And I didn't begin the project in the middle of the day when it was 105 . m not THAT dumb. I started early with sanding, then I tried paint stripper then Naval Jelly Rust Remover, the only thing that worked. Unfortunately,
there was just a little left in the container. Next weekend I'll tackle the barbecue pit with a full bottle of the stuff and rinse that rust away. Then I can spray on the paint that is guaranteed up to 1200 degrees.
When it dries, we will cook burgers. The blob of paint stripper I accidentally got on the grill last weekend (I couldn't get the rack to come out) should
