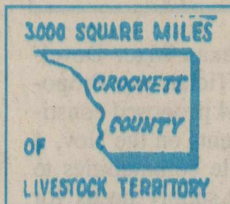

Lion Band earns Division I

The Ozona Lion Band received a Division I/Superior Rating Oct. 18 at the Region VII U.I.L. Marching Contest in Brady. A total of seven Class AA bands performed.

This marks the 15th consecutive year the Lion Band has received the top rating at this contest and the 16th Division I in the past 17 years. The band is under the musical direction of Mr. Kelly Glaze who is assisted by Mr. Norman Carroll. Maribel Dominguez is the drum major for the 1997 Lion Band, and Araceli Tijerina is the

flag coordinator.

Several years ago the U.I.L. began certifying Superior Rated bands at the region contest on to the area and state levels of competition on alternating years. On even numbered years, only 3-A and 5-A bands may advance, whereas, odd numbered years A, 2-A and 4-A bands may advance. As a result of their Division I rating, Ozona has advanced to the area marching band contest. The area contest will be held Saturday, Oct. 25, at Pennington Field in Bedford. The Lion Band is

scheduled to perform at 6:10 p.m. A total of 17 Class AA bands will compete in Bedford with only three bands certified on to the state marching contest to be held in Mesquite on Monday, Nov. 3.

The Lion Band members and their directors would like to thank the school administration, board of education, Crockett County Sheriff's Department, Band Boosters and the community for their continued support of the Ozona Band Program.

4-H Food Show set for Oct. 26

Don't eat too much for lunch. The annual Crockett County 4-H Food Show, complete with tasting tea, will be held Sunday, Oct. 26, at the Crockett County Civic and Youth Center.

Competition in this year's event begins with judging orientation at 2 p.m., judging from 2:30 p.m. until approximately 4 p.m., followed by a tasting tea and awards ceremony. The event will conclude around 5 p.m. All interested persons are invited to attend, and there is no cost to do so.

Twenty-two 4-H members are entered in the contest, which is the county elimination contest for district. 4-H'ers compete in junior, intermediate and senior divisions according to grade and age, as well as in four categories - fruits and vegetables, main dish, nutritious snacks and breads. First place contestants in each category will advance to district competition Nov. 15 in Fort Stockton. Senior contestants, age 14 and older, will then have the opportunity to advance to state competition.

Each participant will interview with a set of judges and give information on nutrition and his or her project activities, leadership and citizenship during the contest. Awards include \$50 savings bonds to each first place winner presented by Crockett County National Bank and Ozona National Bank, rosettes for first through third places and participation ribbons for all contestants provided by Southwest Texas Electric Cooperative. There will be additional gifts for each participant. Additional donors will be listed in next week's Stockman.

Electronic vote counting comes to county

An optical scan ballot tabulator for ballot counting has arrived and will be put to use in the November Constitutional Amendment election, says Debbi Puckett, Crockett County clerk.

The only change for voters involves filling in an oval on their paper ballot with a special pencil rather than marking an "X" beside their choice. Ballots will be counted by the machine at a central location. There will be no counting at the polling places. The machine will count 100 ballots per minute. Even a Crockett County election with a large turnout can be counted in about an hour, Puckett said.

The machine has an accuracy record of 99.97%. If desired in the case of a recount, ballots can still be counted by hand. The system is in use in more than 130 Texas counties and in more than 30 states, Puckett said.

Early voting by personal appearance began Monday and ends Oct. 31 in the amendment election. These votes are cast at the courthouse. To apply for a ballot by mail, your request must be received at the county clerk's office no later than the close of business on Oct. 28.

Voters' guides from the League

of Women Voters are available at Crockett County Public Library. These copyrighted guides provide explanations of each proposition and arguments for and against. Wording of the ballot follows.

Proposition No 1: "The constitutional amendment to allow a person who holds the office of municipal court judge to hold at the same time more than one civil office for which the person receives compensation.

Proposition 2: "The constitutional amendment to authorize the legisla-

ture to limit increases in the appraised value of residence homesteads for ad valorem taxation and to permit a school district to calculate the school property tax freeze applicable to the residence homestead of an elderly person or the surviving spouse of an elderly person in accordance with the law authorizing the transfer of the school property tax freeze to a different homestead regardless of whether that law was in effect at the time the person

School board approves tech plan

Members of the Ozona School Board, meeting in regular session on Tuesday, Oct. 14, unanimously approved a new technology plan for the district. The technology plan, presented by district technology coordinator Rod Miller, will be implemented immediately and is designed to accomplish in two years or less the following goals: (1) make maximum use of the current investment in existing technology; (2) meet the technology equipment requirement target of a student-to-workstation ratio of 2:1; (3)

meet the technology equipment target of an educator-to-workstation ratio of 1:1; (4) install a districtwide wide-area network (WAN) to provide, in each classroom, Internet access, instructional applications, and administrative productivity tools; (5) design the WAN in such a way that it can be easily expanded and maintained, without reliance on any particular technology or vendor; (6) purchase standardized software that can be utilized by

State Capital HIGHLIGHTS

AUSTIN — Texas Water Development Board officials say Proposition 7, one of 14 proposed constitutional amendments on the Nov. 4 ballot, will enable communities to meet their water supply needs for years to come.

The water board, a state agency that issues bonds to fund water projects, helped in the passage of the new law that strengthened government control of lakes, rivers and aquifers.

"The whole idea is to give the water board more flexibility to help local communities deal with their water supply needs," state Sen. J.E. "Buster" Brown, R-Lake Jackson, told *The Dallas Morning News*.

Prop. 7 would remove a restriction that prohibits the water board from moving money among its four separate funds: water supply, flood control, wastewater and matching-grant funds. In elections during the last 40 years, voters have given the water board authorization to issue more than \$1 billion to finance water projects.

In a published analysis, the Texas Legislative Council has listed arguments for Prop. 7, including: Voters already approved bond authorization for each of the four funds. If the state wants more money for water projects, it should have to ask voters to approve more

bonds. Special interests are pushing the state to resume building reservoirs. Under the current system with separate bond funds, "powerful interests" cannot sway the water board into using a disproportionate amount of money for a single project that would benefit "only a few."

Regarding "powerful interests," however, water board spokeswoman Janice Cartwright said the agency "does not permit new reservoirs. That's done at the Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission. It seems like that's where any political influence would be exerted."

Herbicide Use Is Curtailed
 The Texas Parks and Wildlife Department is halting its use of herbicides in two South Texas lakes until it can be determined whether too much poison is used in sources of drinking water, the *San Antonio Express-News* reported.

Chemical herbicides are used to make swimming and boating safer and easier in some public lakes and rivers.

But unregulated use of herbicides by people who live along lakes and rivers can slip through treatment plants which cannot remove such chemicals from tap water.

A statewide review of herbicide use should end next spring. Meanwhile, state Rep. Edmund Kucmepel, R-Seguin, has asked the House Committee on Recreational Resources to conduct its own study.

Faculty Group Expands Suit
 The Texas Faculty Association has expanded a free-speech lawsuit it filed against the Texas A&M University System and Attorney General Dan Morales to include the University of Texas and other Texas schools, the *Austin American-Statesman* reported.

The original suit, filed in July, challenges a Texas A&M policy and a new state law that forbids college faculty from serving as expert witnesses or consultants in

lawsuits against the state. Two Texas A&M faculty members in the original complaint are assisting tobacco companies that were sued by the state.

U.S. District Judge James Nowlin issued a temporary injunction in August allowing the professors to continue assisting the tobacco companies.

The Texas Faculty Association wants to prevent Texas public colleges and universities from enforcing their "gag" policies until the lawsuit is resolved.

Other Capital Highlights
 Susan Combs, a former state representative from Austin, announced her candidacy for agriculture commissioner last week. The 52-year-old Republican manages a ranch in West Texas. She hopes to succeed Agriculture Commissioner Rick Perry, a fellow Republican who is running for lieutenant governor.

David Dewhurst, a Houston businessman and Republican activist, announced plans last week to run for Texas land commissioner. He joins three other Republicans seeking to succeed Democrat Garry Mauro who may run for governor: Houston businessman Tim Turner, state Sen. Jerry Patterson of Pasadena and Don Loucks of Bastrop, an aide to U.S. Rep. Ron Paul of Surfside.

Texas' soft-money gifts to the national Democratic and Republican parties have quintupled over the past four years. Federal records show that in the first six months of 1997, the two major parties raised \$1.5 million from fewer than 200 businesses and individuals in Texas. That's more than five times the amount raised during the same period in 1993, at the same point in the election cycle.

Bicycle enthusiasts in Austin convinced the city council to repeal a six-year-old ordinance mandating that all bicycle riders wear helmets. The city estimates that 86,000 Austinites get on a bicycle every week and 12,000 cycle to work.

Cook of the Week Betty Huffman comes from a large family, seven brothers and three sisters. Because of this, "when I cook, I have a tendency to fix too much," she says. Betty makes a lot of casseroles and salads and few desserts. She especially enjoys "fun dishes" such as hors d'oeuvres, things her brothers took no interest in when she was cooking while growing up. Her favorite cookbook is *Cowpasture Cooking* written by a woman who cooked for Lyndon Johnson for 16 years.

Betty and Charles Huffman came to Ozona in August of 1958. He is pastor of Faith Lutheran Church in Ozona and Hope Lutheran Church in Sonora and owns, along with son Vince, Crockett Automotive. Betty works at the parts store as does the other Huffman son, Bubs.

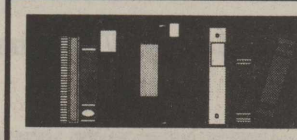

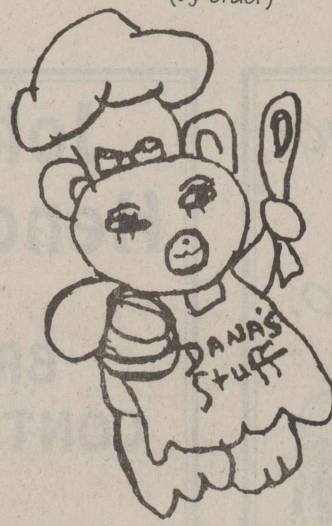

DISTRICT

The Crockett Soil and Water Conservation District was established in 1950 to identify and prioritize resource concerns within the county and to serve as a medium for local ranchers in coordinating assistance from federal, state and local agencies. Agencies providing assistance include the Natural Resources Conservation Service (formerly known as Soil Conservation Service), Texas Agriculture Extension Service, Farm Service Agency (formerly Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service), Texas Parks and Wildlife Department and University of Texas Lands.

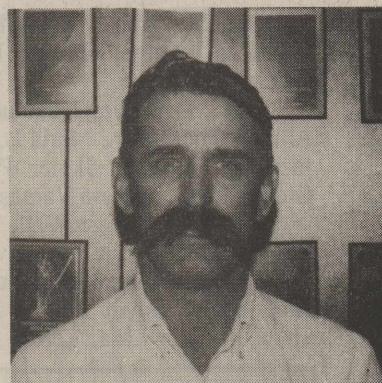
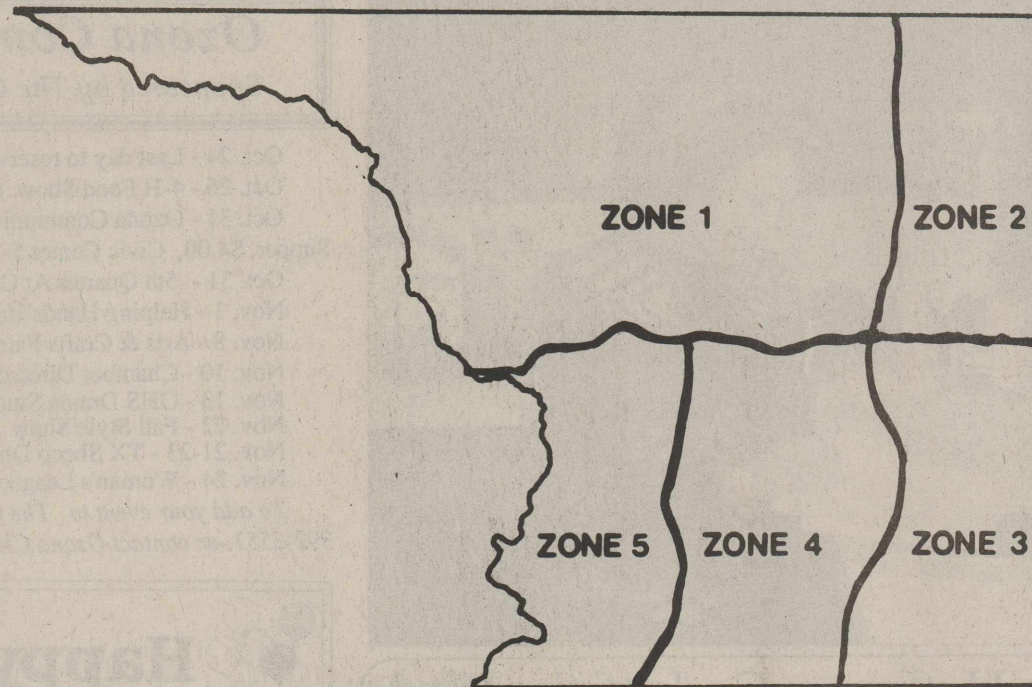
A Memorandum of Understanding between the USDA-NRCS and the District allows the NRCS to furnish technical assistance to ranchers, farmers and other interested individuals in order that conservation plans can be developed to meet the needs and capabilities of the land and the objectives of the landowner.

The District is governed by a five member board of locally elected directors. These directors serve as a voice for landowners and operators within the District. Directors for the past year include Earl Acton, Chairman; Larry Williams, Vice-Chairman; Pleas Childress III, Secretary; Paul Perner III, member, and Steve Wilkins, member.

Improper grazing management, brush infestation, conserving soil, water, plants and related resources and improving wildlife management on rangeland as secondary land use are the primary concerns outlined in a long range program and plan.

The Crockett Soil and Water Conservation District realizes these concerns need to be addressed and steps taken to solve these problems in order to protect our resource base.

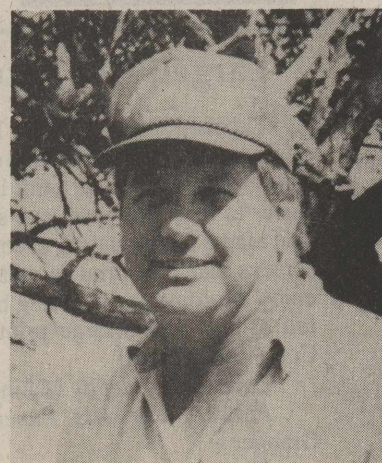

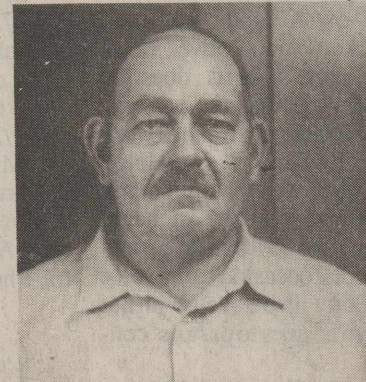

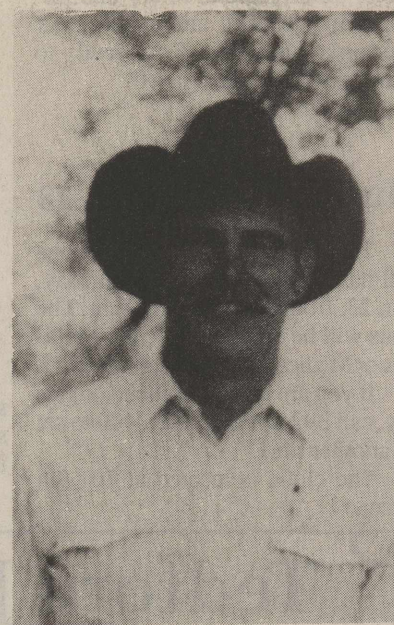

CONSERVATION EDUCATION

The Crockett SWCD sponsored the thirteenth annual conservation field day for sixth grade students of Ozona. The field day was held on the Gene Perry Ranch east of Ozona. The purpose of the program was to give the students a basic understanding of what our renewable natural resources are and how they must be properly cared for to sustain our current way of life.

The students were presented information on range management, wildlife management and soils during the morning program. Ivan Weir followed this by demonstrating the use of border collies for working livestock and explaining how these dogs can be a very valuable working tool for ranches.

Following a hamburger lunch provided by the District, presentations were made by Miles Dabovich and Tedra Ulmer on sheep, goats, wool and mohair in Crockett County. The students were then taken to Wool Growers Wool and Mohair Warehouse for a discussion on the process wool and mohair, starting from the initial shearing in the field to the finished product of felt hats and clothing.

The entire day was enjoyed by all who attended and the District plans to continue the education event annually.



Range and Plant ID Contest

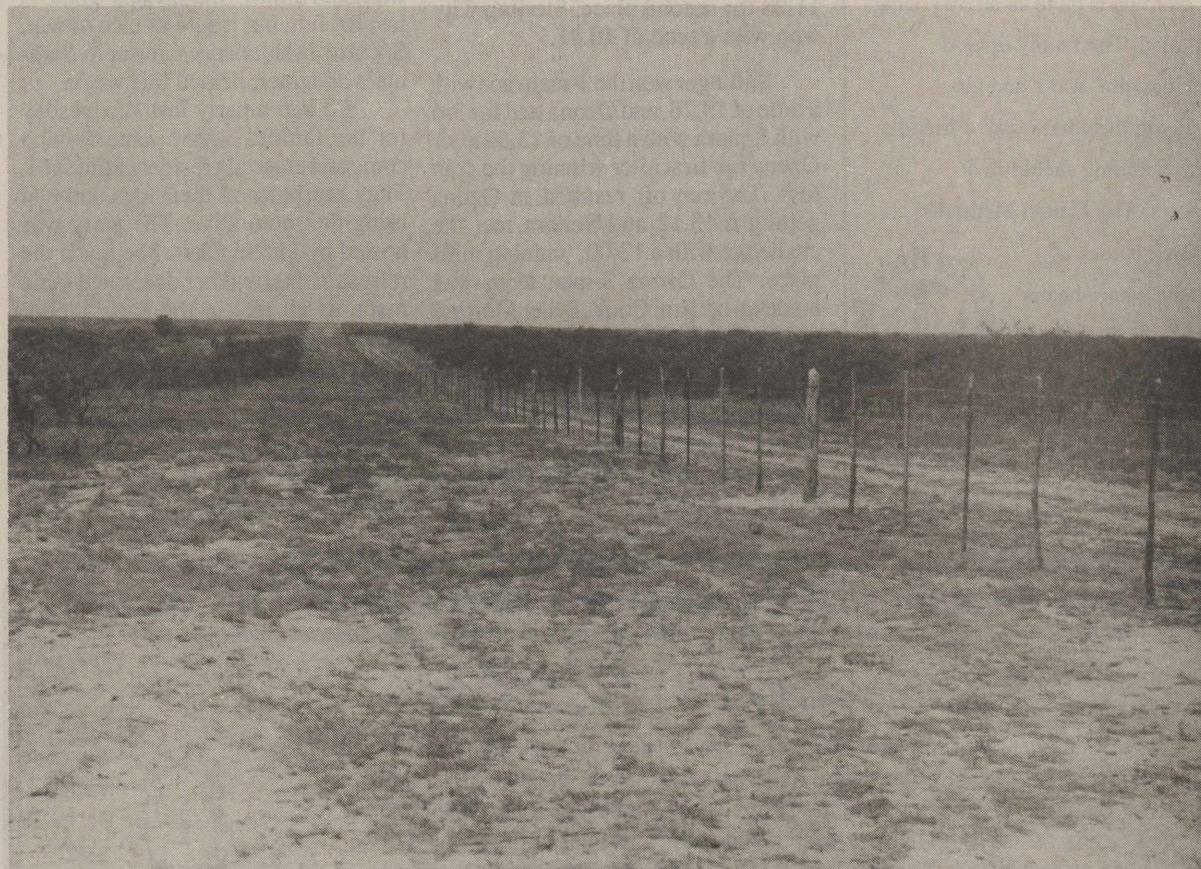
The Board also co-sponsored the Crockett County Range and Plant ID contest which was held on the Double T Ranch. The 4-H'ers learned to identify plants and evaluate range conditions based on the existing plant communities compared to the climax community. This enables the youngsters to determine ecological change in plant communities due to drought, livestock management practices or presence of man.



Cross fencing

Cross fences play a vital role in grazing management systems. Livestock are selective in the plants they graze. They tend to repeatedly graze the desirable plants and leave the less desirable plants. This weakens the more desirable plants and allows unwanted plants to thrive and multiply.

Cross fencing helps control animal movement, with small pastures which improves grazing distribution. The improved distribution gives the better plants a chance to regrow, compete, and multiply thus gradually increasing the amount of high quality plants available. This improved range condition increases livestock production, improves the habitat for wildlife, reduces erosion, and conserves water.



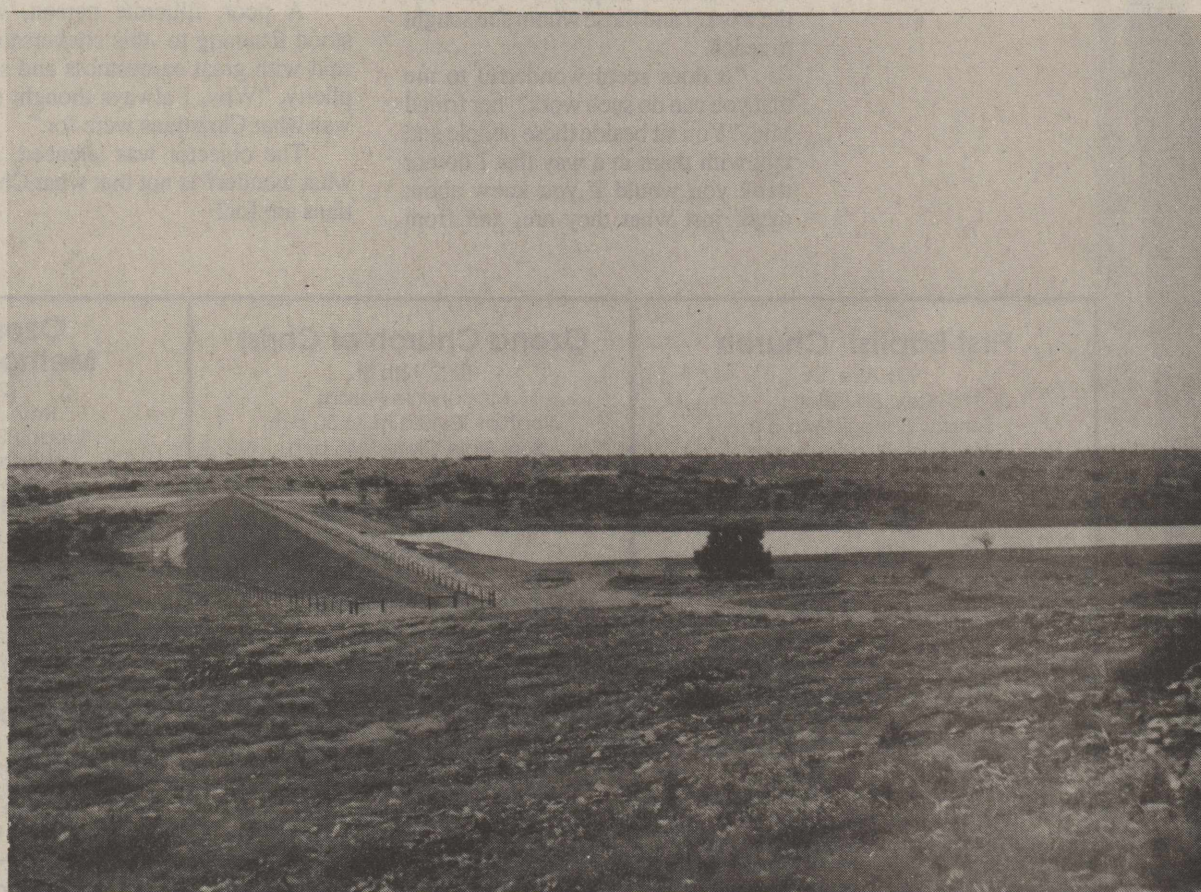
Watershed Protection And Flood Prevention

The possibility of flooding in Ozona similar to that disastrous day of June 28, 1954 has been greatly reduced by the construction of seven floodwater retarding structures on Johnson Draw watershed and two miles of channel improvement through the town of Ozona.

Through the initiative and cooperative action of local people and ranchers, the Crockett Soil and Water Conservation District, the Crockett County Commissioners Court, and the Soil Conservation Service, the construction of these structures was completed by 1959.

Throughout the years since their construction there have been numerous rainfalls in which minor flooding damage might have occurred had these structures not been in place. These structures are designed to detain runoff from 78% of the watershed above Ozona. Run off from the watershed is temporarily held back by the structure and is slowly released at a safe and controlled velocity.

The seven structures and channel improvement are inspected annually by the local sponsors and every five years by NRCS engineers. These inspections are made to ensure all structures and the channel are functioning as planned. Presently, all structures and the channel are in very good condition due to the good maintenance and repairs made by the sponsors.

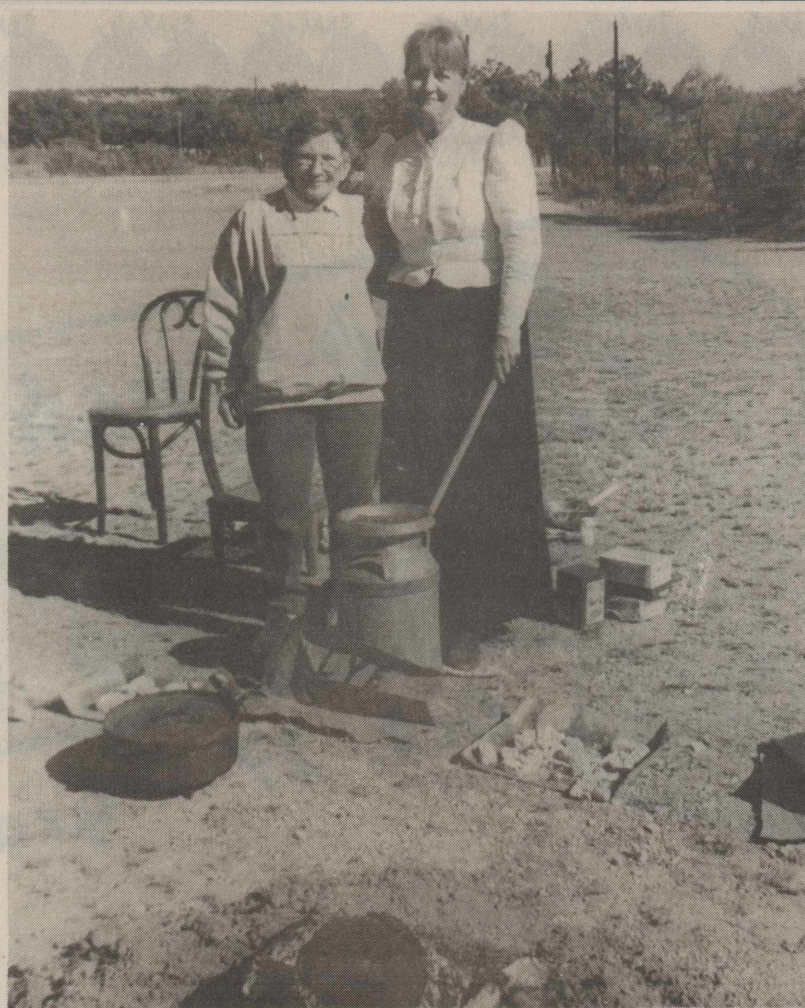

Winding Down

As we come to the end of 97's growing season, let me take this opportunity to thank ya'll for the fantastic response to the articles we write. At times, we have been threatened with bodily harm if we stop, but we know they are just kidding (I hope).



Last time Ronnie noted that we will write the articles on the first Wednesday of each month until next March. Also, we have had the privilege of introducing our articles to the people of Ozona and they also have been very receptive to our attempts to inform everyone the do's and don'ts of gardening and landscaping.

There is still time for winterizer and Excel pre-emergence. Although some weeds may have broken thru, we can still prevent the majority from taking over this winter. Think about buying those spring bulbs now such as tulips, hyacinths, etc. the selection is still good but you will not plant until between Thanksgiving & mid-January, be sure to refrigerate those tulips for 4-6 weeks prior to planting & use bone meal. We are changing out summer color right now for winter pansies, cabbage & kale. all campuses; and, (7) bid out and purchase a new digital phone system for the district.

Miller explained that the district technology contains 7 phases which will result in the accomplishment of the above goals. Phase 1 will be to take bids and purchase a new digital telephone system which will allow multiple access to the Internet for both teachers and students. Phase 2 will be the purchase of computer workstations for each teacher in Ozona Primary School and Ozona Intermediate School. Using a \$160,000.00 grant recently received through the Texas Infrastructure Fund (TIF), the purchase of these computer workstations will be at no cost to the district.

Phase 3 will consist of installing wiring and equipment to connect Ozona Intermediate School teachers together in a campus local area network (LAN) so that they can share campus network information and software. It will also consist of installing student computer workstations in the high school computer science classroom, business classroom, and in a new computer laboratory which will be located in the lower floor of the Ozona High School Library. The new computer lab will allow an entire class of students to use computer resources at one time. The lab will be configured with 22 student workstations and will have Internet access and to teacher and student high school course specific software. This phase will also include the installation of teacher workstations in each classroom in high school.

Phase 4 will include the installing of wiring and equipment to connect Ozona Primary School teachers together in a campus local area network, the installing of student computer workstations in the computer literacy classroom at Ozona Middle School, and the addition of a new computer lab for students at OMS which will have the same configuration of the new computer lab in Ozona High School. This phase will also include the installation of teacher workstations in Ozona Middle School.

Phase 5 will be the installing of wiring and equipment at Ozona Middle School and Ozona High School to connect each school in a campus local area network, and Phase 6 will be to

install new student computer workstations in the existing computer labs at Ozona Primary School and Ozona Intermediate School. The computer labs will have the same configuration as computer labs in Ozona Middle School and Ozona High School.

Phase 7 will be the connecting of all four school campuses and administration building together to form a district wide-area network (WAN) which will allow all facilities to share common data, software, E-mail, and Internet connectivity. This will be accomplished by running single-mode fiber optic cable on West Texas Utilities poles to each site. Fiber optic cable will transfer data 40 times faster than wireless transmissions and can be also used for fax, video, and/or voice transmission.

During the meeting the trustees also approved campus improvement plans, school board policies, and members of the 1997-98 Ozona Public School Textbook Committee. Textbooks which will be reviewed by this committee for adoption in the local school system in the 1998-99 school year include: spelling (grades 1-6); Algebra I and II; geometry; Biology I; art (grades 1-5); business computer applications; business computer programming; Computer Science I and II; microcomputer applications; exploratory languages (grades 6-8); French I-VII; and, Latin I-IV.

The members also reviewed bids for the purchase of two suburban-type vehicles to replace two school vans that were recently sold to the county. Glasscock Chevrolet Olds-Buick Incorporated in Big Lake was awarded the bid for these two vehicles.

The meeting was adjourned following an affirmative vote by the trustees to set the date and time of their November regular meeting on Wednesday, Nov. 19, at 7:00 p.m.

Lions triumph over Coahoma

Last Friday the Ozona Lions finally captured a district victory, the first since beating Van Horn in 1995, and they did so while exhibiting great poise and determination in the face of adversity. Between the opening kickoff and the final second of the game, the Lions trailed the Coahoma Bulldogs by 14 at one point and 6 at another, they lost their starting quarterback midway through the second quarter, then fought off the Bulldogs at the goal line as the last second ticked off the clock.

Coach Hargrove remarked, "We played with a lot of pride and dignity. After we got behind 14-0 and Justin got hurt, our kids knew they had to cinch their belts tighter."

"Our older kids showed a lot of leadership," he added, "and our younger kids stepped it up a notch."

The Bulldogs dominated the opening moments, keeping the ball for more than half of the first quarter and scoring at the 7:02 mark on a 6 yard pass from Mario Garcia to Jerry Mann. The same pair combined on a 31 yard pass early in the second period and the Bulldogs forged ahead by 14-0.

Then the Lions began to move the ball well, pushing to within striking distance of the goal before giving the ball up on an interception at the seven yard line. On the same play, starting quarterback Justin Browne suffered a head injury that would take him out of the rest of the contest.

Sophomore Ross Crawford took the helm for the Lions, and some good running by Matt Castaneda and Tim Maldonado set up a spectacular 38 yard pass from Crawford to Anthony Ortiz, who made the catch behind double coverage for the Lions' first touchdown. A missed extra point attempt sent Ozona to the locker room trailing by 14-6.

In the third period, Ozona's pass-

ing attack became too much for the Bulldogs. "We blocked on the line of scrimmage better."

Crawford connected with Tim Maldonado for a 17 yard gain and Kenny Vargas for 32, setting up a 10 yard TD strike to Vargas. Crawford threw to Maldonado for a two point conversion to tie the game at 14 all.

The Dogs, led by backup quarterback Vincent Garcia, fought to stay in the game. Garcia passed to Mann for a 12 yard score, capping a 53 yard drive. An unsportsmanlike conduct call forced the Bulldogs to try the extra point from the 18, and it went wide to the left, but Coahoma had a new 6 point lead.

The next Ozona possession was one for the story books. Facing 4th and 9 at their own 38 yard line, Ross Crawford set up deep to punt. A bad snap forced Crawford to scramble for daylight, then he looked down field, found Chad Myers open and connected with the pass for a 10 yard gain and a first down. Aided by a personal foul call against Coahoma, the ball moved to the Bulldog 28. Yet another Crawford pass found its target in Mark Childress at the 3. On third and goal Crawford forged his way through a tight goal line defense to tie the game with 3:34 remaining. Another missed extra point left the game knotted at 20 each.

The Dogs' next possession was halted when Anthony Ortiz pulled in a clutch interception at the Coahoma 35. A clip after the interception put the Lions back at mid-field. After losing some yardage, Crawford found Maldonado deep for 30 yard gain, then hit Kenny Vargas for 22 more. With 1:04 remaining in the game Mark Childress nabbed a 10 yard shot from Crawford in the end zone, and the Lions led for the first time in the game. The PAT was blocked, but Ozona had a 26-20 lead.

Coahoma scared fans, players and coaches alike when Vincent Garcia rambled 54 yards to set up a first and

goal inside the Ozona 10 with only seconds remaining. A fortuitous holding call pushed the Dogs back to the 22. From there they took four shots at Ozona's goal before Crawford slapped away the final pass in the end zone on a play that began with one tick remaining in the game.

Offensively for the Lions, Browne led the rushing attack with 60 yards before his early departure. Crawford added 35 on the ground but the real story was in the air with Crawford throwing 12 completions for 191 yards and 3 touchdowns. Kenny Vargas had 5 catches for 91 yards, Maldonado had 3 for 51, Ortiz caught 2 for 39, Childress had a pair for 21 yards, Brian Badillo had 1 for 16, and Myers 1 for 10.

Defensively the Lions were led by John Esparza and Donnie Bullard with 11 tackles each. Crawford had 6 stops and Ortiz, Rusty Bishop and Gabe Tambunga had 4 per man.

"It was fun to watch the kids compete hard and win," said an elated Coach Hargrove. About next week's opponent he added, "Wall has a lot of skill people. Their quarterback is very good, and they have a lot of experience."

The Lions travel to Wall on Oct. 24 for another district contest at 8 p.m.

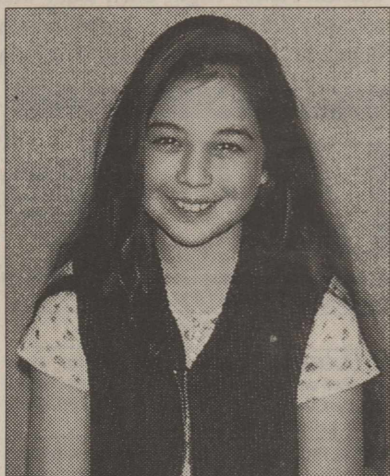

Last Thursday, the Lion JV squad came up short in a hard-fought contest with the Coahoma Bulldogs. With the score tied at 26 to 26 the Dogs nailed a field goal to steal a 29 to 26 victory with only 8 seconds remaining in the game.

"I was real impressed with our kids," remarked Coach Ronnie Casey, "with their attitude to be able to come back and fight. Being down 14 points it would be easy to put your head down, and they didn't."

The Bulldogs had opened a 14 to 0 advantage early in the game, returning the opening kickoff for the first of the two scores. Then the Lions began to crank behind a 294 yard rushing effort by Leon Garcia. On a 63 yard drive Garcia raced for 42, and Clay Richardson picked up 21. On the op-

tion play Richardson kept for the touch-down, then added the two point conversion himself.

The Dogs opened the lead back to 14 points before the Lions put together another possession covering 62 yards, highlighted by a 48 yard dash by Garcia. Richardson passed 6 yards to Dustin Faught for the tally. At the half the Lions trailed 20 to 14.

In the second half Seth Webster grabbed a toss from Richardson and raced to the goal on a scoring play covering 60 yards. The extra point attempt failed and the game was tied at 20.

The Bulldogs forged ahead once again before Leon Garcia did yet another of his patented run and dodge scampers for a 63 yard, one play drive to knot the game at 26 each. With plenty of time to do more, the Lions moved to the Coahoma 20 before turning the ball over on a fumble. From

there the Dogs moved the ball to within field goal range and iced the win.

"It was a great football game," said Casey. "It showed them (the team) that we have a lot of class and a lot of character. They had semester exams that day and a two and a half hour bus ride. The offensive line did a great job again. We had two or three times we felt like we should have scored and

just didn't get it in there."

To go with Leon Garcia's 294 yards Glen Sutton added 73, and Clay Richardson had 46 more. Total rushing yardage for the Lions was a massive 418 yard effort. Clay Richardson passed for 74 yards, including the TDs to Faught and Webster.

Black face and crossbred wool brought .62 to .83 a pound and tags and locks .52.

Weekly Drilling and Completion Report

Wildcat drilling action is slated for Crockett County. It has been designated the No. 1 University Land 7-32 with Enron Oil & Gas Co. of Midland as the operator. Location is a 672-acre lease in an unlisted survey, 18 miles southwest of Big Lake. The venture is under authority for 3,300 feet of hole making.

The same operator is scheduled to spud the No. 18 M. K. Daniel about 45 miles southwest of Ozona in Crockett County's Simpson-Mann Field. Drillsite is a 2,317-acre lease in the TCRR Survey A-3523. Canyon Formation will be the target at a depth of approximately 6,500 feet.

Union Pacific Resources Corp. has posted first production data for the No. 6 McMullen "D", 10.2 miles southeast of Ozona in Crockett County's North Live Oak Draw Field. The new gasser flowed 88,000-CFD on a 1-in. choke and was rated at 89,000-CFD on absolute open flow. It was drilled a total of 9,200 feet with plugback to 9,081. Production will be from a Strawn Formation interval, 8,920 to 9,008 feet into the hole.

The same operator recently completed the No. 4H Couch Estate about 11.4 miles southwest of Ozona in Crockett County's University 31 Field. It flowed 678,000-CFD on absolute open flow and showed ability to yield 652,000-CFD on a 1.375-in. choke. Bottomed at 11,122 feet, the well was plugged back to 10,562. It will produce from 9,160 to 10,436 feet into the wellbore.

Flowing 2,650,000-CFD on absolute open flow, the No. 7 Joey Wylie McMullen "A" was recently completed about 11 miles southeast of Ozona in Crockett County's Davidson Ranch Field. Harrison Interests is the operator. The developmental well flowed at the rate of 1,756,000-CFD on a 1.5-in. choke. The operator took the well to a 9,301-ft. bottom with plugback to 8,258. Production is at 8,012 to 8,068 feet into the hole.

Parker & Parsley Development Co. posted first production data for the No. 9 Helbing, four and three-fourth miles southwest of Ozona in Crockett County's Northeast Ozona Field. It flowed 604,000-CFD on a 1-in. choke and earned a 761,000-CFD evaluation on absolute open flow. Drilled a total of 8,700 feet, the developmental well will produce from 6,096 to 8,488 feet into the wellbore.

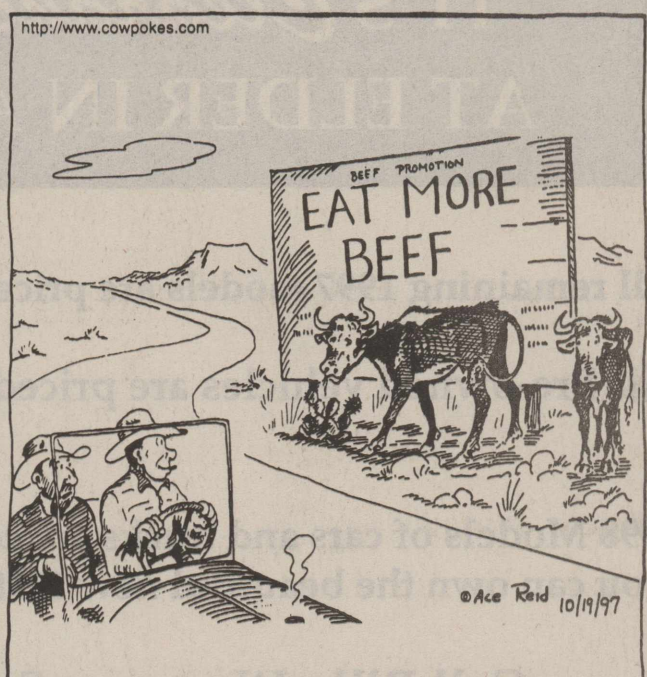

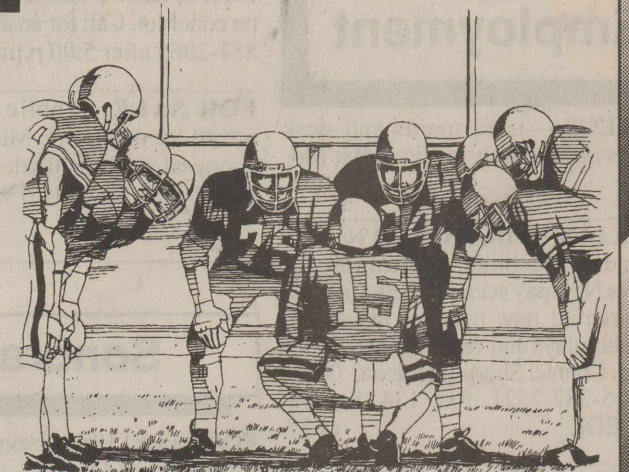

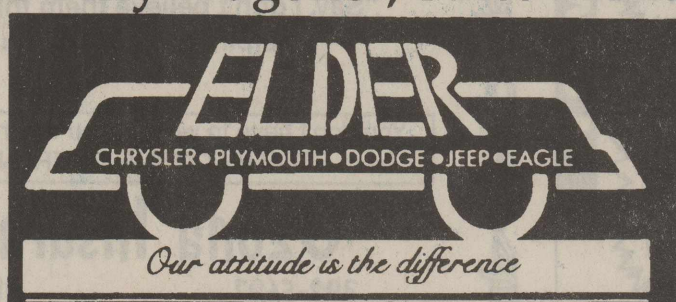
