The plaintive cries of mourning doves and the soft rustle of the leaves on a nearby cottonwood tree were the only sounds to be heard as a hushed crowd awaited the arrival of the family of Jennifer Lee Gravell at Cedar Hill Cemetery Friday morning.

Jennifer would have been 10 on Saturday, Aug. 9, said the preacher, Johnnie Perkins, but instead of celebrating a time of joy, family and friends gathered to say goodbye to this little one whose life was taken Tuesday.

The pastor spoke first to the youngsters who came to mourn their friend, explaining that grief and tears are a part of saying goodbye. Words of comfort to the family by Perkins and Charles Preddy and music from a choir fell on the ears of a grieving assembly while just outside of town large oil tanks were being drained as part of the search for the weapon which was used to murder the little girl.

The soft sobs of women and children and the unashamed wiping of a tearful eye by many of the men at the service gave way to the wails of an ambulance siren after the collapse of Jennifer's grandfather.

The Monday night abduction and aurder of the young daughter of Beth and Charlie Gravell stunned a community where people have felt safe to come and go at all hours of the day and night. Searchers turned out to assist law officers hunt for the girl soon after she was reported missing, then to hunt for the murder weapon.

Charged with capital murder in her death is Melvin Wayne White, 47, an up-the-street neighbor of the Gravells. White was formally charged with capital murder about 4 p.m. Aug. 5, and bond was denied by Justice of the Peace Jim Hearne.

White reportedly cooperated with a weapon. officers in finding the body, which was located at a tank battery about 4-1/2 miles out of town shortly after 1

The case will be presented to the Crockett County Grand Jury Aug. 15. White is being represented by Kirk Harkins of San Angelo.

Records show that White was arrested on Aug. 13, 1992, and charged with aggravated sexual assault of a child after being accused by his 12year-old daughter. He was released the next day after posting bond.

There was no conviction. White's attorney at that time, Melvin Gray, and then District Attorney J. W. Johnson agreed to a pre-indictment deferment which required White to attend counseling. With a pre-indictment deferment, when conditions are met, the case does not go to the grand

258 calls for service last month compared to 76 the previous month. The increase is attributed to two things, jailers had not been putting down every call that came in, and loss of a deputy has reduced the number on weekend patrol to two. When you have three patrolling, "it kinda keeps things down," Fenton said.

The sheriff is in the process of getting a contract with a firm which frequently houses prisoners in the local jail during cross country trips. "We have always done this and just charged meal costs," Fenton said. With a contract, the county can charge \$30 to \$40 per night per prisoner. Fenton is also looking into housing some federal prisoners. The county would receive \$20 to \$25 per prisoner above costs for food, lodging, laundry, etc.

OPEN LETTER TO ALL CROCKETT COUNTY CITIZENS & SCHOOL FACULTY MEMBERS

Subject: Safe driving in school zones

We have another school season fast approaching us in a few days, and we are hoping that it will be a safe year for us all. Last year for the first time, The Crockett County Sheriff's Department increased the enforcement of traffic laws around our school areas.

A. There were some schools more hazardous than others, listed from

. Jr. High School - Due to lack of parking area, and narrow street. 2. High School - Due to large number of vehicle drivers operating

through the main street. 3. Primary - Failure of drivers to maintain speed under 20 mph 4. Intermediate - Speed limit is 25 mph in school zone due to access

B. The most hazardous time frames were identified as: 1. High school lunch period: Due to students/parents speeding out

of parking areas, & students running out in front of moving vehicles. 2. 2:40 p.m. - Due to students speeding and driving reckless to the Lion Stadium field house.

C. The most common and frequent traffic violations last year were: 1. Vehicles failing to stop for school bus - Vehicles on both sides of the street must stop while the school bus has its flashing red lights.

2. Speeding - All school zones are 20 mph or 25 mph, and are marked at both ends with a flashing signal, or a school zone sign.

3. Vehicles stopping/standing in traffic lane - Vehicles being stopped in traffic lane to unload or load passengers.

 Vehicle operators failing to make complete stops at intersections. 5. Vehicles parked within 30 or 15 ft. of a crosswalk or intersection/

Vehicles parked exceeding 18 inches from curb.

The above information is being furnished to you, in hopes that you will assist us in taking whatever steps necessary, in educating students, parents, and faculty members of the importance of exercising safe driving/ conduct around our schools.

Our main objective is not to issue as many citations as we can, but to have another safe year. Any help that will assist us in reaching our objective will be greatly appreciated.

Drug Arrests Made With Help From Teens, Shark

Shark, alerted on a vehicle containing marijuana and pills Tuesday night, July 28, after several teens reported two men attempting to sell drugs on the square. After the teens went to the Sheriff's Office and told of a group of youngsters being approached by two men in a car, Cpt. Fred Fierro and Deputy Petra Hernandez went to the

Marijuana was found on one subject, Sheriff Shane Fenton said, and the car was impounded. When Shark was brought to the scene, he alerted to the vehicle where officers found just under a pound of marijuana and a quantity of Rivotril.

Arrested on charges of felony possession of marijuana and felony possession of a controlled substance were Carl Frederick Seiden and his son, Frederick Carl Seiden II, both of

Crockett County's new drug dog, Florida. Their car has been seized and is in the forfeiture process.

"I'm proud of these teens who came to the jail to report these guys, and I want to thank them for what they did," said Fenton.

Shark also assisted in making two Class B misdemeanor marijuana arrests, Fenton said.

The drug Rivotril is sold in the United States as Clonazepam. A person has to be slowly taken off the drug if they have been on it for 3-4 weeks. It can cause memory impairment, hallucinations, insomnia, dizziness, drowsiness, shut down breathing, change heart rate and sometimes increase the tendency to commit suicide in those susceptible. When taken with alcohol, it acts as a stimulant. It also impairs coordination. If enough is taken, it puts you in a coma, according to pharmacist Laura Parker.





Apple Cake

- 2 c. sugar
- 1 c. Crisco or Wesson oil
- 3 c. grated apple (or diced small)
- 3 c. flour 1 tsp. soda
- 1 tsp. salt
- 1 1/2 tsp. cinnamon
- 1 c. chopped pecans
- 1 tsp. vanilla Just dump all the ingredients in

together except the pecans. Mix at low speed until it is well-combined, then fold in the pecans and vanilla. One word of advice, mix the soda and salt with the flour before adding to mixbake at 350 degrees for 1 hour and 15 minutes. Can be glazed with lemon or orange glaze, but is good as is. Are We Being Deceived?

It was only last August that our media was bombarded with a revolutionary discovery of 'Signs of Life' in a metcorite, said to have come from Mars to Earth. Now that Pathfinder has provided evidence that there's no resemblance of that meteorite to rocks found on Mars, why is there only silence? It was headline news around the world that Neanderthal Man was our immediate ancestor, proving evolution by providing the missing link. Recently it was discovered that his DNA proved to be a no-match, thus eliminating the possibility of the slightest connection. Front page news is made when a rock is carbon dated to be millions or billions of years old, yet nothing is said about the reliability of this method when it showed the shell of a living mollusk to have been dead for 3,000 years. We are taught that millions of critters died over 80 million years ago to form our oil deposits, but no one talks about the Melvin A. Cook model which conclusively proves that any such deposits over a mere 10,000 years would have no pressure left to force them up out of the ground. And now we have the puzzle that the Hubble telescope has seen light so far out that it is older than the Big Bang, which is equivalent to saying that you're older than your mother!

Why all this curious silence and misinformation in the face of documentable fact? ARE WE BEING

DECEIVED? The answer may lie in the testimony of some scientists themselves. And 'Lie' is the right word! For example, Harvard professor Richard Lewontin - an avowed Marxist evolutionist - says the lies are purposeful: "Scientists, like others, sometimes tell deliberate lies because they believe that small lies can serve big truths" ("The Inferiority Complex", New York Review). While one of the first real scientists defined science as 'Thinking God's Thoughts After Him', it is fundamentally played as a game today. The way it's played is to fabricate a story, call it a theory, accept it as truth, and then mock and demean anyone who disagrees. And Eugene Scott, director of the National Center for Science Education, has made it clear that public schools must oppose any form of creationism - even in the form of scientific evidence, which would dilute or throw doubt on evolution, and in the Journal of the N.C.S.E., two Iowa professors wrote in 1984, page 19: "As a matter of fact, Creationism should be discriminated against. No advocate of such propaganda should be trusted to teach science classes or administer science programs anywhere, or under any circumstances. Moreover, if any are now doing so, they should be dismissed". This attitude may go a long way in explaining why Christian teachers are unceremoniously bounced from universities, as happened at Wright State not that long ago. But the Creator says in Isaiah 40, verse 21: "Don't you know? Didn't you hear? Haven't you been told from the beginning?

Don't you understand how the earth was made? While many do not see the con-

nection, a close study of Romans 1:18-32 - which begins: "God in heaven shows He is angry at all the ungodliness and wickedness of people who...hold back the truth," will reveal that the basic reason behind our present social dilemma is denial of the Creator. And even the Chronicle of Higher Education seems to agree somewhat, as we read on page A56: "The social and conceptual revolution that we are now witnessing can be traced back to Darwin." In fact, violent crimes - including sexual abuse of children - have increased by more than 560% since 1960, as people act like animals who have not yet evolved enough. In his biggest lie since the Garden of Eden, Satan - whom Jesus identifies as "The father of lies" in John 8:44 - has deceived many. And the fruit from the tree of Evolution that has grown up in our midst is so bitter that we can't build prisons fast enough! It's no wonder, then, that Christian home-schooling and parochial schools is a trend which continues to grow. Are we being deceived?

Not all of us, thank God! There are lots of parents and grandparents who may not have read all the facts but who still know a liar when they hear one. And they have decided, as we read in Romans 3:4, to "Let God be true - and every man a liar." God bless 'em! Maybe their children will continue to respect the truth, and replace the current crop of scientists and educators who do not.

Students Need Breakfast For Good Performance

food Americans consume at breakfast has improved, the number of persons eating breakfast has actually declined—particularly young people.

A study published in the Summer

of 1996 in The Journal of the American Dietetic Association says adolescents and young adults under 30 are more likely to skip breakfast than are middle-aged or older adults. The study examined data from three U.S. national surveys collected in 1965, 1977 and 1989 and found that breakfast consumption among U.S. adults declined from 86 percent in 1965 to 75

Scientists agree that breakfast can be an important contributor to diet quality and the ability to think, particularly in children. According to one of the authors of the study, the declining trend in breakfast consumption shows the importance of breakfast has not been passed along to the public.

Related studies have also shown: -Children who skip breakfast aren't as efficient as children who have had breakfast in recalling and using new information, verbal fluency, controlling attention and in selecting critical information to solve problems...all skills needed to perform well at school.

Plant Tips from M&R Nursery by: Mike Glaspie **Summertime Rains**

I don't now how many of us had to wash our cars in order to make it rain, but it worked. As usual, some of us probably got more than others. Here are some of the problems that may arise from an abundance of rain. Fire ants seem



to make an appearance when it rains. The workers will make mounds and bring the eggs up to the surface. The 2-step approach is still the best. Apply a bait form such as Amdro or Logic off of the mound. Then 1-2 days later, apply a consect killer such as Orthone or mound. tact killer such as Orthene or granular Diazinon or Dursban. This will give the workers adequate time to move the bait form to the queen before we kill them. ber, it's the worker ants that sting

If you have St. Augustine and heavy shade areas, be sure to watch for the development of a fungus disease. It will development of a fungus disease. It will start out as yellowing grass or dead spots in the lawn. These spots will multiply or get bigger in size. An application of Boyleton liquid or granular, as well as liquid Daconil in 2-3 applications usually will stop any further problems.


Lastly, we could start to see iron prob-






