## OSHA＇s ergonomics proposal on hold

Washington，D．C．－U．S．Rep．Henry Bonilla，R－Texas，welcomed th Occupational Safety and Health Administration＇s decision today to wait little longer before letting its ergonomics proposal become law．The deadline
for public comment，originally slated for Tuesday，will be extended to March 2．The ergonomics proposal was announced last year on November 22 ． ＂A longer extension is really needed for a regulation of this magnitude but I am pleased to see that OSHA has listened to the concerns of many of us both here in Congress and in the small business community．The comment ime that had been proposed was incredibly short，＂said Bonilla．＂It is ridicu－ lous to claim that 60 days is adequate time for small businesses owners to horoughly review this 1000 page regulation．＂

Ergonomics refers to injuries caused by repeated motions．No unbiased evidence exists that fully documents the extent and causes of these injuries．
Under OSHA＇s proposal，about 1.6 million companies that employ workers in very physical jobs，such as production or manufacturing，would have to in very physical jobs，such as production or manufacturing，would have to
have a basic ergonomics program．While OSHA claims the regulation would cost around $\$ 4$ billion，the Small Business Administration estimates the pro－ posal will cost more than $\$ 18$ billion per year．

The National Academy of Sciences is currently studying ergonomic in juries and any link they may have to the workplace．The administration has fought against this study by experts．The study was commissioned by Con－ gress in 1998 and is expected to be completed in January 2001.
