School accepting nominations for gifted and talented program
The Crockett County Consoli-
them for this program is asked to go in the process of accepting nomina tions for its gifted and talented program for students with exceptional in tellectual abilities.

According to Assistant Superin tendent Ted Cotton, gifted/talented
students are those who excel tently or who show the potential to excel in any one or a combination of the following areas: general intellec tual ability, specific subject matter aptitude, creative and productive think-
ing ability, leadership ability, ability ing ability, leadership ability, ability in the visual and performing arts, and psychomotor ability

Students in the local program are identified and served in the area of general intellectual ability," Cotton said. "This area is defined as possessing superior intelligence with potenual to perform complex mental tasks.
At the present time, students in gifted and talented program are working on developing more higher-level thinking skills beyond what is normally required in the regular classroom. Gifted/talented education does not take the place of the regular classroom but supplements and provides
time for students to use their thinkin time for students to use their thinking and reasoning skills to a greater de-
gree." .
Identification of gifted/talented studens is very complex and compre-
hensive, consisting of two distinct steps: (1) nomination and screening and (2) selection. In the nomination and screening phase, a student may be nominated for the program by his/her parent or guardian, by a teacher, or by another person. Once a student is
nominated, he/she will be given two nominated, he/she will be given two nationally-developed tests of higherlevel thinking skills to determine the student's potential to succeed in the
program, and after all data has been program, and after all data has been
collected on each child, a committee of professional educators will review this information and determine which additional students qualify for inclusion in the program.
