

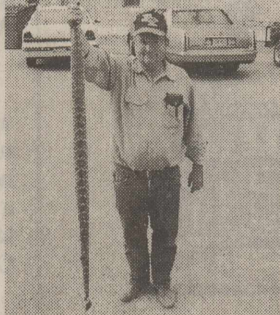

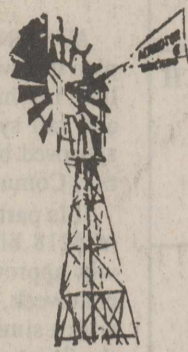
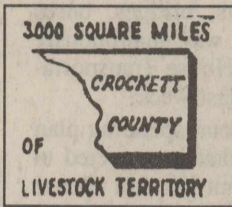

## Commissioners offer five-year abatement for wind power project

County fathers changed their "no" to yes at a meeting called March 24 to reconsider granting a tax abatement to a company wanting to bring wind power to Crockett County. After their March 16 meeting and refusal to give the 100%, 10-year tax abatement asked for by Texas Wind Power Company, the company doing the permitting for the project, commissioners agreed to reconsider.

Pre-meeting meetings were held during the day last Tuesday between Judge Jeffrey Sutton, Commissioner Fred Deaton, County Attorney Bill Mason, County Tax Assessor Tom Stokes and County Auditor John Stokes and representatives of Texas Wind Power Company, Florida Power & Light Company and FPL Energy, Inc., a subsidiary of FP&L.

Wind power people came to court that night with a 7-year, 100% abatement in mind along with a plan for a written guarantee to spend four to five million dollars in the county over the 30 years of the wind power contract. If the 5-year abatement preferred by the county was approved, they said they would make a "reasonable effort" to use local services.

Robert Morrison, project director for FPL Energy, Inc., said the guaranteed four million in expenditures would be in materials, labor and long-term ancillary benefits to the community.

After wind power people and commissioners addressed questions from the audience, Commissioner Deaton moved to grant a 5-year abatement of farm to market, lateral road and ad valorem taxes with an expendi-

ture by West Texas Wind Energy Partners, L.L.C., of four million dollars in Crockett County over the life of the project. The court voted unanimously for the measure.

This was drawn up in the form of a resolution in which commissioners elect to become eligible to participate in the tax abatement agreement subject to fulfillment of all statutory requirements for granting tax abatements under Chapter 312 of the Texas Tax Code.

The motion and vote would put something on the table and the ball back in the energy company's court, Deaton said.

County Attorney Bill Mason said he could have a contract ready for the next regular meeting of commissioners on April 13.

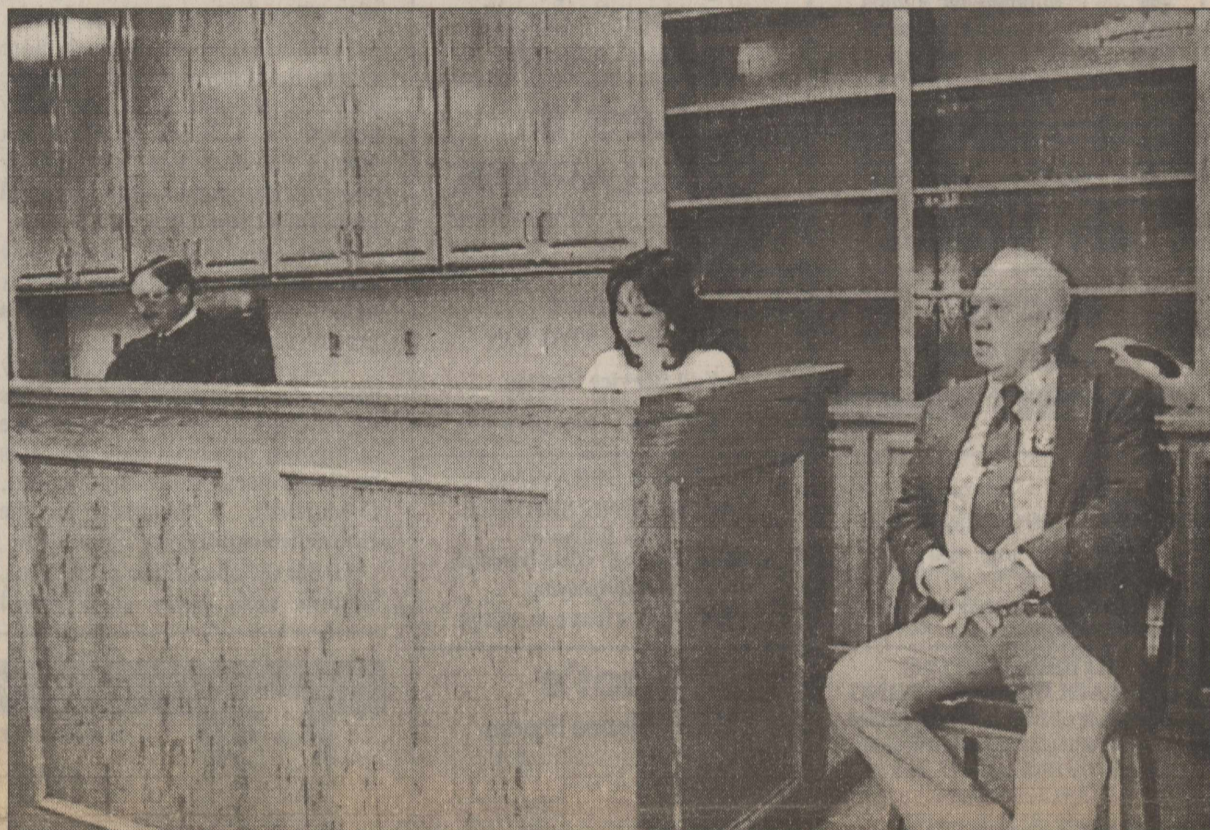
The proposed wind energy project is to be built on the Southwest Mesa located in Crockett and Upton counties. Average winds there are in excess of 18 miles per hour, assuring a continuous supply of wind power for turbines mounted on 215 foot columns. The 3-bladed wind turbines are over 150 in diameter. The project was

originally expected to develop 100 megawatts of power from 152 individual wind turbines with 104 of those to be located in Crockett County. When commissioners said on March 9 they were not willing to grant abatement, they were told that the project would not come to the county unless they were willing to provide some incentive.

At the March 9 meeting, commissioners were also told that there is a power purchase agreement for FPL Energy, Inc. to provide renewable energy to WTU, Central Power & Light Company and Southwestern Electric Power Company, all subsidiaries of Central and South West Corporation for 20 years with two five year extensions. The plan was before the Texas Public Utility Commission last week with a request to increase the project by an additional 25 megawatts.

Construction will be done by FORAS Energy Inc. of Palm Springs, CA, and is slated to start in July of 1998 and be completed by July of 1999. Ways project representatives

## Population estimates show increase for West Texas

Crockett County is one of 28 West Texas counties showing a population increase according to estimates recently released by the U. S. Census Bureau. Current figures are based on a July 1, 1997 population compared to

April 1, 1990 figures. The county is shown at 4,518, up 440 from the previous estimate of 4,078 for a 10.8 percent increase.

The largest gain, 65 percent, went to Edwards County with a population increase of 1,472, up from 2,266 to 3,738. Presidio County increased by 29.2 percent with the addition of an estimated 1,940 persons, bringing the population up from 6,637 to 8,577. San Saba County also had a large increase, 18.9 percent, with an increase of 1,023 persons up from 5,401 to 6,424.

Sutton County increased 7.3 percent with the addition of 302 citizens, bringing the population estimate to 4,437 from 4,136.

Reagan, Upton and Terrell all showed decreases, Reagan with a 6.3

percent loss from 4,514 to 4,228. Upton's estimate shows a loss of 632, 14.2 percent, down to 3,815 from 4,447. In Terrell County, the loss of 221 residents amounted to 15.7 percent, bringing the estimated population to 1,189 from 1,410.

Other counties listed in the West Texas population estimate report are: Gillespie, Jeff Davis, Llano, Midland, Pecos, Brown, Mason, Mills, Ector, Brewster, Tom Green, Irion, Menard, Martin, Concho, Kimble, Schleicher, Runnels, Howard, Glasscock, McCulloch, Coke, Nolan, Coleman, Andrews, Crane, Sterling, Reeves and Ward.

Texas as a whole gained 14.4 percent with estimates showing a population of 19,439,337, up 2,453,002 from 16,986,335.

## Trees to beautify community

## Mayfield injured in auto accident March 23

Sara Mayfield, 17, was injured in a wreck March 23 on Hwy. 163 approximately 22.4 miles north of Ozona. The 1997 Ford Ranger XLT pickup she was driving rolled two and one-fourth times according to an accident report filed by investigating DPS Trooper Junior Bilano. Mayfield, who was alone in the vehicle, told the officer she unbuckled her seatbelt to reach into the floor to get a piece of gum.

She overcorrected after running off the right side of the road, then lost control of the pickup. Overcorrection to the right caused the vehicle to go into a broadside skid and roll. May-

field told the officer she was not ejected from the pickup.

Ambulances responded from Big Lake and Ozona. She was taken by ambulance to Barnhart where she was picked up by Medivac for the remainder of the trip to San Angelo's Shannon Hospital. Injuries included a broken pelvis, hip and ankle. Reports from family indicate she will be confined to bed for a month or more.

The DPS was notified of the accident at 5:10 p.m.

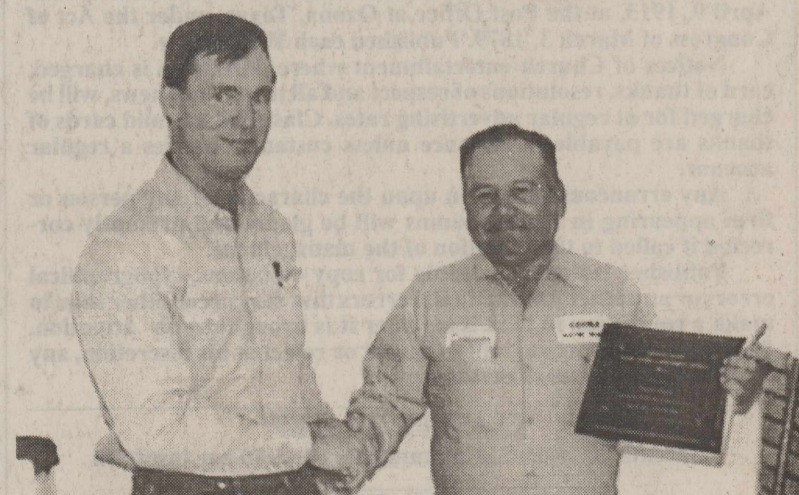

## HIGHLIGHTS

**AUSTIN** — A six-year spending plan that would give Texas \$1.9 billion for highways, bridges, buses and rail systems was unanimously approved by the House Transportation Committee last week.

It is part of a total spending plan of \$218 billion that is expected to win approval from the full House next week, but still must be merged with a similar bill passed earlier by the Senate.

"This bill is a major victory for the people of Texas. The committee vote means that Texas should finally get its fair share of funding for badly needed infrastructure projects," said House Majority Whip Tom DeLay, R-Sugar Land.

Both bills give states much more money than they received under the previous six-year plan, primarily because a 4.3-cent gasoline tax would be dedicated to highway construction rather than general government spending.

And, both bills offer new formulas for disbursing the tax money so that Texas receives a greater share.

"For years, Texans have dutifully paid federal gas taxes, and for years we have not received our fair share of highway funds — only 77 cents on the dollar," said Max Sandlin, D-Marshall, a member of the House Transportation Committee.

Under the committee's new plan, Sandlin said, every state would

receive at least 90 cents for every dollar they send to Washington in federal gasoline taxes.

**Utility Hearings Under Way**

The state Senate Interim Committee on Electric Utility Restructuring is holding a series of public hearings across Texas and will issue a report on electric utility deregulation to Lt. Gov. Bob Bullock in October.

Last week, at a hearing in Grapevine, electric cooperatives urged the committee not to move too quickly toward opening the industry to competition.

Libby Linebarger, a former state representative from the Austin suburb of Manchaca who is now a director of the Pedernales Electric Cooperative, said co-op customers "are not beating down our doors now asking for choice," according to a report in the Austin American-Statesman.

Other co-op representatives made statements similar to Linebarger's at the hearing, and some predicted deregulations would increase costs to residential customers, rather than force electricity prices down, as proponents of deregulation have asserted.

Mike Williams, president of the Texas Electric Cooperatives Association, said co-ops doubted all customers would benefit from competition. "One of the ways you keep rates low for everybody is not letting everyone come and go as they please," Williams said.

Meanwhile, the Clinton administration is supporting efforts to bring nationwide competition to the industry with the promise of saving electricity consumers \$20 billion a year and helping the environment.

**EnviroMedia Wins Contract**

The Austin-based firm, Tuerff-Davis EnviroMedia Inc., beat out eight Austin-area and national advertising agencies for the Texas Department of Transportation's \$1.5 million "Don't Mess With Texas" anti-litter campaign.

Doris Howdeshell, director of the travel division for the highway

department, said she was impressed with EnviroMedia's plan to recycle the existing campaign and improve it. Although most Texans have heard the "Don't Mess With Texas" slogan, some think the ads are about Texas pride, not litter prevention, Howdeshell said.

"Our ads will focus on the remaining litter that's out there," she said.

The year-old agency, which specializes in environmental advertising, takes over the campaign created by GSD&M Advertising of Austin.

Last year, EnviroMedia organized the first national "America Recycles Day." Its clients include the Recycling Coalition of Texas, H-E-B Food Stores Inc. and the City of Fort Worth.

**Other Capital Highlights**

■ The 3rd Court of Appeals in Austin is scheduled to hear a case in May that could affect the ability of the public to watchdog agencies that regulate the insurance industry and many other industries. The case stems from insurance industry efforts to keep confidential certain reports it gives to the Texas Department of Insurance. The reports allegedly contain information identifying neighborhoods where insurers award or deny auto coverage.

■ About \$500,000 in refunds from Farmers Insurance will be split among about 8,000 Texans under an agreement between the company and state regulators. The Texas Department of Insurance accused Farmers of overcharging some customers from July 1996 to January 1997 based on how long policyholders had insurance before applying for coverage from Farmers.

■ Former Housing Secretary Henry Cisneros' one-time mistress Linda Jones was sentenced last week to 3 and a half years in federal prison for obstruction of justice and bank fraud. Jones, a star witness in an independent counsel investigation of Cisneros, became a target herself in 1996 when prosecutors caught her in a series of lies about evidence.

said money might be spent in the county during construction include purchase of lubricants, supplies for fencing, and tires, use of local construction companies for road work, insurance purchases, use of motels and restaurants and possible refueling of trucks delivering the turbines from the Port of Houston.

An information sheet provided at the meeting March 24 said the project would ultimately pay almost \$14 million in local county and school taxes. This is based on the placement of 104 turbines in the county. There has been no intent to request abatement of school taxes.

There was no discussion of ways to verify expenditures in the county during construction and over the 30 year life of the project.

Upton County commissioners voted March 23 to grant a tax abatement, and West Texas Energy Partners, L.L.C. agreed "to purchase locally if available".

### Giving small businesses a fighting chance

Now imagine that while working one day, a group of folks come into your office and demand employment applications. Not even taking the time to fill them out, they take the applications and abruptly leave.

The next thing you know you're slapped with an unfair labor practice suit by a federal agency in Washington, DC called the National Labor Relations Board (NLRB). They repre-

sents the people who barged into your office and now claim you unfairly didn't hire them.

Well, you may think you have no problem since you did nothing wrong, but to prove you did nothing wrong will cost you tens of thousands of dollars in legal fees. And the fact that the folks who barged into your office and did all this with the sole purpose of damaging your company and driving you out of business, somehow gets lost in the shuffle.

Sound impossible in the United States of America where capitalism and free enterprise reign? Well, it is happening to small businesses right here in Texas. And the worst part is that you, the taxpayer, pay the bills while the federal National Labor Relations Board looks into these baseless charges. Your tax dollars hard at work.

Labor union bosses and big companies across the country regularly send their agents into small businesses to dummy up charges, file them with the NLRB and drive the smaller competition out of business. All this is done while the National Labor Relations Board, a taxpayer funded federal agency which has historically supported big labor unions, turns a blind eye.

In addition, the legislation protects small business owners by helping to ensure that people asking for employment applications are actually interested in working for the company and not just there to wreak havoc.

Small businesses in Texas and across the United States deserve better than they are getting. Legislation like this brings fairness into the system and helps level the playing field for the "little guy". It's outrageous that these types of scams have been allowed to continue for so long at the expense of the small business owners of America. And it adds insult to injury to know that the taxpayers have been stuck with the bills. We in Congress are working hard to correct this to save taxpayers millions of dollars and to give small businesses a fighting chance.

Brenda recalls the first meal she ever cooked for him was her favorite, but she had never prepared it before. When she served the fried chicken, potatoes, gravy and corn, he asked which was the gravy and which was the potatoes.

"I've learned to cook a lot of things I never thought I would, like goat meat and venison, and try a lot of things I never thought I would eat," said Brenda. "We're not into fancy stuff. We like meat, potatoes and barbecue."

Both her mother, Connie Bentley, and J. D.'s mother, Mabel McCollum, are excellent cooks, says Brenda, and she credits them with teaching her to cook.

The McCollums are the parents of three grown children, Gina, who is an investigator for CPS in San Angelo; Jim and his wife Tammy and son Aaron who live in Lisbon, CT; and Johnny and his wife Julie and their sons Justin and Joshua of Gardendale.

When the kids leave home and there are just two in the house it is hard to cook, says Brenda. "You can't cook just a few red beans."

"It doesn't seem like we've been married 29 years," said Brenda. "When you marry as young as I did, you have to really want to make marriage work. We have a good life together, and I hope we have a lot of years left."

When Brenda isn't cooking, she likes to read, crochet and do stamped cross stitch. She loves to take pictures, particularly of flowers and scenery.

### BRENDA'S MOIST CHOCOLATE CAKE

2 c. sugar  
2 c. flour  
1 stick margarine  
1/2 c. Crisco  
1 c. water  
3 T cocoa

2 eggs  
1 c. buttermilk  
1 tsp. baking soda  
1 tsp. vanilla

In mixing bowl combine sugar and flour. In saucepan combine margarine, Crisco, water and cocoa. Bring to boil and pour over flour and sugar mixture. Add eggs, buttermilk, soda and vanilla. Mix well. Pour into floured and greased 9x13 pan. Bake at 350 degrees for 30 min. or until tests done.

### ICING

1 stick margarine  
3 T cocoa  
1/3 c. buttermilk  
1 box powdered sugar (more if needed to get to right consistency)  
1 c. chopped nuts (optional)  
1 tsp. vanilla  
Bring to boil margarine, cocoa

and buttermilk. Add powdered sugar and vanilla. You may add nuts to the icing or sprinkle on top, your choice. Pour icing on warm cake.

### SOUTHERN PECAN PIE

3 eggs (beaten)  
2/3 c. sugar  
Pinch of salt  
1 c. light Karo syrup  
1/3 c. margarine, melted and cooled

1 c. pecans, halves or chopped  
1 9-inch unbaked pie shell  
Beat eggs, sugar, salt, syrup and margarine thoroughly. You may add pecans and then pour into pie shell or pour custard into shell and add pecans to the top. Placing pecan halves in a circle around pie makes a very pretty pie. Bake at 350 degrees for 50 minutes or until knife inserted in center comes clean.

### SQUASH CASSEROLE

3 c. cooked squash, drained well  
1 8 oz. carton sour cream  
1 slightly beaten egg  
1/2 c. cubed Velveeta  
1/2 c. chopped onion (green onion is great)

1 c. grated longhorn cheese  
Salt and pepper to taste  
Mash squash slightly. Add sour cream, egg, Velveeta, onion and salt and pepper. Mix well. Pour into greased casserole and top with grated cheese. Bake at 350 degrees for about 30 minutes.

### SOURDOUGH BISCUITS

1 pkg. yeast (2 may be added - not the quick rise)  
2 c. buttermilk  
3 1/2 tsp. baking powder  
1 1/2 tsp. salt  
6 c. flour (more if needed)  
1 c. warm water  
1/2 c. oil  
1/4 tsp. soda  
1 T sugar  
Dissolve yeast in the warm water. Add remaining ingredients and mix well. I usually add the flour 2 cups at a time for easier mixing. You can roll out and cut with biscuit cutter or pinch off dough. This will keep in refrigerator for 5 days. Just be sure you store in airtight container.

Bake biscuits at 375 degrees until brown. After the dough has been in refrigerator, I usually let the biscuits set for about 20-25 minutes after I pinch them off. They rise better.

### Angel's Delight

1 c. mini-marshmallows  
1 sm. box lime Jello  
1 c. sugar  
1 T lemon juice  
1 sm. can crushed pineapple, drained  
1 c. cottage cheese, drained  
1 c. Cool Whip  
Mix Jello as directed, then add marshmallows until melted. Then add lemon juice, pineapple and cottage cheese. Mix well and refrigerate until it starts to congeal. Then fold in Cool Whip and 1/2 c. of chopped pecans. Place back in fridge until congealed completely.

## Oceanographer to lecture at ASU

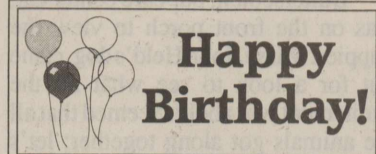
One of the world's foremost oceanographers, Dr. Sylvia A. Earle, will be the speaker for the 22nd annual Roy E. Moon Distinguished Lecture in Sciences at Angelo State University April 7.

Internationally renowned as the ambassador-at-large to the world's oceans, Dr. Earle is the former chief scientist of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration, a distinguished marine biologist, leader of the first team of women aquanauts and

holder of a depth record for solo deep diving, 1,000 meters.

Leading more than 50 expeditions, she has spent approximately 6,000 hours underwater studying the ecology of marine ecosystems, and above water exploring technological advancements for deep-sea research.

Dr. Earle will present a university lecture at 2 p.m. Tuesday, April 7, titled "Ocean Exploration in the 21st Century" and will deliver a public lecture at 8 p.m. Tuesday titled "Sea Change - A Message of the Oceans" in the Houston Harte University Center C. 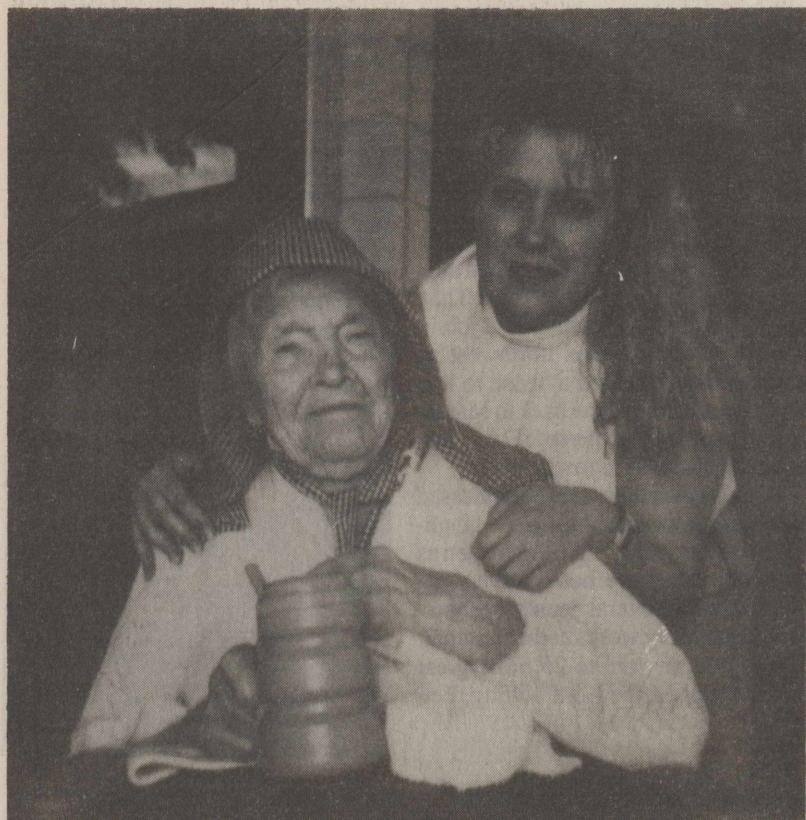

Honorary pallbearers will be Jim Carter, Drake McKinney, Tom Vantervanter and the Ozona High School Class of 1956.

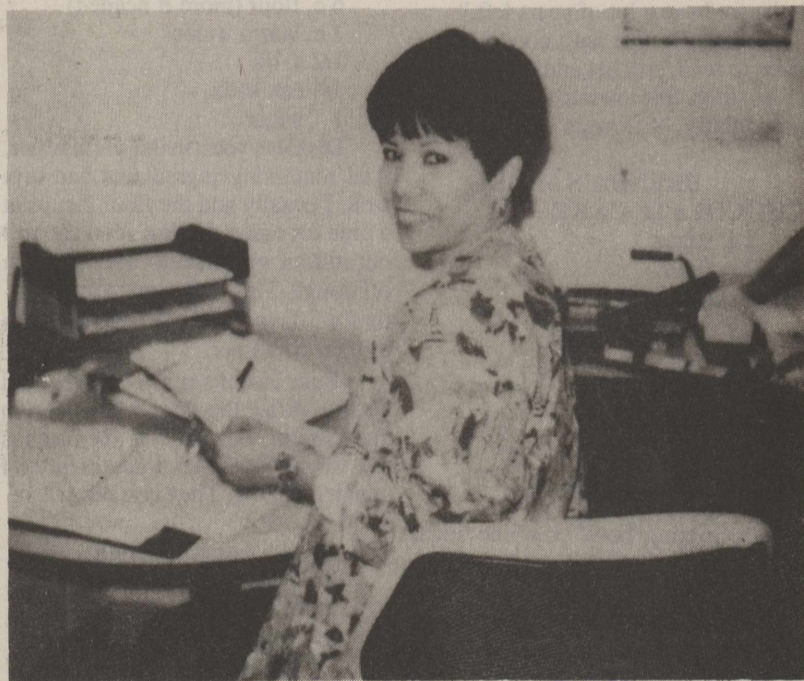

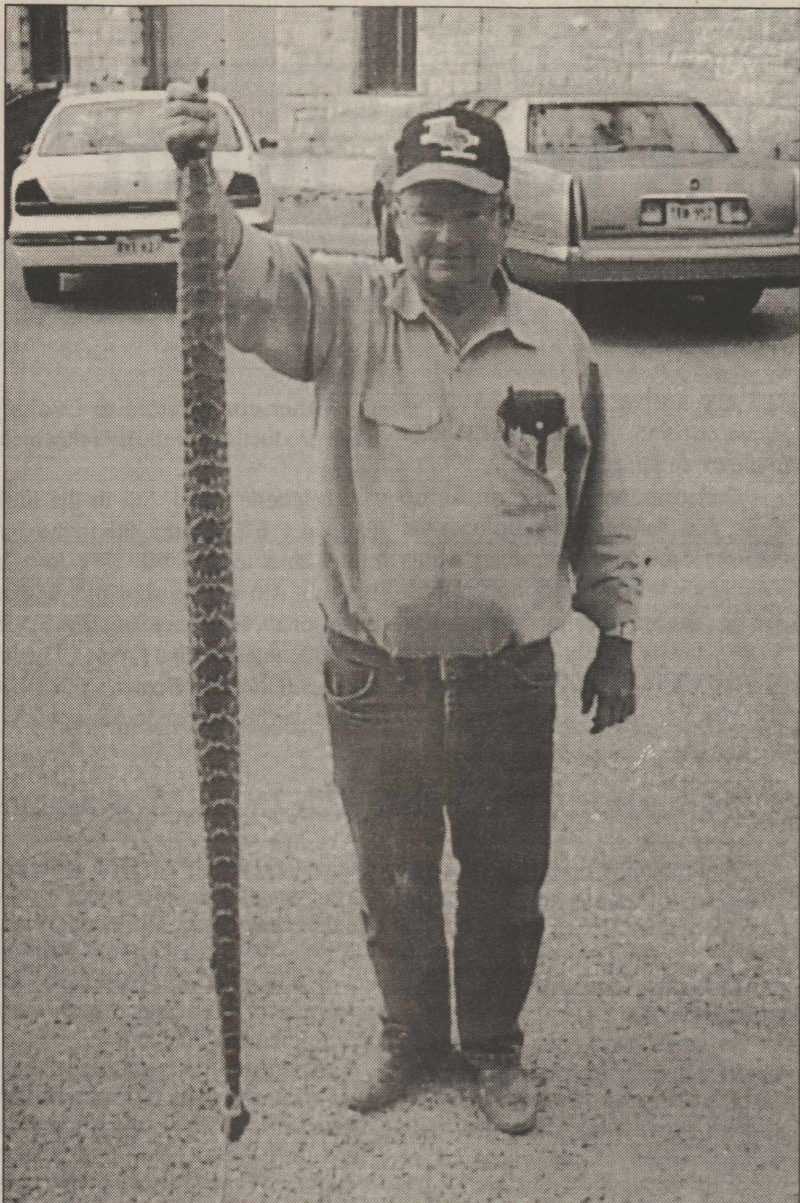

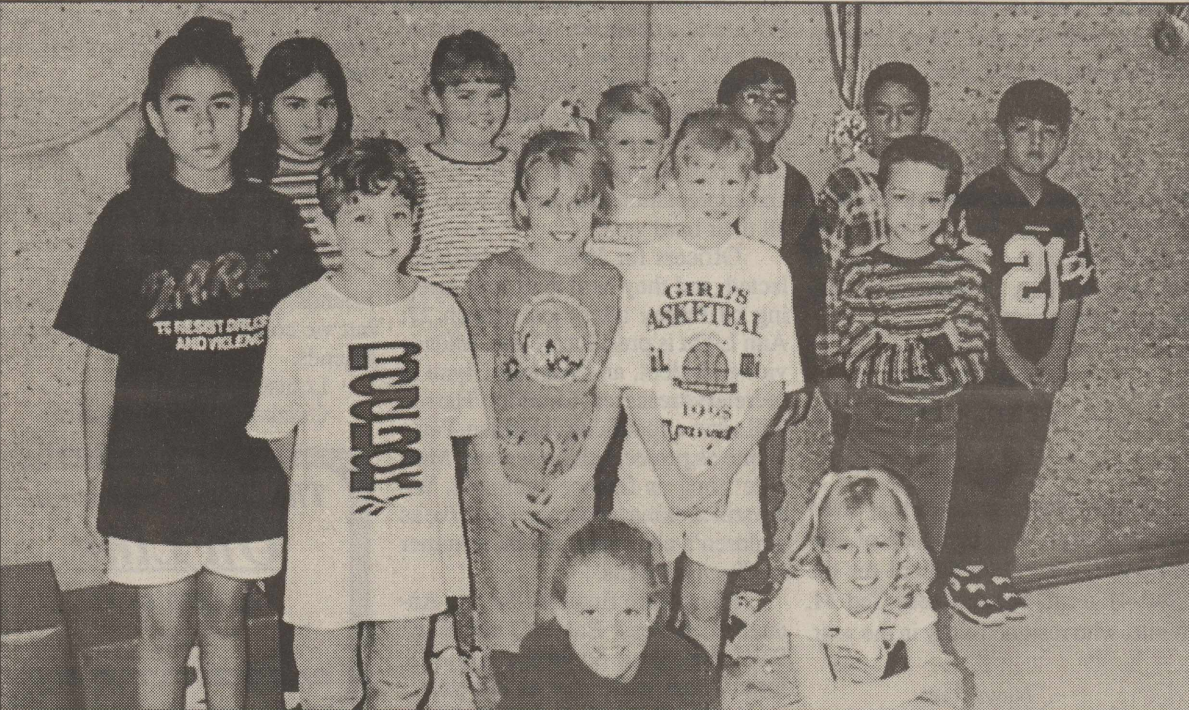

## Jackson nominated as Tandy Scholar

ond with a score of 87. Lactetia Stewart shot 104 in the competition.

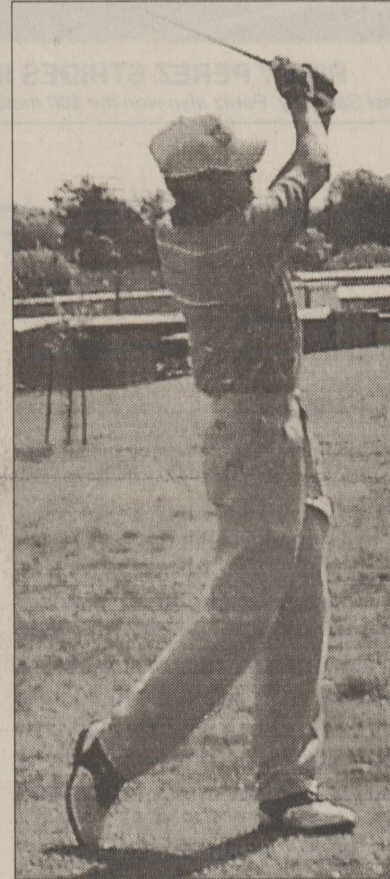

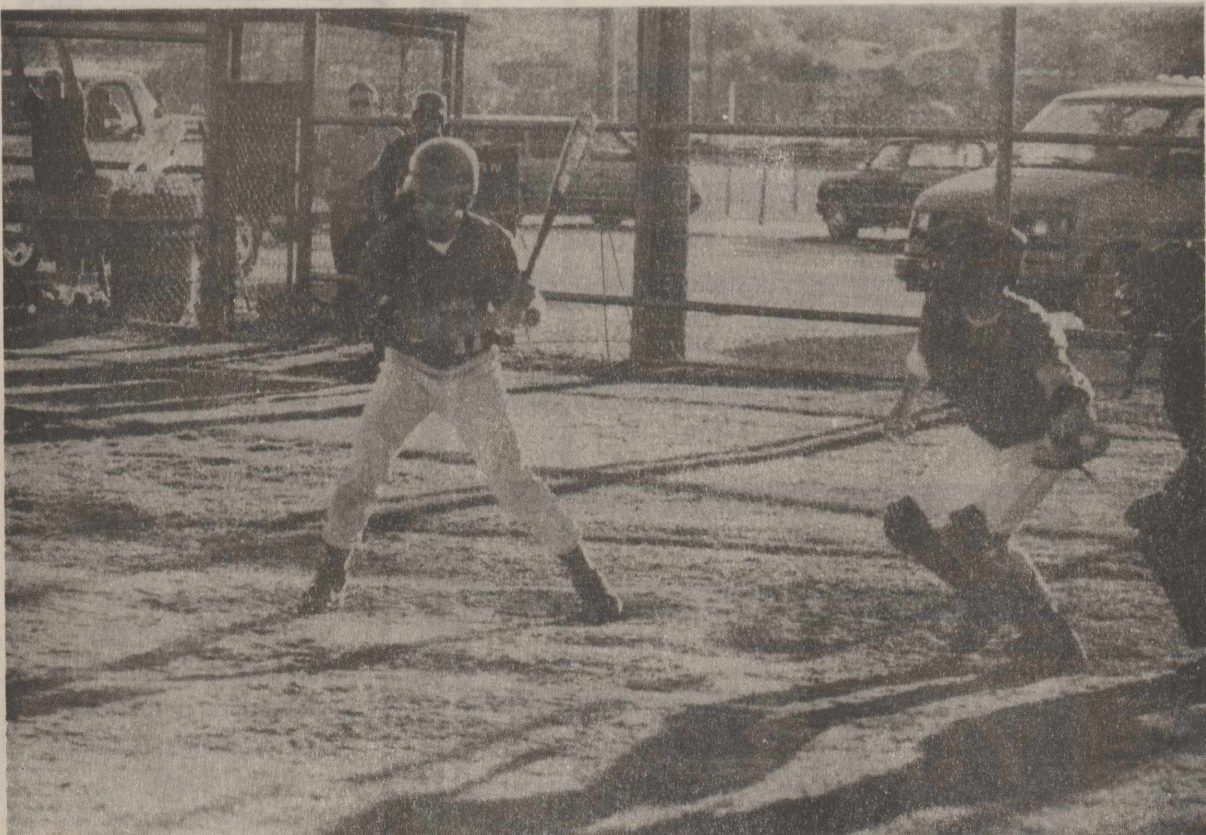
Browne had Ozona's only first place with a 12' leap in the pole vault.

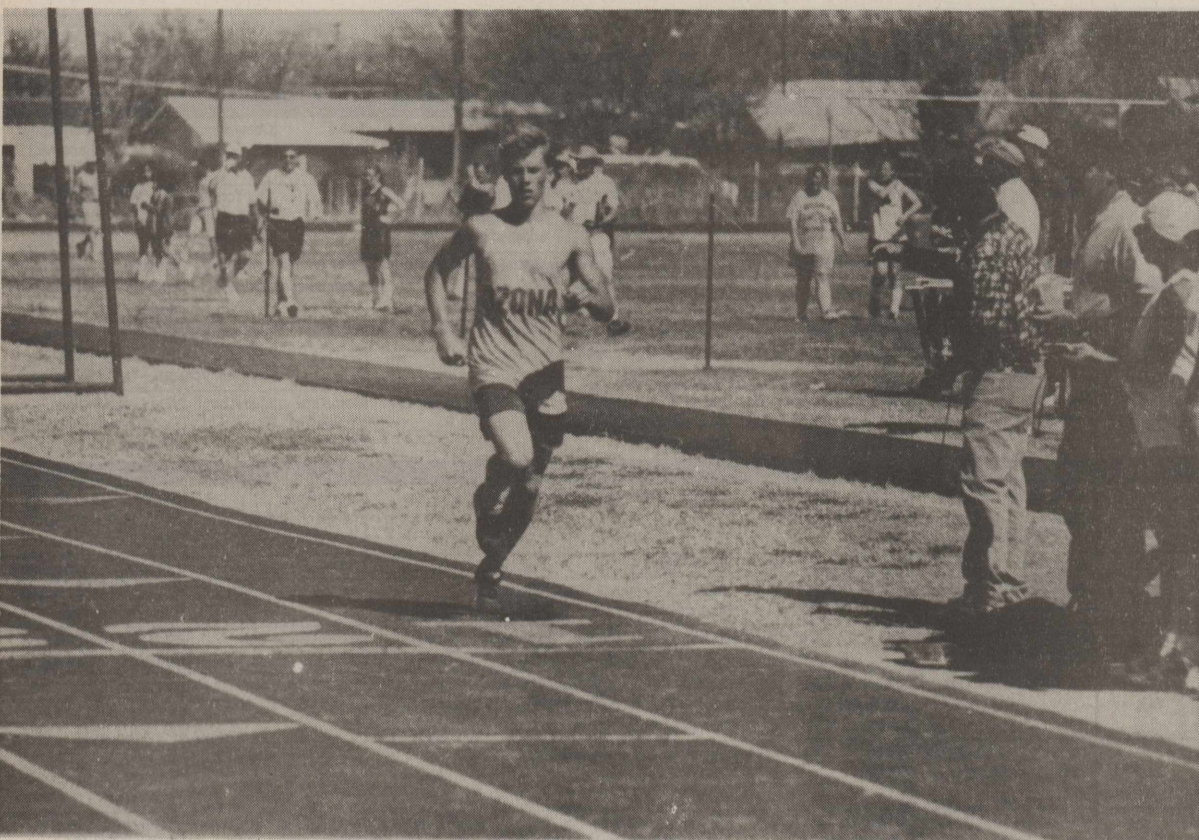

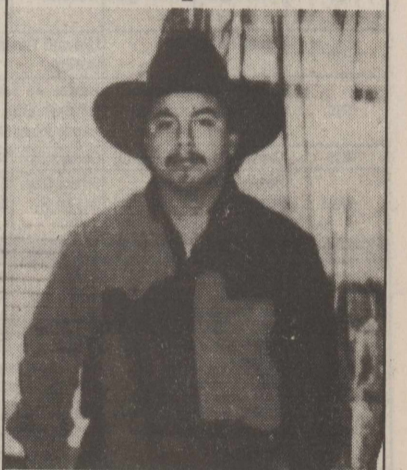

### Weekly Drilling and Completion Report

Union Oil of California has completed the No. 10 Wayne West Ranch "B" 30 miles south of Ozona in Crockett County's Massie Field. The new gas well flowed 514,000-CFD on a 1.5-in. choke and was rated at 2,600,000 CF gas per day on absolute open flow. It was drilled a total of 11,637 feet, horizontally, and will produce from 11,384 feet to hole's end.

First production figures have been filed for the No. 6 Ira Carson "54" located 25 miles southwest of Ozona in Crockett County's Ozona Field. Union Pacific Resources Corp., the operator, took the well to a 7.191-ft. bottom. It flowed at the rate of 120,000-CFD on a 1-in. choke and earned a 128,000-CFD rating on absolute open flow. The well will produce from 6,824 to 6,864 feet into the hole.

Another Union Pacific venture was brought on line 2.12 miles southwest of Ozona in Crockett County's Ozona Field. It is known as the No. 7-C Henderson. The well was rated at 287,000-CFD on absolute open flow and showed ability to flow 253,000-CFD on a 0.75-in. choke. It probed to 6,700 feet total depth and will produce from 6,060 to 6,444 feet into the wellbore.

The No. 1427 Jones Ranch "A" was recently completed 11 miles southeast of Ozona in Crockett County's Henderson Field. Cross Timbers Operating Co. is the operator. Flowing 1,992,000-CFD on a 1.5-in. choke, the well earned a 2,460,000 CF gas per day evaluation on absolute open flow. It was taken to an 8,085-ft. bottom and will produce from 7,874 to 7,924 feet into the hole.

The same Midland-based operator has filed for permit to drill the No. 12 Jean Scheuber "C" 11 miles southeast of Ozona in Crockett County's Angus Field. Location is a 500-acre lease in the TCRR Survey A-4004. The well is under authority for 9,100 feet into the wellbore.

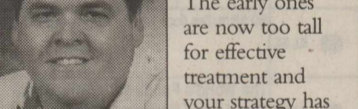


The winds in a tornado travel at up to 300 mph.
