to determine major awards such as Gold Star, for which they are a state requirement. Record books help keep track of a 4-H career and help a 4-H'er become a well-rounded individual. The emphasis in record books is not on what someone has won, but rather the depth and growth of project work, leadership roles and citizenship efforts.

Record books used to be extremely difficult to put together, but with computers, they're quite simpleif you start early in the 4-H member's career. Record books can really bring a family together, as it takes everyone to work on keeping records, taking photos and keeping the books updated. However, the computer-generated forms are easy to use for most of our junior "computer whizzes" today, and the senior 4-H members going to state this year work on their own books on the computer with a little guidance and prodding from their parents.For more information on 4-H record books and how your child can get started, contact the Crockett County Extension Office at 392-2721. ing American children are gaining about a half-pound more per year than obesity is closely related to a number of chronic diseases, you may need to "Just Say No" to habits that cause healthy eating and exercise habits.

You don't have to deprive your children or put them on a strict diet here are a few simple ideas for health-

-Say NO to those second helpings and extra bites. An extra 100 calories a day over what a child needs to grow normally (or an adult needs to maintain his/her weight), can result in an extra 10 pounds in one year. Weekly Drilling and Completion Report

Primal Energy Co. has posted first production reports for the No. 6 Laura Hoover Estate "38", located about 30 miles southwest of Ozona in Crockett County's American Field. It flowed at the rate of 196,000-CFD on a 1.25-in. choke and earned a 216,000-CFD evuation on absolute open flow. With total depth of 7,500, the developmental well will produce from a Canyon Formation interval, 6,840 to 7,310 feet into the wellbore.

The No. 10H Couch has been brought on line about 10.9 miles southwest of Ozona in Crockett County's West Hunt-Baggett Field with Union Pacific Resources Corp. as the operator. The new gasser was rated at 696,000-CFD on absolute open flow and showed ability to yield 677,000-CFD on a 1.25-in choke. It probed to 12,879 feet total depth and was perforated for Strawn Formation pay, 9,580 to 12,620 feet into the hole.

The same operator has posted first production data for the No. 5 McMullan "A" about nine and a half miles southeast of Ozona in Crockett County's Davidson Ranch Field. It flowed 582,000-CFD on a 1-in choke and was rated at 754,000-CFD on absolute open flow. The well was drilled a total of 9,300 feet with plugback to 8,434 and will produce from 7,900 to 8,286 feet into the wellbore.

Crockett County's Hunt-Baggett Field gained a new producer when the No. 1 Baggett "C" was completed about 11 miles south-southeast of Ozona by Sonat Exploration Co., the operator. The well flowed 1,888,000-CFD on a 1.5-in. choke and earned a 5,889,000-CFD evaluation on absolute open flow. It probed to a 9,750-ft. bottom and will produce from 9,362 to 9,555 feet into the hole in the Strawn Formation.

The same operator recently completed the No. 2 Jack Riggs "30" about 12 miles southeast of Ozona, also in Crockett County's Hunt-Baggett Field. With total depth of 9,800 feet, it flowed at the rate of 425,000-CFD on a 1-in. choke and was rated at 546,000-CFD on aboslute open flow. Sonat perforated the well for Strawn Formation pay, 9,362 to 9,588 feet into the hole.

Sonat gave up on its efforts to make a producer out of the No. 2902 Signal Baggett, located about 11 miles south-southeast of Ozona in the GC&SF Survey A-2404. Spudded on March 7, it probed to 9,533 feet total depth with no commercial prospects.

Flowing 719,000 CF gas per day on a 1.25-in. choke the No. 1 R. B. McMullen "A" has been completed in the Davidson Ranch Field 11.6 miles southeast of Ozona. Parker and Parsley Development is the operator. The well was evaluated at 751,000 CFD on open flow. It was taken to total depth of 9,250 feet and was perforated for Pennsylvanian Era Pay ranging from 7,654 to 9,042 feet into the wellbore.

Union Pacific Resources is preparing to make hole for three 8,200-ft. developmental wells in the Ozona Field. The tests will be known as the Nos. 1 and 2 Meadows Ranch "9" and No. 2 Meadows Ranch "2". The first two wells are in a 548-acre lease 5.7 miles southwest of Ozona. The third well is in a 648-acre lease five miles southwest of Ozona. The first two wells are in the D&SERR Survey A-2013, while the third is in the same 🦋

The No. 8 C. Childress has been completed in the Ozona Field 23 miles southwest of Ozona with Union Pacific Resources as the operator. It flowed 105,000 CF gas per day on a 1-in. choke and was assigned a 112,000-CFD rating on absolute open flow. Union Pacific bottomed the hole at 6,600 feet. Production is in the Canyon Sand 6,216 to 6,224 feet into the wellbore.

The Davidson Ranch Field will see more developmental action when Union Pacific Resources starts making hole for the No. 1712 Davidson 6.3 miles southeast of Ozona. The projected 8,300-ft. test is in a 1,009-acre lease in Crockett County's GC&SFRR Survey A-3124.



Prior to submitting its proposal the bidder is required to visit the site of the proposed work and become familiar with any conditions which may in any manner affect the work to be done or affect the equipment materials and labor required. The bidder is also required to examine carefully the drawings and specifications and be thoroughly informed regarding any and all conditions and requiremnts that may in any manner affect the work to be performed under the contract. The successful bidder shall indemnify and save Crockett County harmless from any and all claims, liability, losses and causes of action which may arise out of the fulfillment of the Agreement. The vendor shall furnish Crockett County Procurement Management Division Certificates of Insurance which indicates that insurance coverage has been obtained for Workmen's Compensation Insurance, Public Liability Insurance on a comprehensive basis in an amount not less than \$1,000,000, and Automobile Liability Insurance covering all owned, non-owned and hired vehicles used in connection with the work in an amount not less than \$5000,000.

SECTION 2.0 - TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS

SCOPE AND LOCATION

The work to be performed under the terms and conditions of this contract shall consist of furnishing all labor, tranportation, equipment and supplies required to produce mulch from yard waste supplied by Crockett County. The process shall involve grinding of yard waste for volume reduction. Vendor shall be required to provide yard waste grinding services at two locations. The first location is an area north of the town of Ozona. The finished production at this location shall be a shredded product of fine fragments accomplished with a single pass through the grinding equipment. The second location is next to the cemetery located south of the town of Ozona. The waste at this location must first be a shredder product with a large portion of large, course fragments then further reduced to fine fragments with a second pass through the grinding equipment. Waste from this location shall be removed by Crockett County for disposal at the first location.

The successful bidder must be able to process such material that will normally shred in yard waste grinding equipment and remove and stack for disposal by Crockett County, such material as found in the waste stream which cannot be ground, and, or may be oversized. Oversized materials shall be deemed to be any tree trunk, or formed timber over 12" in diameter.

The successful bidder shall process all grindable waste, removing contaminates and oversized as possible by the use of mechnical loading equipment. Any contaminates or oversized materials removed from the yard waste will be piled in a place separate from the finished reduced materials for disposal by Crockett County. 
