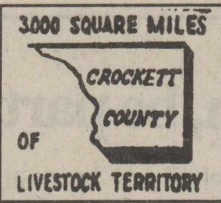

## Water District hires audit firm

On Tuesday, May 11, 1999, the Board of Directors of the Crockett County Water Control and Improvement District No. 1 met in a specially called meeting to discuss matters concerning the District's finances. The Board retained Bickerstaff, Heath, Smiley, Pollan, Keever & McDaniel, L.L.P., an Austin-based law firm, and Jones, Hay, Marshall & McKinney, P.C., a San Angelo-based accounting firm, to assist with an investigative audit of the District's financial books

and records.

In a related matter, the Board voted to place two employees of the District on administrative leave with full pay and benefits until such time as the Board completes the investigation. The Board's action was prompted by unresolved questions concerning the District's finances.

The Board has not reached any conclusions concerning the matters currently under investigation.

## Nurse wins award for school

A \$1,000.00 award for excellence in school health will be given to Ozona Elementary School next month, thanks to the efforts of school nurse Lu Ingram. Mrs. Ingram's entry in the 1999 Awards for Excellence in Texas School Health was the winner in the new program division.

The award will be presented by a representative of the Texas Department of Health at a banquet June 10 in San Marcos.

Mrs. Ingram's entry, "Let's Get Personal", a book about personal hygiene was accompanied by a written narrative as to how the need for the program was identified, how the program was implemented and outcome and results measurement. Need for such a program was realized when the nurse was approached by teachers and parents, health risks confronting students and staff, health needs surveys and absentee reports were indicators

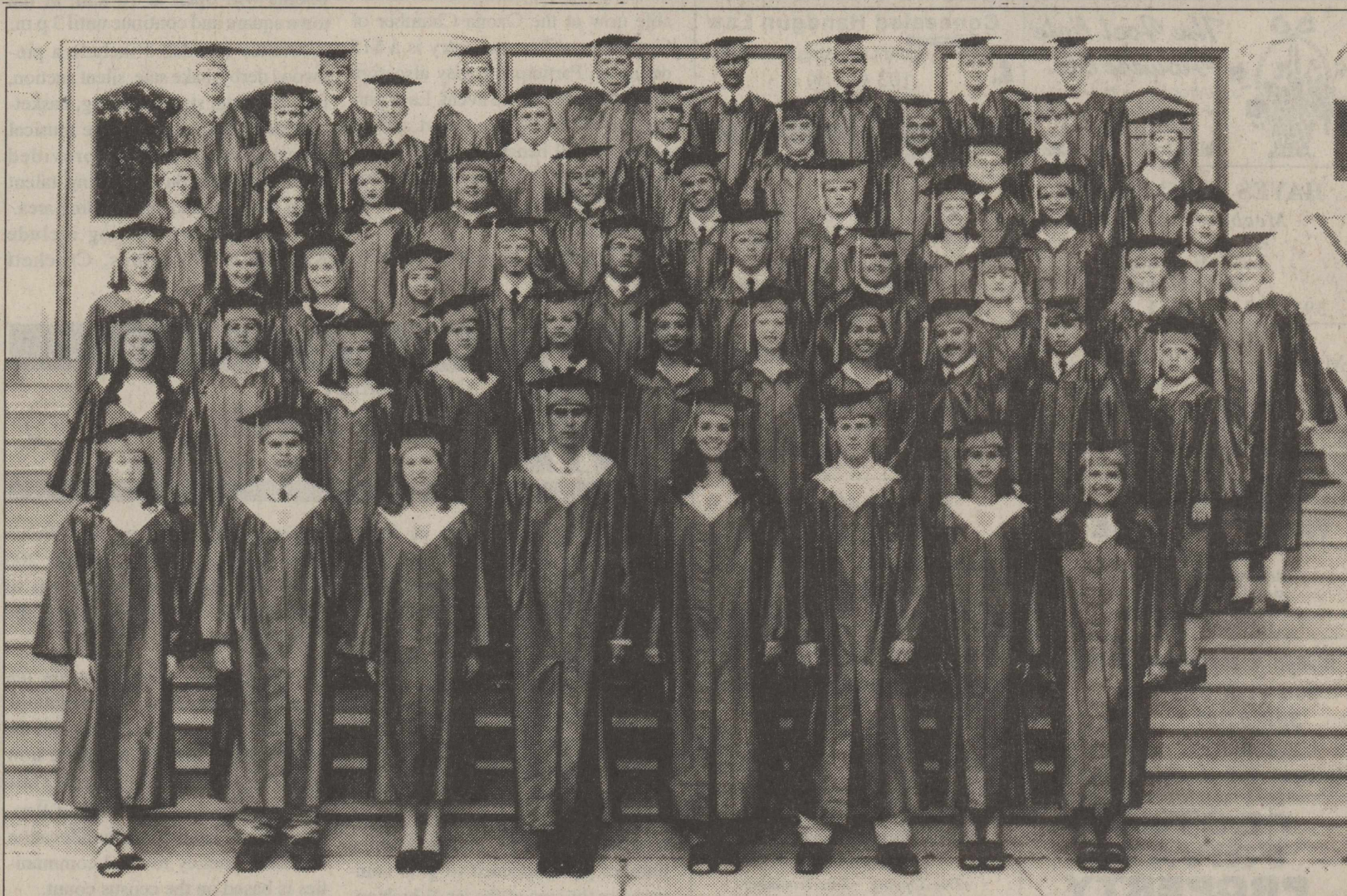
of need.

Each phase of instruction on personal hygiene began with the showing of a video. Mrs. Ingram constructed coloring books with information to follow and talked with the children about health and staying healthy. A skit performed for the young students by high school students was also part of the year-long study on personal hygiene.

Awards for Excellence supports the philosophy that health promotion must start in the formative years when children develop their skills and behaviors for life. Further, the program recognizes that school staff can and do play an influential role in modeling behaviors for students. The program honors schools that demonstrate their on-going commitment to preventive practices among students, staff as healthy role models, and school/community collaboration.

## Juror selection progresses in White trial

The capital murder trial of Melvin H. White, which opened last week in Fort Stockton, picked up speed this week with three more prospective jurors selected Monday. This brings to six the first stage of jury selection, which began last week with only three selections at the end of the week Friday. A total of 400 men and women were called for jury duty. Around 170 persons will make up the first pool out of which the 12 jurors and two alternates will be named to the final panel.

112th District Judge Brock Jones was pleased with the pickup in pace this week and feels the final panel will be completed in less time than at first indicated. Each juror is being interviewed and questioned personally due to the fact District Attorney Ori White

is asking for the death penalty and has refused to take a guilty plea. Under capital murder charges, a jury trial is required.

White is charged with the sexual assault and beating death of nine-year-old Jennifer Gravell in Ozona Aug. 5 of 1998 after he led officers to the

child's body following a manhunt for the missing girl. An autopsy report revealed the child died of massive head injuries.

White has been incarcerated in Crockett County Jail since that time. The trial was moved to Fort Stockton on a change of venue granted by Judge

Jones late last year. He was transported to Fort Stockton by Sheriff Shane Fenton and a deputy earlier this month.

District Attorney Ori White will head up the prosecution, and court appointed attorney Kirk Hawkins of San Angelo will open for the defense.

## Sousa Award presented to Leticia Ortiz

The John Philip Sousa Award, the highest tribute an American high school can pay to a band member, was presented to Leticia Ortiz May 13 at the Lion Band's annual spring concert. Leticia is the 33rd Ozona recipient of this award. She received her certificate of award from Director Kelly Glaze amid a round of applause from

the large crowd enjoying the concert on the town square. Leticia's name will be engraved on a plaque which is permanently displayed in the band hall trophy case.

This senior student was also elected Band Sweetheart for the 1998-99 school year. She and Band Beau Eric Garza were presented plaques by Mr. Glaze.

These two students were among the 14 seniors who gave their final performance as members of the Ozona High School Band. During their high school years, these bandsmen have been instrumental in earning four sight-reading superior ratings, two concert performance superior ratings and four marching band superior ratings. They have earned two trips to

U.I.L. Area-Level marching contests in Fort Worth.

Introducing the 14 was Tripp Farris, master of ceremonies for the concert. ## Sanchez takes the bronze at state

Ozona Lady Lion Lori Sanchez finalized her high school sports career in Austin last Thursday as she competed in two events, 800m and 1600m runs, at the state track meet, May 15 at the Mike A. Myers Track and Field Stadium on the University of Texas campus.

Sanchez first ran in the Class 2A girls' 800m run; however, she only placed 6th in it with a time of 2:25.19, which was not one of her better runs. Therefore when it was time to run the 1600m she knew this would be her last chance to win a medal in her high school career. She finished the race of her life, clocking in with 5 minutes, 33:58, nearly 9 seconds better than her regional performance.

Sanchez said she was disappointed with her run in the 800m and vowed to run her best to be a medalist winner in the 1600m, the last race of

her senior year.

In Sanchez's high school career, she can claim 4 district championships in the 3200m run, and this year she added a district championship in the 800m, an event she just began running this year. She also won the Clint Harris Award for Most Outstanding Girl Athlete this year. She was also named Academic All-District in track this year, plus winning the 1999 Fighting Heart Award in track, and several other cross country awards.

Lori said after capturing the bronze medal in the 1600m run at state, "I am very happy and proud of myself. I want to thank everyone for their support and I want to especially thank my family. I also want to thank Joel and Coach Alan Phillips and his wife Jodi for all their support. They have given me the courage to strive to be the best I could be. They never gave up on me. they are a special part of who I am today, and I will carry them in my heart for the rest of my life."

## Clark places 5th in state pole vault

Ozona Lion pole vaulter Cade Clark competed in the pole vault event at the state track meet held at the Mike A. Myers Track and Field Stadium on the University of Texas campus in Austin Friday, May 14. Clark, a junior at Ozona High School, was ranked the fourth best pole vaulter in Class 2A in the State of Texas before com-

peting in the 1999 state championships.

Clark successfully vaulted 12 feet 6 inches on his first attempt, and moved on to the 13 foot mark which he cleared on his final attempt. He then cleared 13 feet 6 inches on his last attempt, but was unable to clear 14 feet in three tries, eliminating him and placing him in fifth place, just one vault away from fourth place.

Let's say you have a jar full of jelly beans. It's a colorful jar filled with red, green, yellow, orange and pink jelly beans. Your job is to count the jelly beans. Your goal is to find out the total number of jelly beans in the jar.

You have two options. The first option is to count every jelly bean in the jar to get an accurate total number. The second option is to grab a handful of jelly beans and try to guess how many are in the jar based on the number you happened to grab compared to the size of the jar. Which option do you think will give you the most accurate number? Well, counting every jelly bean, of course.

In April of the year 2000, the United States of America will count

its people. This is nothing new. We've done this every decade for over 200 years. The objective is clear, it is to find out how many people live in the United States.

Conducting a census every ten years is mandated in our Constitution. The Constitution also directs that the results of the census determine how many representatives each state should get in the U.S. House of Representatives. In addition, the allocation of federal money to local communities is based on the census count.

And while no one is arguing about the need for the census, many are arguing about the most accurate way to conduct it. Some want to count

every person. Others want to statistically sample, or estimate, the population. But statistical sampling is not a fair way to assess how many people live in America. It is basically just guesswork and it is unreliable.

The Supreme Court has ruled that statistical sampling is illegal for apportioning congressional seats among the states. The Court knows that the only way to get an accurate census is to count every person. Anything less than a head count is just politically motivated guesswork. And the only way to keep politics out of the census is to get an accurate count by counting every person.

We must do everything we can to get a precise and accurate head count of Americans. We must also keep politics out of the census process. Counting each and every American is the only fair way to achieve an accurate, nonpolitical census. By counting every American, we will have an accurate census we can count on.

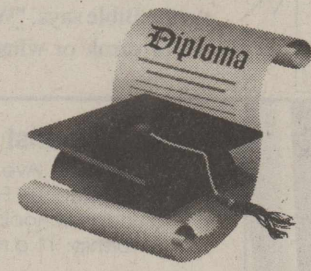

## Ozona School trustees hire new teachers

In their May regular board meeting that was held on Tuesday, May 11, members of the Ozona School Board approved 1999-2000 school year teaching and coaching contracts for four new personnel. Mr. Lynn Sears, presently teaching at Denver City ISD, was approved for employment to teach high school government and economics, as was Mr. Benjy Unger, also from Denver City, who will teach middle school physical education. Sears takes the place of Clay Riddle, who resigned recently, and Mr. Unger takes the place of Dane Vickers, who was approved for transfer to eighth grade social studies with high school coaching responsibilities.

Other personnel approved for employment were Mr. Bobby Azam, currently teaching in Andrews, to teach physical science next year, and Mrs. Renee Taylor, presently teaching in Denver City, as the district librarian. Mr. Azam takes the place of Alan Phillips, who has also resigned, and Mrs. Taylor takes the place of Sherry York, high school librarian who retired last week.

During the meeting, Mae Lay, school business manager, administered the oath of office to recently elected trustees George Ybarra and Billy Cunningham, and the members elected by acclamation the same school board officers as last year. These are: Wade Richardson, board president; David Bean, board vice-president; and Elliott Barrera, board secretary. During voting on the board officers for the 1999-2000 school year, Richardson, Bean and Barrera abstained from voting.

The board held a public hearing on the use of the district's federal Title

I and VI funds for next year, and the trustees approved the district's continued participation in the Texas Goals 2000 Grant for reading improvement through the Region XV Education Service center. They also approved the appointment of Superintendent of Schools Larry Taylor to serve on the Region XV Education Service Center Regional Advisory Committee.

During the meeting, Donny Wiley, principal of Ozona High School, presented the 1999 Texas Assessment of Academic Skills (TAAS) Exit Level Report for Ozona High School sophomores. In reading 83% of the students passed the state-mandated exam, with 60% of the students mastering all objectives. In mathematics 84% passed, and 37% mastered all objectives on the test. In writing 91% of the sophomores passed, and 55% of the students mastered all of the tested objectives.

The board approved the appointment of Veronica Tijerina as the board's delegate and Billy Cunningham as the alternate delegate to the Texas Association of School Administrators-Texas Association of School Boards Joint Annual Convention that will be held in Houston on Oct. 8-11, 1999.

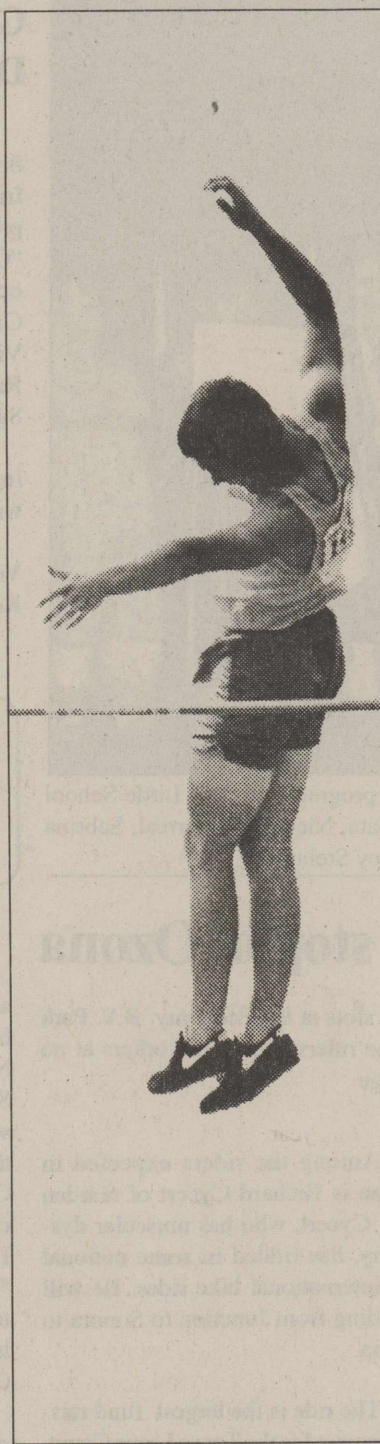
The trustees approved the use of Channel One at Ozona High School and Ozona Middle School next year. Superintendent Larry Taylor told the members that Channel One will install a television monitor in every classroom at Ozona High School and Ozona Middle School at no charge if the district will allow the showing of the Channel One News Broadcast for students. "The Channel One News is a quality news program for students that will be shown daily for approximately 10-12 minutes. The only drawback to the Channel One News is the

showing of commercials during the program. The commercials are also of good quality, but some people have not liked the idea of showing commercials in schools. The Channel One concept is one where the private sector and the public sector work together to the benefit of both," Taylor said, "and the monitors can be used by the high school and the middle school for showing instructional videos before and after the news."

The school board also approved the letting of bids or bid quotations for the 1999-2000 school year in the following order: (1) bids for school gasoline products will be approved in the June board meeting; (2) quotations for band instruments to be purchased during the school year will be approved in the June board meeting; (3) bids for athletic supplies will be approved in the June board meeting; (4) bids for property, liability, vehicle and worker's compensation will be approved in the July board meeting; (5) bids for cafeteria products will be approved in the July board meeting; and, (6) bids for employee health insurance will be approved in the August board meeting.

During the meeting the trustees also approved the 1999-2000 school year calendar as recommended by the district-level site-based decision-making committee. Next year's calendar is very similar to this year, and teaching personnel will report for work on Thursday, Aug. 5. The first day of classes will be on Wednesday, Aug. 11. Spring break has been moved to Angelo State University's spring break date of March 13-17, 2000.

The meeting was adjourned following an affirmative vote to set the date and time of the board's June regular meeting on Tuesday, June 15, at 7:00 p.m.

### A note from the Sports Desk

I traveled to Austin last Thursday to cover Cade Clark and Lori Sanchez as they competed at the 1999 UIL State Track and Field Championships Meet. I just happened to be at the meet as the 3A boys' pole vaulting event was being held and I was able to get to see the nation's best pole vaulter as he shattered the state and national pole vaulting records.

Eric Eshbach, senior at Orangefield High School, set a new state and national pole vault record at 18 feet 2 1/4 inches. The previous national mark of 17 feet 9 1/2 inches was last set by Joe Dial of Marlow, OK in 1981 in Oklahoma City. The previous mark for the State of Texas was set by Jayson Lavendar of Wichita Falls in 1990 with a vault of 17 feet 6 inches.

Eshbach's vault also broke what the U.S. Track and Field Association had classified as the best American schoolboy mark ever recorded. Brandon Richardson vaulted 18-

2 in Eugene, Oregon in 1985, but his mark was set the summer before he entered college, and was not considered the National Federation record. When the pole reached the height of 17 feet 3 inches Eshbach and Johnathan Henley, also a senior at Orangefield High School, were the only two vaulters in Class 3A still vaulting. Henley was eliminated after unsuccessfully clearing the pole in three attempts capturing the Silver Medal.

Eshbach clenched the Gold and set a new record when he cleared 17-6, 17-10 and 18-0 all on his first try, as a crowd of 3,000 cheered him on. He recorded his first miss of the day at 18-2 1/4 as his hand just barely grazed the bar, knocking it down. On his final attempt, his hand again grazed the bar, but it did not fall this time, giving him the new national record.

Eshbach and teammate Henley both signed full scholarships to Nebraska University in November of last year.

Beasley is the son of Charles M. and Martha Beasley of Ozona. He is a 1998 graduate of Ozona High School.



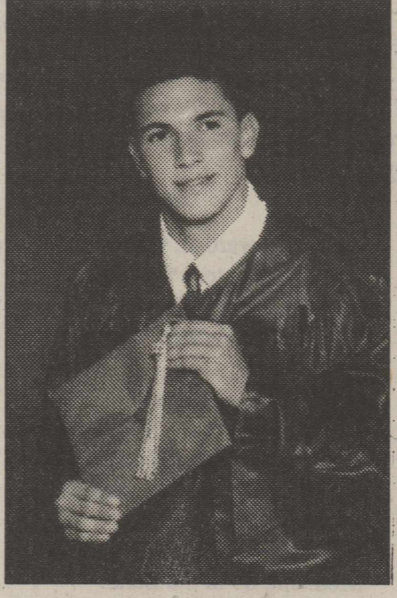
