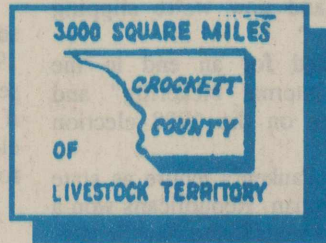

## Rodeo, Crockett Festival This Weekend

Ozona Lions Club Youth Rodeo contestants will be ready to put on a good show for the audience Friday and Saturday nights beginning at 7 p.m. In a break from tradition, the rodeo dance will be held on Friday night instead of Saturday this year. Sponsored by Ozona Chamber of Commerce, the dance will be at the fairgrounds pavilion beginning at 9 p.m.

The rodeo parade has been changed from Friday to Saturday and will begin at 5:30 p.m. at the convention center. Floats, horseback and bicycle riders will entertain. Among those in the parade will be several descendants of David Crockett here for the annual festival.

A big day is planned for Saturday on the square during the David Crockett Birthday Festival. Descendants of the county's namesake will be honored with a reception at the Crockett Room at 2 p.m.

The big lawnmower race begins at 9 a.m. This is the first year for this event to be held on the square, and the competition should be fierce.

Games and contests planned for the day begin at 10 a.m. Included will be the best decorated bicycle, tricycle and wagon contest, tortilla throw, egg toss, hula hoop contest, balloon toss

and watermelon seed spitting contest. Washer and horseshoe pitching contests begin at 1 p.m.

Chalk artists will compete with their sidewalk drawings at 3 p.m.

Names of entrants for the cake decorating contest should be in the chamber office by noon on Friday. The actual cakes will be received at the chamber office between 9 and 10 a.m. Saturday. Cakes will be auctioned to benefit the chamber.

Live music and entertainment is planned from 10:30 a.m. until 5 p.m. at the gazebo.

No festival is complete without a reunion. The OHS Class of 1977 will be in town for the weekend, and they are expected at the square during the noon hour Saturday.

### Early Voting Ends Aug. 5

Early voting election judge Jean Conner said Tuesday afternoon that 57 persons had voted by personal appearance in the constitutional amendment election. Two other ballots had been mailed.

The amendment, if it passes, will increase the school property tax residence homestead exemption from \$5,000 to \$15,000.

Election day is Aug. 9. Early voting ends Aug. 5.

### School Registration Begins Aug. 5

Student registration begins on Tuesday, Aug. 5, for approximately 975 students who will be attending Ozona Public Schools this year. Classes registering on that day include prekindergarten, third and sixth grade students and students who are new to the district and who will be enrolling in high school.

Registration dates and times for Ozona High School are: seniors - Aug. 6 from 8 a.m. until noon; juniors - Aug. 6 from 1 until 5 p.m.; sophomores - Aug. 7 from 8 a.m. until noon; and freshmen - Aug. 7 from 1 until 5 p.m. Students who are new to the district and who will be enrolling in high school will register on Tuesday, Aug. 5, from 1 until 5 p.m.

At Ozona Middle School, registration dates and times are: sixth grade - Aug. 5 from 9 a.m. until noon; seventh grade - Aug. 6 from 9 a.m. until noon; and eighth grade - Aug. 7 from 9 a.m. until noon.

Ozona Intermediate School will register students according to the following schedule: third grade - Aug. 5 from 9 a.m. until noon; fourth grade - Aug. 6 from 9 a.m. until noon; and fifth grade - Aug. 7 from 9 a.m. until noon.

The schedule for registering students in Ozona Primary School is: prekindergarten - Aug. 5 from 1 until 4 p.m.; kindergarten - Aug. 6 from 8 a.m. until noon; first grade - Aug. 6 from 1 until 4 p.m.; and second grade - Aug. 7 from 8 a.m. until noon.

Late registration for all students enrolling in Ozona Public Schools is Aug. 8 from 9 a.m. until noon.

To be eligible for enrollment in prekindergarten, a child must be at least four years of age and must be unable to speak or understand the English language or from a family whose income is at or below sustenance level, as determined by applying the formula used to qualify students for free or reduced-price lunches under the national school lunch program.

Parents of kindergarten students are reminded that even though their children participated in the screening clinic that was held last April in Ozona Primary School, it will still be necessary to enroll them in kindergarten.

### Jacoby Named Dean At Washington State

Dr. Pete W. Jacoby Jr. of North Platte, NB, has been named associate dean for the College of Agriculture and Home Economics at Washington State University beginning Sept. 15. In this position, Jacoby will assist the dean in all phases of college administration and will provide leadership for planning, implementing and evaluating programs of instruction, research and extension. He will also play a critical leadership role in advancing a funding enhancement initiative and a 10 year plan of major facilities' expansion and renewal.

Jacoby is a 1962 graduate of Ozona High School and was active in 4-H where he was awarded local, state and national honors based on livestock projects and judging team activities. He earned a B. S. in range management from Texas A&M in 1966 and a M. S. and Ph.D. in range management from the University of Wyoming in 1968 and 1971, respectively.

He served as Area Extension Range Specialist for West Texas from 1971 to 1974 while headquartered in Fort Stockton. Jacoby also served as State Range Specialist for the University of Arizona before returning to Vernon, TX, in late 1976. He headed a research project focused on mesquite control measures for 16 years before being named interim resident director of the Texas A&M Research

and Extension Center at Vernon. Jacoby has been director of the University of Nebraska's West Central Research and Extension Center since 1993.

Jacoby and his wife, Pattie, have sons living in Canyon, TX, and Silverton, CO. He is a son of Pete and Jimmie Jacoby of Ozona and a grandson of Hazel McDaniel, a resident of the Crockett County Care Center.

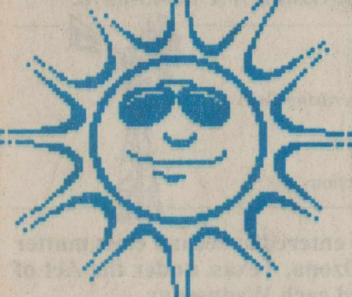

Perry Brothers has over \$14.5 million in inventory in its stores and warehouse. The company will empty its distribution center by shipping newly received merchandise to its stores.

Perry Brothers has retained the Ozer Group, a team of liquidation specialists, to aid in the disposition of its inventory, and other matters.

According to Alan Rosen of the Ozer Group, "This is an excellent opportunity for the public to save a significant amount of money on a wide

range of products, just in time for back-to-school shopping and early holiday gift purchases. Perry Brothers offers a wide range of products for everyday use, so people can stock up now and save. We anticipate the inventory will sell through quickly."

Perry Brothers, Inc. began in 1914 when Frank Perry acquired Newton's 5 & 10 cent variety store in Center, Texas. Through hard work, thrift, and common-sense business practices, Perry and his brothers grew the business throughout the 1910's and 20's, weathered the Depression, and began to expand aggressively following World War II. The firm moved its offices to Lufkin and constructed a modern corporate headquarters, distribution center, and trucking fleet to service its growing retail enterprise. Today, there are over 100 Perrys store locations throughout Texas and New Mexico.

## State Capital

AUSTIN — Early voting for the Aug. 9 constitutional amendment election began July 21 and runs through Aug. 5.

A low turnout at the polls is expected but Gov. George W. Bush and Secretary of State Tony Garza are touring the state, doing their best to urge Texas' 11 million registered voters to get out and vote.

It's a challenge to interest the electorate in a ballot that has no candidates on it.

"Constitutional elections are uphill battles in terms of getting people out to vote," said Garza, the state's top elections official.

On the ballot is a single yes or no question for voters to answer: whether homestead property tax exemptions should be increased from a minimum of \$5,000 to a minimum of \$15,000.

Ann McGeehan, elections director for Garza, estimated that the turnout would be about 10 to 15 percent of the state's registered voters.

Should the tax exemption amendment pass, the state will lose about \$1 billion in revenue.

In the long run, however, the exemptions may cause school districts to lose more and more money as property tax rates and appraised values continue to increase.

Meanwhile, lawmakers will have to find ways to compensate for the lost revenue in the state budget over

the next two years.

**Gingrich Episodes Pique Pauken**  
Texas Republican Party Chairman Tom Pauken said the recent, failed attempt to oust U.S. House Speaker Newt Gingrich hurt the GOP image.

Pauken, who stepped down from his post last week to seek his party's nomination for the office of state attorney general, said, "The timing was terrible."

"I think there's a frustration on the part of a lot of Republicans at the grassroots level ... a feeling we were so close to winning a majority and now we're slipping backwards."

He called for an end to the party's "internal bickering" and concentrate on the 1998 election cycle.

During Pauken's tenure as state GOP chairman, Republicans won a majority of seats in the state Senate, swept all statewide offices on the 1996 ballot and won majorities on the Texas Supreme Court, Court of Criminal Appeals, state Board of Education and the Texas Railroad Commission.

**Raymond Seeks Land Office**  
State Rep. Richard Raymond, D-Benavides, last week became the only Democrat to formally enter the race for land commissioner.

Incumbent Garry Mauro, who is considering a race for governor, hasn't announced his plans. Three Republicans already are in the race: Secretary of State Tony Garza, Sen. Jerry Patterson of Pasadena and Tim Turner of Houston.

Raymond, 36, a former special assistant to U.S. Sen. Lloyd Bentsen, D-Texas and U.S. Sen. Paul Simon, D-Ill. is serving his third term in the Texas House.

He spent 30 months as Mauro's executive assistant and in 1990 managed Bob Krueger's successful campaign for Texas Railroad Commissioner.

Raymond outlined a four-point plan for the General Land Office:

- Expanding college opportunities for Texas veterans at no additional cost to the state.
- Developing partnerships with

communities to make the most efficient use of underutilized state land.

■ Ensuring that Texas public beaches remain public by passing a constitutional amendment banning private ownership of beaches.

■ Continuing to preserve and protect Texas public lands.

**Holzheuser Is RRC Candidate**  
State Rep. Steve Holzheuser last week told *The Victoria Advocate* he will seek the Republican nomination to succeed Barry Williamson on the Texas Railroad Commission.

Holzheuser, who has represented House District 30 since 1985, said last month he would seek the commission post only if Williamson did not seek reelection. Williamson has announced for attorney general.

**State Settles With Testing Firm**  
Texas Attorney General Dan Morales and lawyers for a now-defunct emissions testing firm settled a 1995 lawsuit last week.

Taxpayers will have to pay the \$140 million settlement. The money will come from the state's general fund beginning Aug. 31 with a \$70 million payment.

Tejas Testing Technologies, which spent millions of dollars setting up inspection stations in designated urban areas, filed the lawsuit after the state curtailed the firm's seven-year auto emissions testing program.

Federal officials had ordered the program, but state lawmakers killed Tejas' contract after drivers complained about the cost. The state then established another testing program.

**Life Sentences for Drug Makers**

People who manufacture methamphetamine, also known as speed, could be sentenced to prison for life under a proposal by U.S. Rep. Pete Sessions, R-Dallas.

The freshman congressman said he will introduce legislation within the next few weeks that would impose a mandatory life sentence for anyone found guilty of manufacturing the drug. Currently the minimum sentence is five years in prison.

## Crockett County Cook-of-the-Week



Dean Stroud--Cook-of-the Week

### Someone's In The Kitchen

Cook of the Week Dean Stroud never intended to become a cook at all. "I was going to be a lawyer and never get married," she said.

Dean and her husband, the late Pete Stroud, moved to Ozona 24 years ago as newlyweds. When her two children, his three children and all the grandchildren got together twice a year in Ozona, Dean really put her considerable cooking talents to work.

"I learned to cook from experience," she says. One of those experiences was with canned biscuits when they first came out. "I bought some and put them in the freezer," Dean remembers. "They didn't cook too well."

The Texas Panhandle eggs recipe doubles well, says Dean. Her chocolate cream pie has coffee for a bit of a different taste, and the squash squares are a good way to use all that yellow squash which is coming in right now. The savory baked beans were a favorite of Pete's, and Dean's Christmas cookies are everyone's favorite.

#### Texas Panhandle Eggs

- 1 lb. breakfast sausage (Owens)
- 2 lb. cheese, shredded (Monterey Jack, cheddar or mozzarella)
- 2 T flour
- 9 eggs (beaten)
- Salt and pepper to taste
- 3 cans (4 oz. size) chopped green chilies
- 1 c. evaporated milk
- 4 or 5 ozs. fresh mushrooms

Sear sausage. Just before removing from skillet, add sliced fresh mushrooms. Cook a bit longer, then drain on paper towels placed on a brown grocery bag.

At this point, if you desire, you may place meat/mushroom mixture in freezer bag and refrigerate until the next morning.

When ready to cook, beat eggs, add salt and pepper, chilies and milk. Place sausage/mushroom mixture in bottom of 9x13 casserole coated with non-stick spray. Sprinkle cheese on top. Pour egg/milk mixture over all. Bake 40 min. in 350 degree oven or until brown.

Serve with biscuits, butter, juice and coffee.

#### Chocolate Cream Pie

- 1 c. sugar
  - 1/2 c. flour
  - 1/2 tsp. salt
  - 1/3 c. cocoa
  - 1/2 c. coffee
  - 2 c. scalded milk
  - 3 egg yolks (beaten)
  - 2 T oleo
  - 1 tsp. vanilla
- Measure and sift flour with salt, sugar and cocoa. Pour coffee into dry ingredients. Mix, add to scalded milk in double boiler. Cook over boiling water until thick. Mixture thickens in about 20 minutes. Add beaten egg yolks and cook three minutes longer. Remove from heat. Blend in oleo and vanilla. Cool. Pour into cooled baked pie shell. Finish with meringue.

#### Squash Squares

- 2 lbs. yellow squash
  - 2 eggs, beaten
  - Salt and pepper to taste
  - 2 T vegetable oil
  - 1/4 c. butter
  - 2 T seasoned bread crumbs
- Peel squash and cut off ends. Slice 1/2" thick. Cook in 1 pint water until tender (20 minutes). Drain very well. Combine squash, eggs, bread crumbs and seasonings. Mix well. Melt 2 T shortening in 1 qt. shallow glass baking dish. Add squash mixture. Cover. Bake 30 minutes in 350 degree oven. Edges should be lightly brown and center well set. Serves 6.

#### Savory Baked Beans

- 1 - 16 oz. can pork and beans
  - 2 T brown sugar
  - 1/4 tsp. dry mustard
  - 1/4 c. catsup
  - 2 slices bacon cut in 1-inch pieces
- Combine ingredients. Bake covered in greased casserole in 350 degree oven 20 minutes. Uncover and continue baking 20 minutes. Serves 4.

#### Dean's Christmas Cookies

- 18 maraschino cherries, chopped
- 1 c. white sugar
- 1 egg
- 1 stick oleo
- 3/4 tsp. vanilla
- 3/4 c. nuts
- 2 c. flour
- 1/2 tsp. soda
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- Cream sugar and oleo. Add egg. Mix well. Add flour, soda and salt mixture 1/2 at a time. Add cherries, vanilla and pecans. Roll in waxed paper and chill. Slice and bake 10 minutes in 350 degree oven.

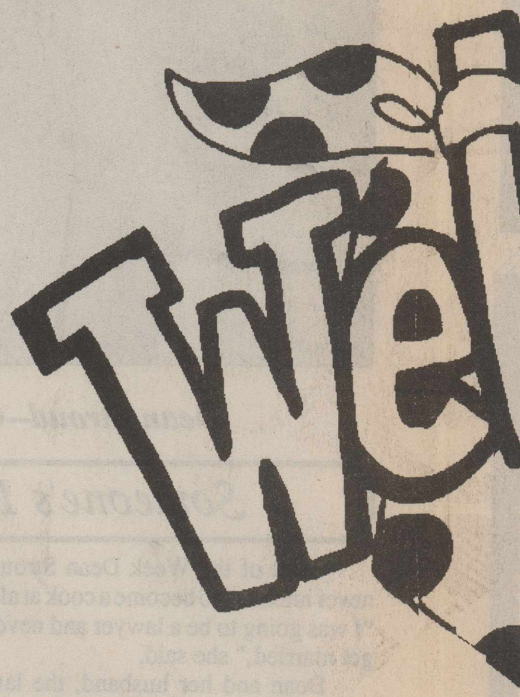

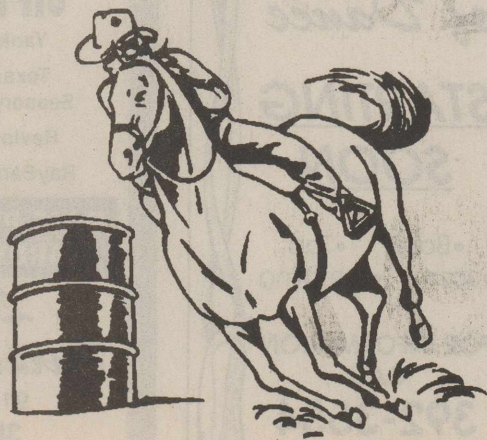

## Museum Notes

from Mary

David Crockett, namesake of our county, was born to humble pioneers, John and Rebeckah, on Aug. 17, 1786, in Greene County, TN. The fifth of nine children, his life was reflective of his childhood, as he learned at an early age that honesty and integrity make a man worth his word. He grew up in a time when schooling was not mandatory, so he managed to stay as far away as possible from the schoolhouse after a scuffle one day with the neighborhood bully. In his teen years, however, he observed from life that education was much more important than he had realized, so he sought help from a neighbor and learned to read.

When David was 20 he married Mary (Polly) Finley, and they had two sons, John and William. Their life was meager, a constant struggle. They grew vegetables on their rented farm, and David hunted for meat for the family. Soon the Creek Indian War broke out, and David felt he had a personal interest in it, as his grandfather, David Crockett, was one of many massacred by irate Creek and Cherokee Indians in 1778. He enlisted and fought under the leadership of General Andrew Jackson.

He returned after the war and worked his farm for about two years. In early 1815, Polly gave birth to their third child, Margaret, whom they called Polly. By the end of the following summer, David's dear wife was dead. He later wrote "Death, that cruel leveller of all distinctions, entered my humble cottage, and tore from my children an affectionate, good mother, and from me, a tender and loving wife." She was buried in Franklin County, TN, in a grave that today is marked by the coarse field stones that were placed there.

Our hero was devastated. He was a rough outdoorsman left with two young sons and an infant daughter for whom he could hardly provide, so he figured the best solution was to look around for another wife. He soon found a young widow, Elizabeth Patton, who had two children, George and Margaret Ann, and also owned a "tidy little farm". They married in the summer of 1816. The following fall he felt the need of more "elbow room" so he went to Alabama to see about settling there, but returned home, and moved the family further west to Lawrence County, TN. He and some friends did a lot of exploring in that new area, and it was during this time he became very ill, some say it was malaria. His friends left him at a nearby house and went home, thinking he would surely die,

but some people tended to him several weeks, and he somewhat regained his strength. A passing wagoner agreed to take him home, where everyone was surprised to see him alive, albeit rather ragged from his ordeal.

It was in Lawrence County that David was appointed justice of the peace on Nov. 25, 1817, and he gave his best. He later stated "I gave my decisions on the principles of common sense, and not on law, learning to guide me; for I had never read a page in a law book all my life." From this early introduction to political life, he was elected for the Tennessee legislature in 1820, and then elected for three terms in Congress. He alluded his successful campaigns to short speeches and funny stories, where some opposing candidates spoke all day, making empty promises and tiring the listeners.

David Crockett lost his fourth bid for a seat in Congress due to a less than fair election, and he became disgusted with politics. His old, familiar wanderlust returned, and he headed west to the new frontier, scouting a place to settle with his family. Upon arriving in Texas he heard of the uprising against Santa Anna and his Mexican army. He and his fellow travelers went to San Antonio to help out, and they died a martyr's death there at the Alamo. You might say he lost that battle, but helped with the war for Texas freedom.

Thank you, David Crockett. We esteem your values, respect your memory and treasure your motto, "Be always sure you're right, then go ahead".

The museum welcomes the descendants of David Crockett who come from near and far to help us celebrate the birthday of their illustrious ancestor on Saturday, Aug. 2. A reception is planned honoring these special folks, and everyone is invited to come in and visit with them. See you there...

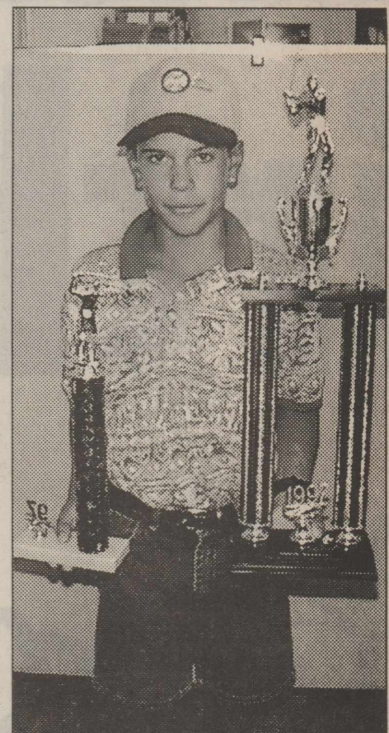
## Garza Advances To State Golf Tourney

## Ozona Livestock Auction Report

Sonora Livestock Auction held its first stocker and feeder sale on Saturday with a strong showing from three of the strongest buyers in the nation in attendance.

The auction had a good showing of #1 Angus and Angus cross calves weighing 500 to 650 pounds selling from \$82 to \$95 per hundred. One truck load averaged \$92.50 averaging 585 pounds as compared to the other reporting markets the auction was \$2-\$5 higher on the same type cattle. Packer cows sold from \$33 to \$44 per hundred, and slaughter bulls sold from \$45-\$59 per hundred. Some replacement Brangus open heifers which sold from \$62-\$75 per hundred. These heifers lacked the conditioning to

represent a stronger market that is in demand.

In the auction's regular sheep and goat sale, a stronger showing in Angora goats was recorded. Angora bilie kids sold from \$72-\$82 per hundred, and good babytooth nannies sold at \$65-\$75. Thin nannies sold in the medium \$40 range with a few fat slaughter nannies in the high \$50's. Spanish goats continue with a strong weekly market, but show some signs of lower prices for billy kids. Spanish muttons sold strong at \$65-\$75 per hundred with most represented muttons at over hundred pounds. Spanish nannies were steady at \$40-\$50 per hundred. Grown Spanish billies were steady at \$80-\$125 per head.



### Plant Tips from M&R Nursery by: Mike Gasplie

#### How Much To Water?

This is a question often asked this time of year, and to tell you the truth, it's hard to answer. There are no exact rules to follow. For example, I can't tell you to water your yard every 4 days for exactly 20 minutes per station. It could need more or less water. This may be an average to most lawn, but all are different. It takes some observation on the customers part to make sure we are not over or under watering landscaped areas. Some things that make a difference on the frequency or amount of time you water are shade, soil condition, slope of the soil, age of the plant systems and type of plant.



The one thing we notice is that poor soil areas such as clay or caliche tend to be overwatered. They will go out and water on a set schedule without checking to see if the subsurface or root zone areas are wet. Clay soils do not drain well and will retain water if the water is allowed to soak in. One other problem with clay soils is that we will water too fast and the water will drain off. This can under-water areas. The message is to pay attention to see if the areas need to be watered. Water thoroughly and deeply, probably 1 inch of moisture per week. Then do not water until the area dries out enough to show cracking in the top soil area.

Using Gypsum in the tight soil areas such as clay will, through time, loosen up the soil and allow the water to penetrate easier.

Also, disperse sulfur 2-3 times a year to help counter high pH problems. This can tie up iron and other nutrients and some plants will yellow. If you have any questions, please give us a call.

# A Dream Vacation-Texas Tour Down Under

A dream vacation/50th anniversary celebration took Virginia and Perry Hubbard around the world to Australia and New Zealand last month. The two had long wanted to see Australia and had never considered New Zealand, Virginia said, but their travel agent found a way to turn two weeks into three.

Perry's ranching interests made livestock operations in these two countries an important part of the trip for him. The favored sheep in New Zealand are the Romney breed with

coarse wool, Perry said, and the fine-wool Merino are favored in Australia. Bringing more money to producers in these countries than sheep and wool is the raising of deer. While still in the velvet, the antlers are sold to China; the meat is sold to China and Germany, and the hides are sold elsewhere, Perry said.

Many differences exist between livestock operations there and in Texas, Hubbard went on to explain. Some places use hedges for pasture division fences, sheep are vat dipped instead of

sprayed for parasites and trucks and pickups are not like ours. Feeding dogie lambs is the same, however, and Perry demonstrated this on stage at the Agrodome at Rotorua.

A major highlight of the trip for Virginia was attending a Hangi (feast) where they learned of the customs of the Maori people. The Maoris are of Polynesian descent, and after their traditional greeting of guests by touching noses, they sing and dance to entertain at the feast.

Everything was more beautiful

than she expected, Virginia said. Glaciers, boat trips, waterfalls, snow-capped mountains and a rainforest with tree ferns higher than a house were inspiring to the travelers and resulted in many wonderful photographs.

The reported 300 inches of rainfall a year in the New Zealand rainforest is hard to imagine, but the vegetation was testimony to the accuracy of the measurement.

The only native animals they saw were caged, said the Hubbards. They did have the fun of handfeeding kangaroos and "some of the most beautiful birds you ever saw". A night trip took the Hubbards and their tour group to see penguins come out of the water.

Queen Victoria Market, a huge open air market in Melbourne, the glow worms of Waitomo Caves where visitors ride in boats through the caves, Shantytown, a reconstructed gold mining town at Greymouth, and a jade factory were among the special stops on the trip.

The Hubbards arrived in Auckland, New Zealand June 1. Sightseeing in the area included tours of Christchurch, Mount Cook and Twizel. The Upper Waitaki Power Scheme was described by the Hubbards as a wonderful power system fueled by water. The road took them along Lake Pukaki toward the heart of the Southern Alps and Mount Cook, the largest peak in Australasia.

On they went to Dunedin, often called the Edinburgh of the South, with its nearby Tasman Glacier. At Queenstown they saw the Glacier of Fox and Franz Josef which stretches from high in the Southern Alps to near sea level. A gondola ride to the heights and a meal at the restaurant there provided opportunities to enjoy the magnificent scenery.

At Picton they boarded the Inter Island ferry to Wellington, the capital city.

In Australia, the Hubbards visited the cities of Melbourne, Canberra, the Federal Capital, with its underground government offices, and Sydney. Australia is preparing to host the Olympics in the year 2000, and a large parade relating to the Olympics was one of the sights they enjoyed.

Everywhere they went everything was very clean, said the Hubbards. Gardens, residential yards and streets all impressed the Texans with their cleanliness.

Their actual 50th anniversary was spent in an airport trying to get and waiting for an alternate flight because their itinerary had the wrong departure time that day, Perry said. Otherwise, the entire trip couldn't have been more perfect. "We never lost any luggage and there were no flight delays to speak of."

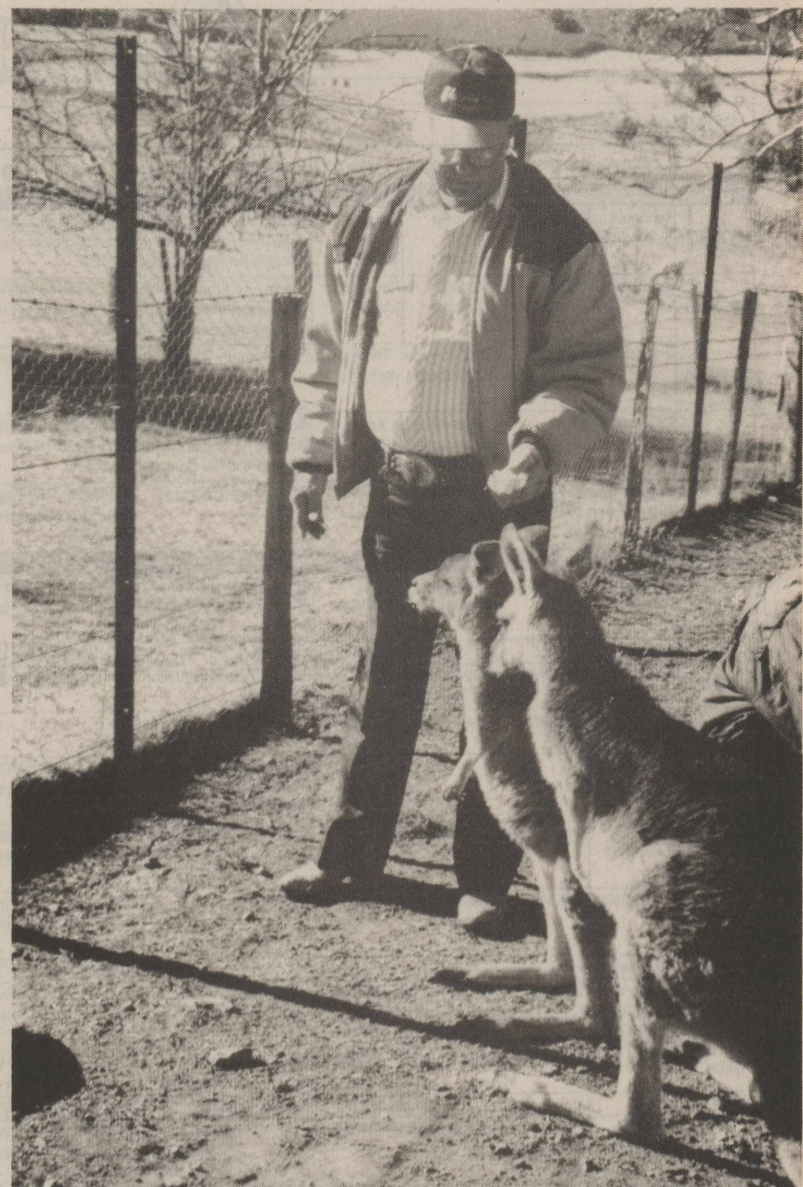
Memories of this special trip will provide a continuing anniversary gift for Virginia and Perry through the years to come.
