

BE IT ORDERED BY THE COMMISSIONERS' COURT OF CROCKETT COUNTY, TEXAS:

SECTION 1: An election shall be held on the 16th day of December, 1997, in the Crockett County Consolidated Common School District No. 1, which date is forty-five (45) or more days from the date of the adoption hereof, and the holding of the election on such date rather than on a uniform election date is hereby found to be in the public interest. At such election, the following measure shall be submitted:

"SHALL the Commissioners' Court of Crockett County, Texas, be authorized and empowered to issue bonds of the Crockett County Consolidated Common School District No. 1, in the principal amount of \$3,850,000 for the construction and equipment of school buildings in the District, including a new middle school and additions and modifications to the existing Middle School gymnasium; and shall there be pledged and levied, assessed and collected annually ad valorem taxes on all taxable property in the District sufficient, without limit as to rate or amount, to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds as the same become due; said bonds to mature serially or otherwise not more than FIFTEEN (15) years from their date, to be issued in one or more series at any price or prices, and to bear interest at such rate or rates (fixed, floating, variable or otherwise and not to exceed the maximum rate permitted by law at the time of issuance of the bonds) as in its discretion the Commissioners' Court shall determine?"

SECTION 2. The entire District shall constitute one election precinct for this election and the Crockett County Courthouse, Ozona, Texas, is hereby designated the polling place. The persons hereby appointed to serve as the election officers at said polling place are as follows:

For purposes of processing ballots cast in early voting, the election officers of the aforesaid polling place shall also serve as the early ballot board for this election.

SECTION 3: Paper ballots shall be used in this election, which ballots shall be prepared in accordance with V.T.C.A., Election Code, and permit electors to vote "FOR" or "AGAINST" the aforesaid measure which shall appear on the ballot substantially as follows:

"THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$3,850,000 FOR THE CONSTRUCTION AND EQUIPMENT OF SCHOOL BUILDINGS, INCLUDING A NEW MIDDLE SCHOOL AND ADDITIONS AND MODIFICATIONS TO THE EXISTING MIDDLE SCHOOL GYMNASIUM, AND THE LEVYING OF THE TAX IN PAYMENT THEREOF"

SECTION 4: All resident qualified electors of the District shall be permitted to vote at said election. This election shall be held and conducted in accordance with the V.T.C.A. Election Code, except as modified by the provisions of the Texas Education Code, and as may be required by law, all election materials and proceedings shall be printed in both English and Spanish.

SECTION 5: A substantial copy of this order shall serve as proper notice of said election. Said notice, including a Spanish translation thereof, shall be (i) published at least one time not more than thirty (30) days or less than ten (10) days before the day of the election in a newspaper of general circulation in said District and (ii) posted not later than the 21st day before the election and remain posted continuously through election day on the bulletin board used for the posting of notices of meetings of the Commissioners' Court.

#### **OCTOBER PERMITS** TO DRILL

issued a total of 1,286 original drilling 1996. permits in October compared to 1,216 well bores, and 250 for re-completions.

So far in 1997, there have been 11,814 drilling permits issued compared to 10,554 recorded during the same period in 1996.

Permits issued in October included 492 oil, 319 gas, 426 oil and gas, 40 injection, and 9 other permits.

> OCTOBER OIL AND GAS COMPLETIONS

In October, operators reported 413 oil, 424 gas, 22 injection and one other completion, compared to 363 oil, 382 gas, and 27 injection three other completions during the same month of last year.

Total well completions for 1997 year to date is 7,784 up from 7,297 The Texas Railroad Commission recorded during the same period in

Operators reported 692 holes in October 1996. The October total plugged and 156 dry holes in October included 1,000 permits to drill new oil compared to 762 plugged and 181 dry and gas wells, 36 to re-enter existing holes during the same period last year.

#### AUGUST NATURAL GAS PRODUCTION

Texas oil and gas wells produced 1.02# 454,354,349 Mcf (thousand cubic feet) of gas based upon preliminary production figures for August 1997, down from the August 1996 preliminary gas .78# production total of 472,009,479 Mcf.

Texas gas production in August came from 159,863 oil and 50,288 gas yearlings: .66-.74# wells.

Crockett County ranked seventh .90# in the state of Texas in natural gas production for the month of August .80# 1997 with a total of 11,853,378 Mcf.




