## FIRE PREVENTION WEEK Proclamation October 5-11, 1997

WHEREAS, In 1995, 3,640 Americans died in home fires. That is roughly 10 people a day. Tens of thousands more were injured. People can survive even major fires in their homes if they are alerted to the fire and get out quickly and stay

WHEREAS, Many lives can be saved if people react immediately when a fire alarm sounds. Once a fire starts, there is no time to develop a plan. The National Fire Protection Association urges everyone to "KNOW WHEN TO GO! REACT FAST TO FIRE!"; and

WHEREAS, More than half of all fatal home fires happen at night while people are asleep. Smoke detectors sound an alarm when a fire starts, waking people before they are trapped or overcome by smoke. With smoke detectors, the risk of dying in a home fire is cut nearly in half. Smoke detectors should be installed outside every sleeping area on each level of every home. Smoke detector batteries should be replaced at least once a year. If a smoke detector is more than 10 years, it should be replaced with a new one; and

WHEREAS, Every family member must be prepared for a fire emergency. Each family must make a step-by-step plan for escaping a fire. Each household must make a floor plan of their home and discuss escape routes. A meeting place must be agreed upon where everyone will gather after escaping a fire. A fire escape drill should be practiced at least twice a year; and


WHEREAS, The Ozona Volunteer Fire Department is dedicated to the safety of life and property from the devastating effects of

AUSTIN - After he was formally sentenced last week, State Sen. Drew Nixon, R-Carthage, said he will complete the remainder of his second term in office after he serves his 180-day jail sentence.

Nixon, 37, pleaded guilty in September to misdemeanor charges of solicitation of a prostitute and illegal possession of a weapon. He was arrested in downtown Austin on Feb. 18 after offering an undercover Austin policewoman posing as a prostitute \$35 for sexual acts. A loaded handgun was found under the seat of his car. Nixon does not have a permit to carry.

Travis County Court-at-Law Judge David Puryear sentenced Nixon to 180 days in the Travis County Jail beginning Oct. 17. But Nixon's lawyer said the senator will ask to serve his sentence in East Texas, "where this man lives and has his family and his work." Nixon is an accountant.

When the senator appeared before the court for sentencing, Judge Puryear admonished him for engaging in behavior that "not only violates the laws of the state of Texas, it violates the trust of the people of Texas, perhaps your constituents. It discredits you and the public office you hold.

Nixon agreed, saying, "My

actions were inexcusable, and I did let down every constituent in my district." But despite Democrats' call for his resignation, Nixon said he saw no reason to resign from public office. "I intend to serve out my time as a Texas state senator. My decision in that regard is final.'

Nixon said he had no plans to seek re-election in 2000, when his term expires.

When asked if his legal problems hurt the Republican party, he said, "I think the voters judge each one of us independently, and I don't think that one Republican having a problem would affect other Republicans."

Pay Phone Rate Cap Lifted The Public Utility Commission last week changed pay telephone rules in Texas to conform with requirements of the Federal Telecom-

munications Act of 1996.

Starting Oct. 8, the PUC will allow pay phone owners to charge pay phone users more than 25 cents per local call.

Texas has more than 150,000 pay phones, including 86,000 owned by Southwestern Bell Telephone Co. Kate Lowery, a spokeswoman for Southwestern Bell, said a raise in the charge for a local call is in the works, the Austin American-Statesman reported.

However, Scott Pospisil, executive director of the Texas Payphone Association, said a dispute between the private pay phone industry and the long distance companies at the Federal Communications Commission probably will delay increases in local call charges.

Wenner sought relief in federal court, but a Houston federal district judge dismissed the case. Wenner appealed, and the 5th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals in New Orleans overturned the dismissal in an opinion released last week.

The case has been sent back to Houston for a full trial.

and mix well. Spread over pineapple. Spread Cool Whip over cream cheese mixture. Top with cherries and pecans. This makes 2 (9 inch) pies or 1 (13x9 inch) rectangular pie pan.

## **Texas Beans**





## JV Braves edges out JV Lions 30-22

The Iraan JV Braves came out on top of a very close game as they defeated the Ozona JV Lions 30-22 in last Thursday's action in Lion Stadium. The JV Lions fell to a season record of 2-3.

"Overall, we played hard. We didn't start the game with a lot of confidence, but as the game went on, we built it up," said new JV coach Clay Riddle. "We had some good blocking up front. We've had this group for two weeks, and we are getting them to play as a unit."

The Braves took the opening kickoff and started their first touchdown drive from their own 20-yard line. It took the Braves ten plays to cover the yardage for the score. The Braves' halfback scored on a 10-yard run with 5:56 left in the quarter. A try for the two-point conversion run failed, but they took an early 6-0 lead.

"Defensively, on the first series, we didn't play with much aggression or confidence to start the game," said Coach Riddle. "We got a little more physical and started stopping them."

The Lions had a nice chance to score in the first period after a Braves' fumble and Lion recovery on the Iraan 44-yard line. Several plays later, the Lions reached the Braves' 35-yard line, but could not convert on a fourth down play and the Braves took over.

It was some good luck again in the form of an Iraan fumble into the hands of Dustin Faught where he returned the ball to the Lions' 41-yard line. On the next play Leon Garcia broke for a 34-yard run down to the Braves' 25-yard line. Then Garcia lost two yards on the next play before time ran out in the first quarter.

Seth Webster caught a 10-yard pass, then five plays later, the Lions scored on a 5-yard pass from Clay Richardson to Cade Clark. Garcia ran across the goal line for the conversion and the Lions took an 8-6 lead with 6:32 remaining in the second period.

It didn't take long for the Braves to come back and score. On the next series of plays from their own 38-yard line, they took six plays with one running play of 27 yards and a 15 yard pass to reach the end zone. The drive was capped off with a 19-yard touchdown pass with 3:08 left in the first half. A pass on the conversion was good, and the Braves retook the lead

After the Lions fielded the kickoff on their own 15-yard line, Garcia got loose for an 85-yard touchdown run with 2:40 remaining in the first half. On the conversion, a pass intended for Faught fell incomplete, but the Lions tied the Braves at halftime

"Offensively, we made some good holes and plays. We did move the ball upfield, but there were some mistakes made," said Coach Riddle.

A good punt return by Iraan to the Lions' 30-yard line set up their third touchdown. Eight plays mainly consisting of short vardage runs were made by the Braves to reach the end zone. Texas Animal Health Commission and Texas Parks and Wildlife Department have issued a summer and early fall alert for anyone who may be going afield in Texas. Anthrax has been confirmed in both livestock and whitetailed deer in South Texas and the western Edwards Plateau. Although humans are also susceptible, no human cases have been reported with the current outbreak, and simple precautions can effectively reduce risks of contracting the disease.

Eugster recommends that ranchers in an area where anthrax has been found or on a ranch that has had a case at any time in the past 30 years should vaccinate their cattle right away. Anthrax is rarely diagnosed be-

fore death in animals because it strikes so quickly and has no noticeable symptoms. Animals usually die within one to three days of the anthrax-causing organism lodging in the body. The bacterium which causes anthrax can survive for up to 30 years in the soil

Carcasses suspected of harboring the disease should not be moved and especially should not be cut open. The carcass should be destroyed by burning at the site of death. India processes large amount of mohair

Under no circumstances should the hide, hair, skulls or horns of an animal suspected of having anthrax be salvaged, nor should the meat of these animals be eaten. Spores of the bacteria can travel with the blood into the instances, through inhalation.

For humans, initial signs of infection occur two to five days following exposure to the diseased animal. Anthrax can take many forms in people, ranging from a mild, black sore on the skin, to pneumonia, to death. However, prompt medical treatment with antibiotics is usually successful in preventing further illness.

According to the American Medical Association Encyclopedia of Medicine, in humans a raised, itchy area develops at the site of entry, progressing to a large blister and finally to a black scab, with swelling of the surrounding tissues.


