Early Voting Starts July 21

ance in the Aug. 9 special election another qualified homestead for perbegins July 21 at the county courthouse. The proposed constitutional amendment would increase the school property tax residence homestead through Friday July 21 through Aug. 5 exemption from \$5,000 to \$15,000. The amendment would also authorize the Legislature to limit all or part of the exemption to political subdivisions that are the principal providers of elementary and secondary education within their boundaries.

In addition, the amendment would authorize the Legislature to allow the transfer of all or part of the age 65and-over tax freeze to another homestead. Specifically, the Legislature would be authorized to provide that the current limitation against increasing school property taxes on the resident homesteads of persons age 65 or older, or their surviving spouse who is eligible to receive the exemption, may be transferred if the person establishes a different residence homestead.


The amendment would also allow the \$10,000 additional amount for the standard exemption to be used to lower the tax rate of persons currently receiving the 65-and-over tax freeze. Specifically, for a homestead affected by this limitation in 1996 or in an earlier tax year, the Legislature must provide for a reduction in the school property tax limitation in the 1997 tax year and subsequent tax years in an amount equal to \$10,000 multiplied by the 1997 school property tax rate. The proposed amendment appears

on the ballot as follows:

"The constitutional amendment providing school property tax relief by increasing the residence homestead exemption by \$10,000 and providing

AUSTIN — Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills, the Texas Education Agency's first major public school curriculum-revising proposal in a decade, has drawn the support of many top educators and barbs from others.

State Board of Education member Donna Ballard and conservative groups including the Texas Eagle Forum, American Family Association and Texas Christian Coalition have criticized the proposal, questioning whether the standards are adequately rigorous.

Education Commissioner Mike Moses, who called a news conference to answer critics, said the standards already have undergone many revisions to address earlier concerns of conservatives.

Ballard, in an opinion column published in several newspapers, called for another set of standards with "intensive systematic phonics; increasingly rigorous grammar instruction; and grounding in classical reading beginning in the second grade." In her published column Ballard also criticized Gov. George W. Bush for endorsing the proposal.

Bush Questions Man's Hiring

Gov. Bush last week questioned Land Commissioner Garry Mauro's decision to put a one-time campaign contributor convicted of bank fraud on the state payroll.

a challenge to Bush's re-election, has hired former Austin banker Ruben Johnson at \$61,343 a year to help direct a \$52 million state construction project to build nursing homes for veterans.

"I'm confident this person would not have been appointed in my administration. I would be concerned about putting a person who was indicted and convicted of a construction issue in charge of a construction project," Bush said.

Mauro spokesman Joe Cutbirth defended Mauro's decision, saying, "I hope that doesn't mean that George Bush doesn't believe in giving people a second chance."

Early Voting Starts July 21

Early voting for the Aug. 9 election, in which voters will decide whether to use the state's \$1 billion surplus to cut school property taxes, begins July 21 and extends through Aug. 5.

If the constitutional amendment passes, homestead exemptions will increase from \$5,000 to \$15,000, reducing school property taxes by an average of \$140 per year. Also, senior citizens who sell their homes would be able to transfer their tax freeze to a new property.

The tax measure is the only constitutional amendment on the Aug. 9 ballot. Fourteen other proposed amendments will go before voters on Nov. 4.

Gov. Bush plans to go on the road before the Aug. 9 election to stump for the school-tax rollback, saying he wants to be sure Texans know about the measure and ratify

"I'm confident that with a reasonable turnout it will pass. Very few people should be against it," he said.

Gramm Wants Fire Ant Panel

U.S. Sen. Phil Gramm has renewed his call for the creation of a national advisory commission to battle Brazilian fire ants.

Speaking in Kerrville, Gramm described the imported fire ants as "the worst insect infestation we are Mauro, who is contemplating experiencing today in the United

Fire ants accounted for \$2 billion in damage nationally last year and \$300 million in Texas alone, said Gramm, R-Texas.

With a budget of \$3 million annually for two years, the advisory commission would select research programs that show the most

The commission then would seek competition among research organizations and decide which two have the most effective plan to carry out the eradication. Those two would then be funded for an additional five years at a total of \$6 million a year.

■ State Rep. L.P. "Pete" Patterson, D-Brookston, said he will retire from the Texas House after 20 years and announce his candidacy for state agriculture commissioner "in the near future." Incumbent commissioner Rick Perry, a Republican, is running for lieutenant gov-

■ Texas Attorney General Dan Morales, 41, and the former Christine Glenn, 28, of Abilene were married on the Fourth of July weekend at his parents' San Antonio home. Glenn was a TV weather reporter in Abilene. About two dozen relatives attended the family-only wedding. Before the ceremony, the bride, groom, minister and some of the brothers played basketball and swam.


■ Thirty-six persons lost their lives on Texas roads and highways during the long Independence Day holiday weekend, the Department of Public Safety announced. Spokesman Mike Cox said the DPS had predicted 36 deaths for the 78hour reporting period. Sixteen people were killed during last year's Fourth of July holiday in a 30-hour reporting period.

■ State Comptroller John Sharp, who is seeking the Democratic nomination for lieutenant governor, announced in Corpus Christi that he had been endorsed by 60 county judges and commissioners from South Texas.

Madye's, Inc. may have ended with its purchase by R. G. Barry Corp. in 1967, but the renown company with Ozona roots has never been forgotten Fields in Chicago and I Magnin of here. Many who loved the scuffs made by the company owned by Madye Bailey will have a chance to own a piece of West Texas history when the remaining shoes are sold by Mrs. Bailey's grandson, John Green, here July 19 at the Bailey home on 11th Street.

Mrs. T. A. (Madye) Bailey began by making scuffs as Christmas gifts in 1945 at her ranch home near Sanderson. The little bits of "fluff stuff", made by Mrs. Bailey and her daughter, Madye Jo Bailey Green, were so popular that they filled many second requests. There were no plans to become a business, but at the urging of friends and with a drought as the incentive to make extra money, the two decided to make a dozen samples to take to Fort Worth to try to sell to the

As the story goes, Madye Jo was shopping for a dress to wear to her sales appointment when she mentioned the shoes to the sales girl who was assisting her. The young woman called the store's buyer, and he asked to see her samples. Madye Jo had to go to an aunt's home in Fort Worth to get the shoes, and after seeing them, he gave her an order for 144 pair.

After the initial sales success, scuffs, fabric trims, flowers, clothing samples of Mrs. Bailey's designs were sent to a few places, and among the first order were stores in San Antonio, Houston and San Angelo.

The first shoes were made from scraps of evening dress material. Getting supplies such as rhinestones and sequins was difficult because of the war, and an aunt who was a buyer for a Fort Worth department store sent 306 everything she could get. Once when the supply of French sequins ran out, Mrs. Bailey's sister, Mrs. R. E. Austin, saved the day. In 1924, she had been a princess in a fat stock show. Her princess gown, which had a long train heavily embellished with sequins, bugle beads and faux pearls, became the source for the decorative items for the shoes.

In 1947, Mr. and Mrs. Bailey moved to Ozona where she set up shop. By the next year, the job was too big for two people. In March, Mrs. Bailey opened a factory called The Twinkle Toe Shop with six employees. By August, they had 12 employees and 14 accounts and hired their first sales representative. The next year, they moved into larger quarters and changed the name to the Bailey Shoe Co. after learning that Twinkle Toe was the name of another firm. They hired two more representatives and got the Neiman-Marcus and Marshall Field accounts.

The business moved to San Angelo in 1950. The factory there was established in the old Lyric Theatre building. By then, the company was selling thousands of scuffs in 40 designs and approximately 85 colors. With 10 representatives covering almost every state and sales in Can-

rian Port City," is the city of my birth, a beautiful place about two-thirds up the western side of the state, right on Lake Michigan. The tall-forested in the early 1830's, and the town grew up on both sides of the Manistee River. The setting was perfect, as lumberiacks cut and floated logs from far upstream to the Manistee Lake and the lumber mills there. The lumbering industry lasted over a hundred years, but most of the logs that are cut now are taken to the paper mill. The reforestation program has been in place a long time; an admirable plan as well as a necessary one.

The river continues to be an important part of transportation. The two drawbridges linking the north and south sides of the city are raised several times a day, halting traffic while a freighter comes in or goes out, carrying goods and supplies. A lot of salt is exported by the three salt companies there. Whenever a sailboat needs to pass from Manistee Lake to Lake Michigan, or back, all traffic waits again. These interruptions are taken in stride in any port city. A lot of the sailboats prefer to dock at the City Marina, which is right downtown near the first bridge on the Lake Michigan end of the river.

When we left for Texas on the first day of 1981 the population was 9,000. A few years later hard times pulled 2,000 jobs away, and now the city of Manistee's latest recorded population is 6,968, according to the chamber of commerce director Phyllis Hanna, who is a dear friend. She said that in the early 1980's it was really a depressed area-folks were losing jobs right and left. She figured the turning point came about 1986 when the city fathers decided all the weeping was done, and it was time to start thinking of what could stop the downward trend. The chamber of commerce really got things moving with a positive attitude by pointing out what Manistee has, not what it had. Well, you should see what this attitude has produced. The city is beautiful and growing, emphasizing the tourism, natural resources and industry of this

part of the state. The downtown area is truly Victorian" with its 1880's buildings, a lot of which are on the State or the National Historic Register. The business owners have refurbished where needed, and painted the buildings in grand style. The homeowners have done the same, and the whole town has taken on a new look, and a new pride as well. The city has built condominiums close to Lake Michigan, with boating channels up to them. This resort area is busy all the time, and has been a big plus for Manistee's imageand economy. People come from all over to visit this renowned city-the chamber of commerce has done its job well. Phyllis told me that this week Texaco is going to shoot a commercial downtown. This is the third commercial to use the beautiful setting of Manistee for promoting their wares.

Most of Manistee was destroyed in the great fire of 1871-the same day

> The Ramsdell Theatre Building, completed in 1903, has its place on the National Historic Register. We attended the play "Gershwin at the Ramsdell" while we were there, and took in the tour of the structure, led by a talented, enthusiastic singer/actress whom we admired in the play. The music was stirring, and the surroundings elegant. We have attended many plays there, visiting with James Earl Jones in the 1970's. He grew up about 30 miles from Manistee.

> The city has built a River Walk that extends from the chamber of commerce about a mile right out to Lake Michigan. It is a lovely walk, with ducks all along. We threw some pieces of bread out to them one day, and they put on quite a show. The City Marina is along the River Walk, right downtown, and it is always busy. Just the day before we left there was a cruise ship from Canada docked with 100 passengers spending the day. Phyllis met them, all dressed up in her Victorian costume, complete with lace gloves and a hat, to welcome them to the "Victorian Port City." She was pleased they had the whole day, as usually the cruise ships spend just a few hours.

The city has planted flowers all along US 31 as it winds through the south side of Manistee. An impressive welcome to town, they flourish next to the curb, on both sides of the street, and need little tending due to the frequent rain.

The blue water of Lake Michigan tantalizes fishermen, and the parking lot reveals the number of hopefuls. The Sea Gulls, trying to get a nap, squawk at being disturbed. The fine sand gets in our shoes and goes home with us, wanted or not. The fog horn blows from the lighthouse, adding its punctuation. Folks line up on the pier, fishing pole toward the water, sometimes lucky. They're enjoying the soft sea breeze, whilling away the time, taking full advantage of a pleasant day. An afternoon at the beach affords diverse amenities that we had nearly forgotten, but which pull at our memory like an under-tow. We stayed there by the lake for awhile, remembering days gone by, re-discovering the flavor of the Port City, feeling a familiar kinship with this place, but seeing it with a different perspective. We love what they have done here. As the sun sinks into Lake Michigan, we marvel again at the beauty and peacefulness of this place we came from, glad to know we can return to visit this charming "Victorian Port City" 1,500 miles from home. 

Lengthy Agenda For Commissioners Court

Commissioners traveled to Big Lake Monday night to discuss a waste disposal contract with the Big Lake City Council. They are searching for a receiving point for the trash which is being left at their recycling center on 14th Street and will also look into the possibility of taking the material to Eldorado.

The Big Lake trip ended a full meeting day during which the court reviewed a preliminary budget for 1998. Budget figures on the "wish list" show a 1.4 million dollar inanother session soon to whittle away

Court members approved helping Crockett County Water District with water well fencing projects by allowing inmates from Fort Stockton to work on the fencing. Water works personnel are to drill the post holes with county equipment, and the prisoners will set the posts and stretch the chain link fence.

Approval was given for purchase of a lowboy trailer for the road department at a cost of \$8,000. The purchase will be made from the state. Under a new state program, the county can make direct purchases before items go to auction. Eddie Moore, road and parks superintendent, was asked to look into what other equipment the state has to offer.

A proposal was approved to obtain uniforms for road, parks, cemetery and maintenance employees with the employees to pay half the cost through payroll deductions. Commissioner Fred Deaton voted against the

Commissioners also approved purchase of a new power unit for the fire department's jaws of life. Bids were opened to rent a tub grinder using grant money. Low bidder Austin Wood was approved at \$16,795. The grant amount is for \$17,500, and the two other bids received were in excess

of \$25,000. Sheriff Shane Fenton reported 79 calls, 49 prisoners jailed and \$1620 in Justice of the Peace fines received during June. The county also received \$710 in out-of-county Justice of the Peace fines. There were 23 civil papers served by his office during the

month. Commissioners approved the sheriff's request for a county credit

sheriff's request for a drug dog on a future agenda. Letters sent out by Fenton have resulted in \$2675 in donations for the dog.

An interlocal agreement (with modifications to be added) with the City of San Angelo which would bring a drug task force officer to Ozona was approved by the court on a three-two vote. Judge Jeff Sutton and commissioners Rudy Martinez and Frank Tambunga approved the motion. Commissioners Fred Nicks and Fred crease, and court members will have Deaton voted against. Deaton has expressed concern regarding portions of the agreement.

County Attorney Bill Mason said he is comfortable with the agreement and that the county can back out at any





Medicare Beneficiaries

Medicare beneficiaries with limited income but who are not poor enough to quality for Medicaid should be aware of the help available from two Medicare programs, according to Frank Upp, Social Security manager in San Angelo. "These programs - the Oualified Medicare Beneficiary Program and the Specified Low-Income Medicare Beneficiary Program - are designed to make Medicare available to people who have problems paying the Medicare premiums and out-ofpocket medical expenses," Upp said.

The Qualified Medicare Beneficiary Program is available to people who are below the federal poverty guideline. People who qualify may get help in paying the deductibles, copayments and other out-of-pocket medical expenses. A single M beneficiary may qualify if his/her income is less than \$678 per month. A couple may qualify if their combined son is entitled to protest this application. Affected persons include owners of monthly income is less than \$905.

sure not to wait too long to put out Oftanol granular Diazinon and water it in. While treating for the grubs, you will also take care of any other lawn pests, such as fleas,



ticks and ants. Remember for the grubs it will take a follow-up treatment 30-45 days from the first application.

If you use a midsummer fertilizer, be sure to water in thoroughly. Most fertilizer damaged lawns happen because of improper or inadequate watering. The partially wet nitrogen will stay in contact with the leaf and burn it. Also, fertilizers will increase the growth rate of your grass for a few weeks, so be sure to increase slightly your watering to keep up with the new growth. Aphids start to show up in greater numbers in the summer. They can be found on pecan trees, (makes that sticky honeydew mess) roses, ash trees, even vinca groundcover. It will take some occasional leaf inspections to verify if you have the little critters There are a number of insecticides we can use, it all depends on what plant system we have the problems.

Last but not least, if you have St. Augustine lawns, be sure and keep a close eye out for fungus problems such as brown patch and dollar spot. It is always a good idea to treat regularly during the summer with a preventative fungus application in liquid or granular. The granular is usually easier and the most popular in the summer. We spend less time out in the heat.
