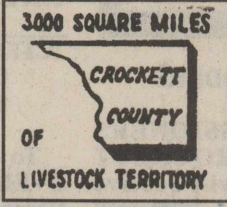

## 1999 county rainfall sparse

Drought conditions in Crockett County may have produced dusty, barren pastures, but the scarcity of rain has yet to cause a serious drop in the water table.

The 30 wells measured each November by Emerald Underground Water District showed no substantial decrease, "a little, but not much," said district manager Dennis Clark.

"The average on the 30 wells measured was down .7885, approximately three-fourths of a foot.

"Surprisingly enough, with no more recharge than we've had, water levels have stayed stabilized," said Clark. The topography of the land has a lot to do with water levels, Clark explained, rather than different rainfall amounts in various parts of the county.

Emerald has one well in Ozona which it monitors daily, and the Crockett County WC&ID#1 monitors wells daily on the east and west hills of Ozona, at the Thompson Ranch north of town and at Crockett Heights.

The average monthly water level for the Emerald well was 328.42 feet for the year. The water was at its highest in July at a depth of 326.98 feet and at its lowest in October at the 329.70 foot level.

The lowest level for the east hill wells was at 379.97 feet in January 1999, and the highest was in June with a depth of 359.09 feet. The west hill water elevation was at a depth of 329.7 feet for its lowest in October and at its highest level in July at 326.98 feet.

Emerald Underground also places

official rain gauges around the county, and this past year's results from the 22 locations which submitted their data showed a countywide average of 13.23 inches.

Buck Owens in the northeast part of the county recorded 23.85" for the highest rainfall, and Dan Riggs in the west part of the county had the least 6.8".

The official rainfall record for Ozona is updated yearly by Pon

Seahorn from records kept by CCWC&ID#1. 1999's total of 17.90, while ahead of the previous three years, makes the seventh consecutive year with less than 20 inches of rainfall for the town.

While the 9-year average for the 1991-1999 period is 18.18", two of those years have seen less than 14 inches of rain. Totals for 1991 and 1992 were 22.220 and 25.500 respectively.

## Lacrecia Varela injured in Ozona laundromat explosion Sunday

"There were four washers with clothes that smelled like gasoline," Fire Marshal Steve Kenley said.

An explosion at the local laundromat on Ave. E resulted in a 911 call for assistance to an injured woman, Lacrecia Varela, last weekend. Mrs. Varela is reported to have received first degree burns shortly before noon Sunday when the front was blown loose on two washing machines on the south side of the room. She was taken by EMS ambulance to meet Medivac for transport to Shannon Hospital in San Angelo.

Two other people who were in the laundry at the time were not injured.

The explosion, which blew the windows out of the building, may have been caused by gas vapors from

clothing which had been soaked in gasoline according to Fire Marshal Steve Kenley.

"There were four washers with clothes that smelled like gasoline," Kenley said. A clothing sample was taken from each washer and sent to the state fire marshal's office for testing. "A determination will be made based on the lab report," Kenley said, "but I suspect gasoline." Sometimes gas vapors around the motor ignite, Kenley explained. Gasoline is used to soak greasy clothing before it is washed.

Tests performed in the building by NatGas showed no sign of a natural gas leak.

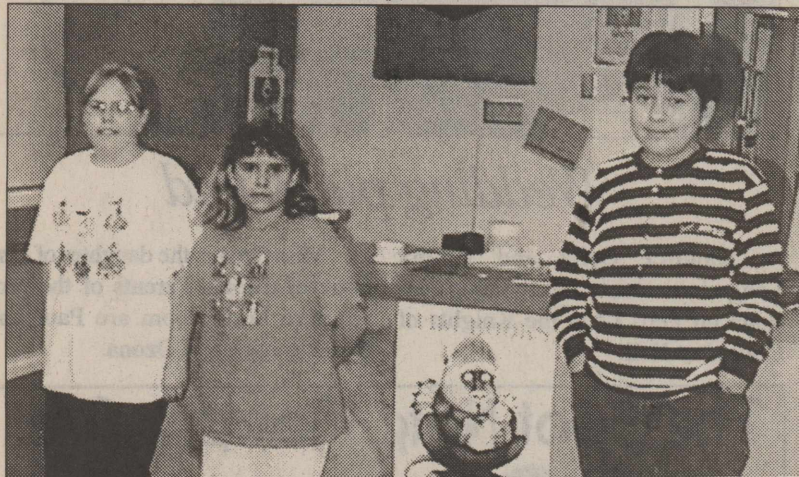

### Sophie Kyle honored on 90th birthday

A reception honoring former teacher Sophie Kyle was held Jan. 29 to celebrate her 90th birthday. The friendly, bubbling lady was the center of attention in a beautifully appointed Crockett Room Saturday afternoon surrounded by family and friends. Hosting the gathering were her daughter, Kay Alexander of Abilene, and son, Art Kyle of Colorado Springs, CO, their spouses and families.

Sophie Haug came to Ozona to teach in 1936 at the request of Supt. Bishop. A teacher already here was from her hometown and suggested that Mr. Bishop call about a job. It was the following year when she married Arthur Kyle.

Mrs. Kyle taught in Ozona Primary School off and on for 17 years, taking time out to have and raise three children, Art, Kay and George. George died in adulthood following an automobile accident.

Most of her teaching was done in the kindergarten, but she also taught second grade and one year of third grade. The funniest story Mrs. Kyle tells from her years of teaching occurred soon after she came to Ozona shortly before Christmas that year.

The classroom was arranged for a party and in came 4-year-old Charles McDonald dressed in a suit. Everyone sat down to eat and little Charles spilled his milk, she remembers.

"Oh, Charles, you've spilled milk all over you," she said looking at the suit with dismay.

Then mimicking a little boy's gruff voice, she delivers the punch line. "That's all right; it didn't get on my napkin," Charles said.

Her teaching career ended in retirement at age 65, although she did substitute some.

Mrs. Kyle keeps fit by exercising every morning. "I feel a lot better after I do it," she says.

Mrs. Kyle and the children were at her parents' home in Marlin when Ozona was flooded in 1954. They reached Brady on the way home before learning of the tragedy.

"All three kids got up in the front seat with me; nobody said a word, 'move over' or anything; they were in a trance." They reached Ozona to learn that water had reached as high as Mr. Kyle's shoulder in their home, the home she still lives in today.

Art and his wife reside in Colorado Springs, CO, where he is a meteorologist for the U. S. Air Force. Kay and her husband make their home in Abilene where she is head of the Heart Association and a member of the city council. Grandchildren Jenny Kyle and Matt Kyle both live in Austin. Jay Alexander and Lawre Alexander both make their home Irving. George's adopted daughters are Ginger Kyle of Denver, CO, and Kathy Kyle of New Mexico. Mrs. Kyle has two great-granddaughters, the children of Matt and his wife.

She is a charter member of Ozona Woman's Forum, a member of the Ozona Country Club where she plays bridge, a member of Ozona United Methodist church and a former Sunday School teacher. Mrs. Kyle enjoys sports on television and keeps up with most of them.

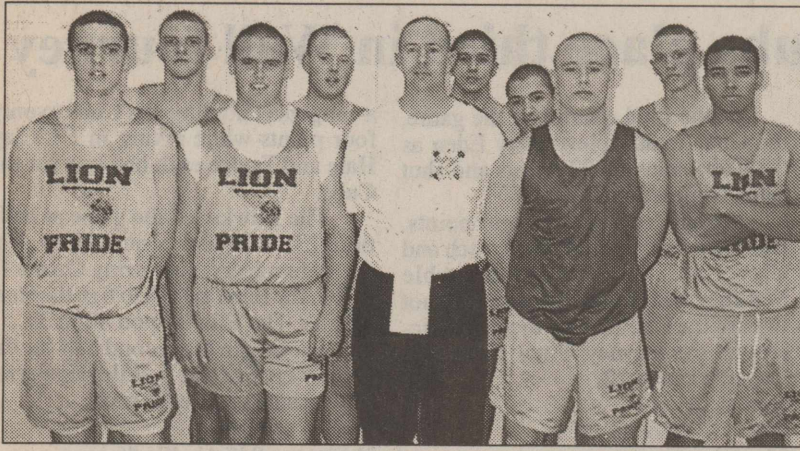

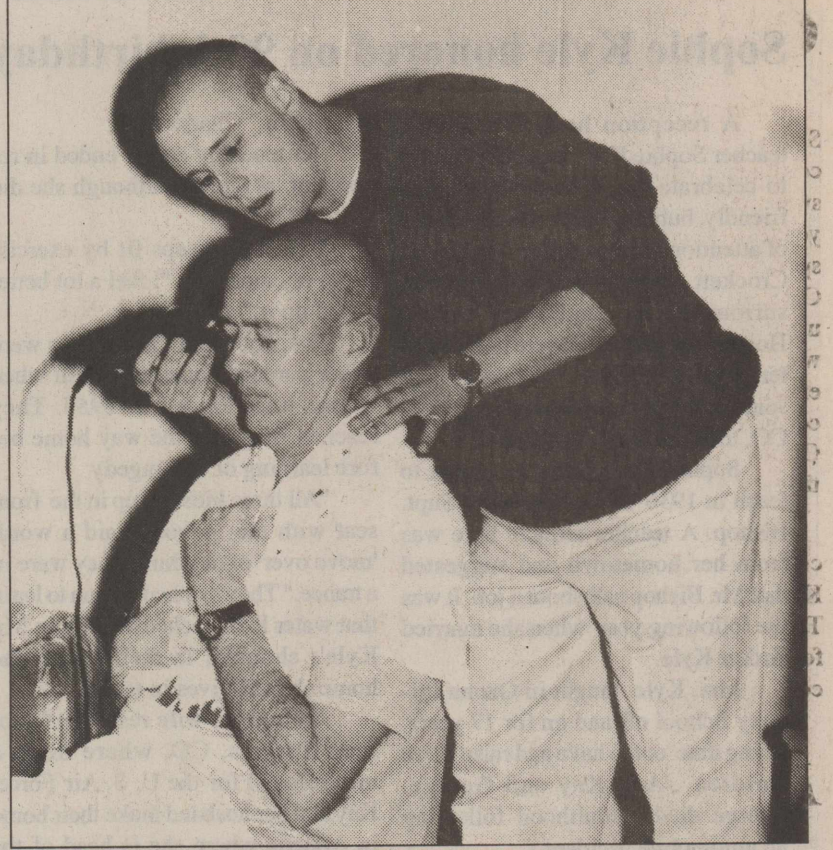

The halftime score was Lady Broncos 14, Lady Lions 9.

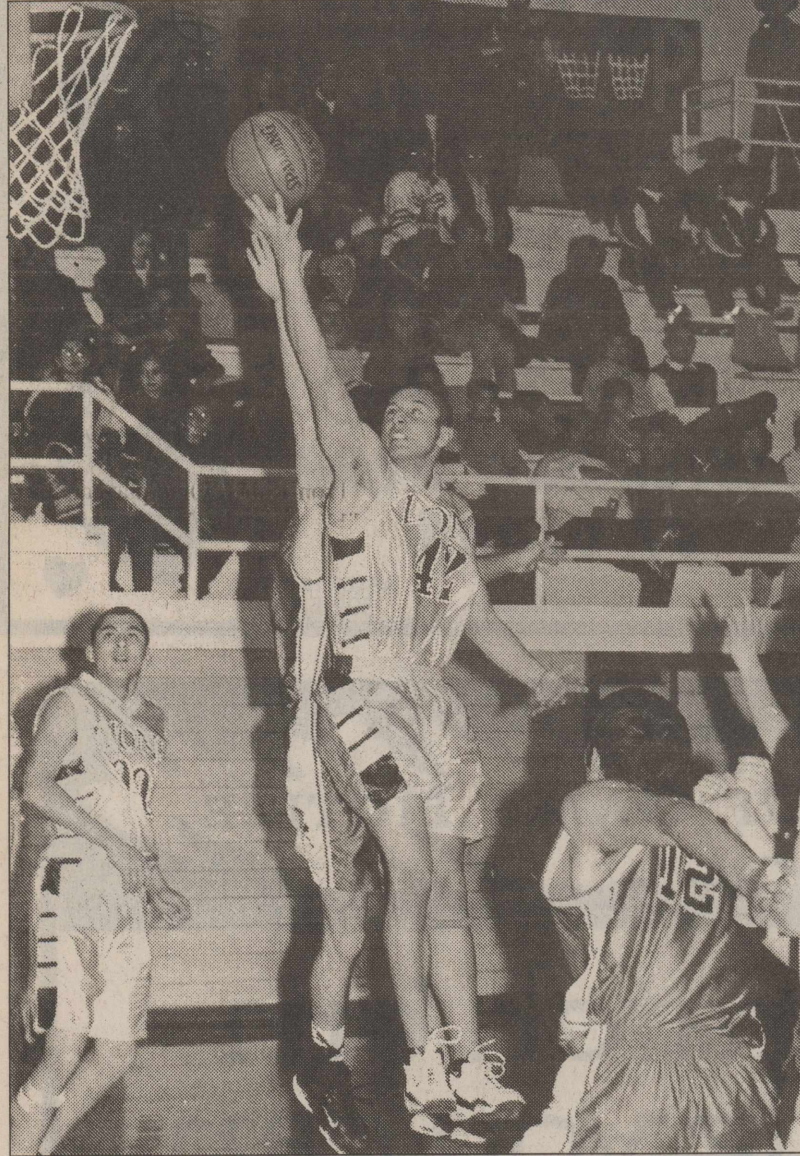

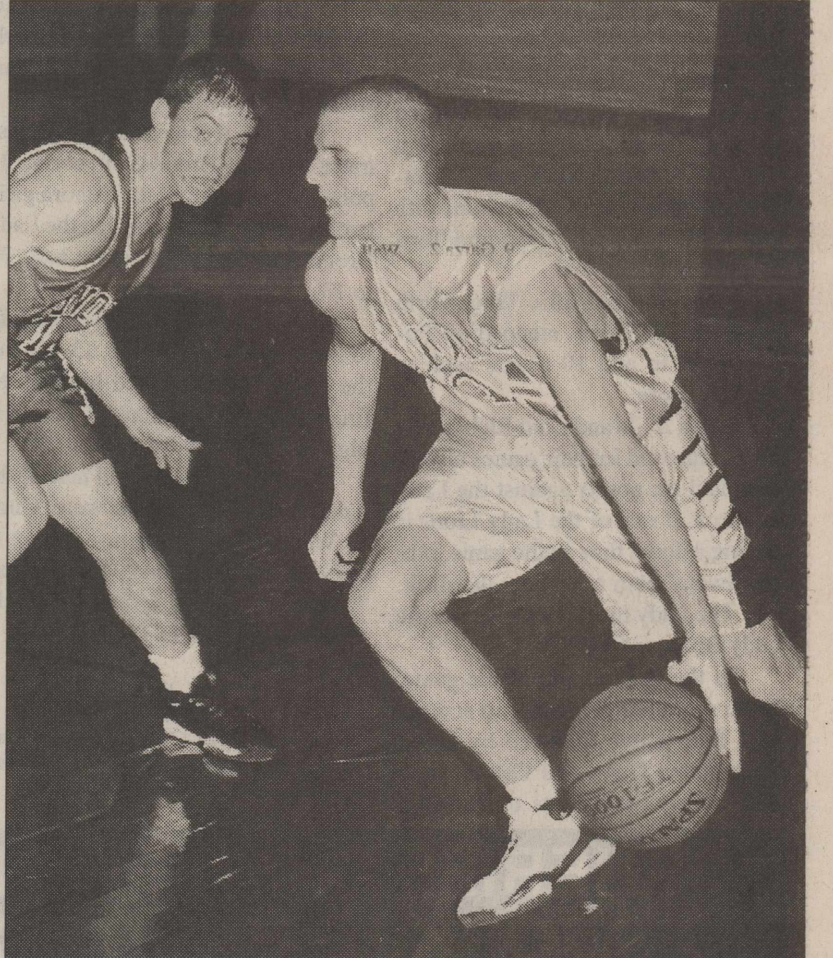

Eric Webb and 7 Lori Jackson. Ozona's math and number sense teams placed second at the meet, and the calculator and science teams were fifth.

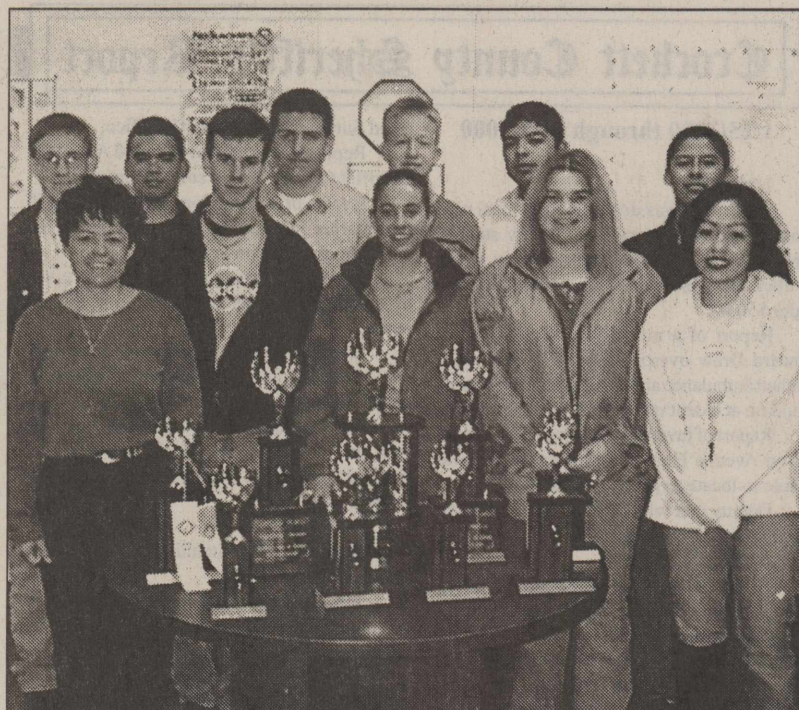

### Air Force agrees not to increase bomber training sorties in West Texas

U.S. Rep. Henry Bonilla, R-Texas, confirmed today that the Air Force has agreed to not increase the number of bomber training sorties over West Texas.  
"I made it clear to the Air Force Chief of Staff that adding any additional bomber training sorties was unacceptable and unfair to my constituents. He listened, and the current proposal will not allow even one more bomber to fly over West Texas," said Bonilla.  
The Air Force has said that even though air space over Far West Texas will most likely be used for combat training, the number of bomber training flights will not be increased. Instead, more men and women will be trained on each bomber training flight, therefore cutting down on the number of flights.  
Last month, the Air Force released an RBTI (Realistic Bomber Training Initiative) proposal which called for an increase of 1,100 low level bomber training sorties over the 23rd Congressional District, represented by Bonilla.  
In response to that proposal, Bonilla sent a letter to General Ryan. In the letter, Bonilla argued against the increase saying, "My constituents are already make a major contribution to military readiness by tolerating a substantial number of training sorties at this time." The letter was sent a week after a phone call Bonilla made to General Ryan to express his concerns.  
The official announcement by the Air Force is expected to come next week.
