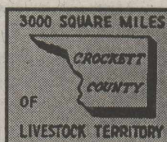

Commissioners grant tax abatement

A three year, 100 percent tax abatement was granted to Cielo Wind Power by commissioners Monday night. In the agreement, Cielo will contribute \$100,000.00 to the county's general fund each year of the abatement.

Freddie Nicks voted against, holding to his proposal for a three year, 50 percent abatement.

Pleas Childress abstained. The vote went the same way on an agenda item to designate a reinvestment zone for the windmill project.

The abatement is for Cielo's \$130 million Noelke Hill project. Sixty million of the project will be in Crockett County.

Terms of the agreement will be fine-tuned and are to be examined by County Attorney Bill Mason. Robert Peña, representing Cielo, said he could have a contract ready for examination by the end of next week.

Judge Johnny Jones affirmed his reluctance to give any abatement shortly before a vote was taken on the motion by Frank Tambunga. Jones, Tambunga and Rudy Martinez voted for the abatement.

Construction of the wind farm is to begin in 2003 and will take eight to 14 months to complete according to Peña.

Identity theft scam alert

Financial institutions are being alerted that some customers may be unwitting subjects of a new fraud scheme that steals their identity and money, says Jim Skehan, president of Crockett National Bank.

Issued by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation, the alert says the scheme uses fictitious Internal Revenue Service forms and fraudulent bank correspondence. Documents are being circulated nationwide to customers of banks of all sizes in an attempt to get the customer to disclose personal and banking information.

When the perpetrator of the fraud contacts the bank by what-

ever means, he or she has enough personal information to appear credible.

The false IRS form being sent out is headed W-9095, Application Form For Certificate Status/Ownership For Withholding Tax.

The letter purporting to be from a bank asks for help in updating resident, non-resident alien and citizens records.

Anyone who has completed and returned the fictitious form should notify all financial institutions where they do business. If any accounts have been fraudulently accessed or opened, the cus-

In their regular monthly meeting that was held on Tuesday, May 14, members of the Ozona School Board witnessed the administration of the oath of office by Mrs. Cynthia Hokit, district business manager and notary public in the State of Texas, to Kenny Wadsworth who is the unopposed trustee in single member District Number Five. Trustee George Ybarra, from single member District Number two, will be given the oath of office at a later date.

Following the administration of the oath of office, the board re-organized for the upcoming year. Officers elected to serve on the Crockett County Consolidated Common School District Board of Trustees are: President, Elliott Barrera; Vice-President, Laurie Hale, and Secretary, Veronica Tijerina.

Approval of the agenda was followed by the open forum portion of the meeting. Mr. Robert Peña and Ms. Melissa Miller of Cielo Wind Power appeared before the board during the open forum session in order to request a placement on the June 2002 board agenda for the purpose of

During the meeting, the board approved: the taking of bids for gasoline products for the 2002-03 school year to be approved in the June regular board meeting; the taking of quotations for band instruments to be purchased during the 2002-03 school year to be approved in the June regular board meeting; the taking of bids for athletic supplies for the 2002-03 school year to be approved in the June regularly board meeting; the taking of bids of property, liability, vehicle and workers' compensation insurance for the 2002-03 school year to be approved in the July board meeting; the taking of bids for cafeteria products for the 2002-03 school year to be approved in the July regular board meeting; and the employee health insurance costs with participation in the Legislative required TRS Active Care for the 2002-03 school year to be done in the August regular board meeting.

A Revised District Integrated Pest Management Program was presented by school maintenance supervisor Ray Don Myers and was approved by the board.

Also during the meeting the trustees went into executive session to conduct business related to personnel. Emerging out of the

executive session, the board voted to approve a release and separation agreement for a teacher/coach as negotiated by the district's attorney and teacher/coach attorney. The board also approved a revised employment contract for the new superintendent, Jim Rumage.

Approved to be hired as new employees for the 2002-03 school year were Sam Justiss as teacher/coach and Wendy Justiss, high school English. Mrs. Justiss will replace Mrs. Debbie Arrott who will be transferring to the Ozona Primary School as teacher of physical education, fulfilling a vacancy created by the retirement of Mrs. Carolyn Taylor.

Prior to adjournment, Superintendent Larry Taylor gave reports on the notification of the District's 2000-2001 administrative cost ratio. Taylor also presented the 2002 TAAS testing results, which indicate the district's four campuses may receive an "Exemplary" rating from the Texas Education Agency.

The board voted to set the date and time of its June regular meeting on June 13 at 7:00 p.m.

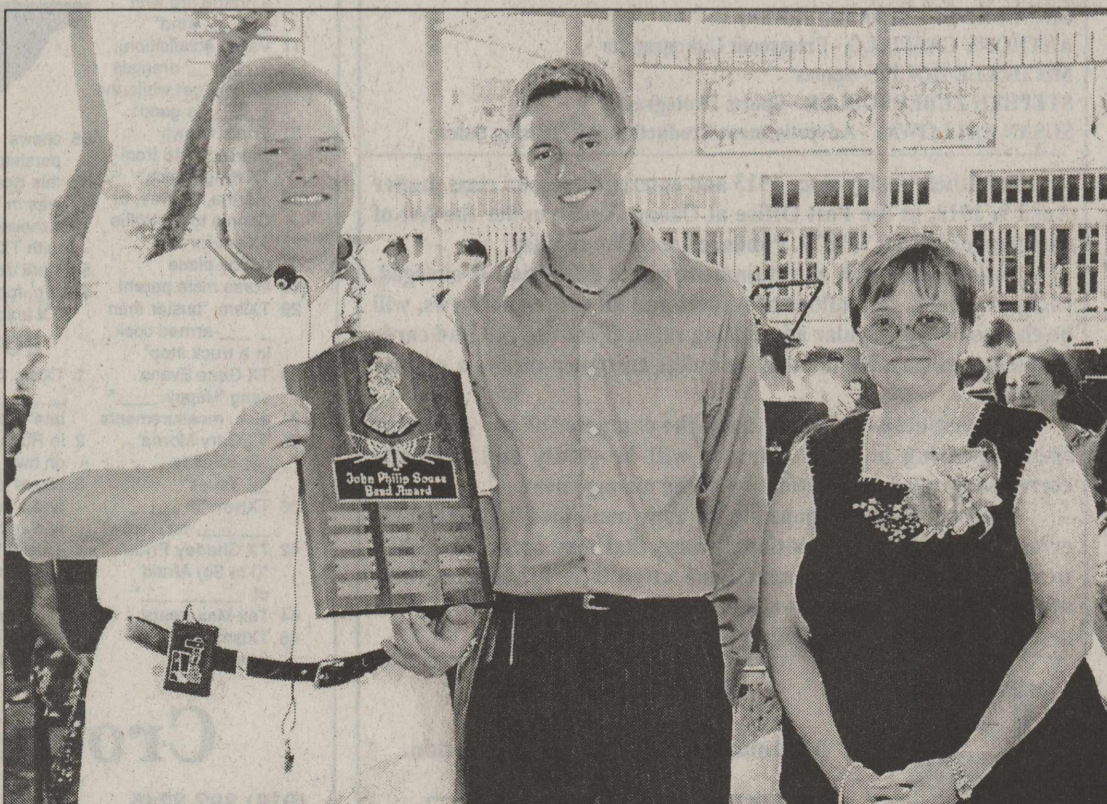

This article is about an interesting happening in Ozona I have heard of for years but did not expect to find in the paper. Publisher Evert White thought it was interesting news to have a story of such a close relationship.

 W. R. and J. M. Baggett Partnership Dissolved With Property Division After Lasting Thirty Years

A partnership between brothers that existed thirty years was dissolved here this week when the final detail of the division of the property was completed by W. R. and J. M. Baggett on a business that has been profitable for the brothers for more than a quarter of a century. The men decided to separate as their sons, James Baggett and Billie Baggett, were getting old enough to be in the ranch business.

The division - J. M. Baggett to get the ranch and stock south of Ozona and W. R. Baggett the ranch and stock five miles north of Ozona.

The partnership was formed in 1899 when they acquired the lands they now own from Giles Sowell and Dick Williamson. Starting as cowboys when Crockett County was in its infancy, the two brothers built a comfortable fortune. They were classed at the time they dissolved as the best fixed ranchers in Crockett County. They had a joint checking account all those years for both business and personal. (Just shows what no fussing can do.)

Tijerina deployed to Mediterranean

Marine Corps Lance Cpl. Alfredo Tijerina Jr., a 2000 graduate of Ozona High School, recently departed on a 6-month deployment to the Mediterranean Sea and Arabian Gulf while assigned to the 22nd Marine Expeditionary Unit, based in Camp Lejeune, NC.

Tijerina is one of more than 10,000 Atlantic Fleet sailors and Marines aboard the ships of the USS John F. Kennedy Carrier Battle Group and USS Wasp Amphibious Ready Group.

While on deployment, Tijerina will participate in joint-service, multi-national operations and have the opportunity to visit foreign ports. Prior to deploying, the groups participated in a 17-day Atlantic joint task force exercise designed to prepare naval forces for contingencies that might occur during the deployment. Marines and sailors trained in amphibious, undersea and surface warfare operations and maritime interception.

Tijerina's unit is an expeditionary intervention force with the ability to rapidly organize for combat operations in virtually any environment. MEU's are composed of more than 2,000 personnel and are divided into an infantry battalion, aircraft squadron, support group and command element. With this combination, Tijerina's unit supplies and sustains itself for either quick mission accomplishment or clearing the way for follow-on forces.

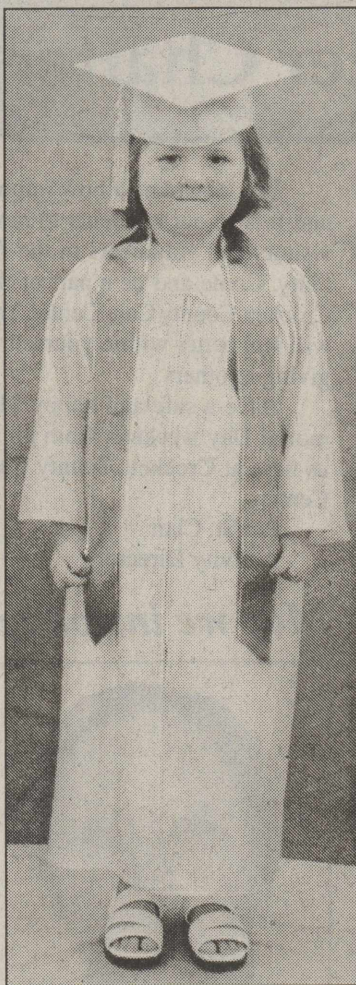
Scoring for the faculty were Dale Mayfield with a basket and two of four free throws and Minnick with a basket. Laura Skehan sank one of four free throws.

Electric transmission lines proposed

Representatives of the Lower Colorado River Authority (LCRA) Transmission Services Corporation were in Ozona May 13 to talk about a proposed electric transmission line which will extend in part through Crockett County. LCRA and West Texas Utilities will work together on the project to build two new 138-kilovolt, double-circuit electric transmission lines to carry electricity from windpower plants in West Texas to other parts of the state through the statewide electric grid.

LCRA Transmission Services Corporation is an affiliate of the Lower Colorado River Authority, and West Texas Utilities is a subsidiary of American Electric Power.

One new line will connect the Fort Lancaster Substation southeast of Sheffield to the Friend Ranch Substation east of Ozona. The other line will run from Friend Ranch to the San Angelo area.

Once constructed, the lines will cross portions of Pecos, Terrell, Crockett, Irion, Schleicher and Tom Green counties.

The new lines will deliver renewable wind energy to customers throughout the state, helping alleviate overloading on existing equipment that has resulted from the additional windpower generated in the McCamey area in West Texas.

Independent power producers have installed approximately 750 megawatts of new wind generation capacity additions in

the McCamey area. Texas Senate Bill 7 requires transmission system providers within the Electric Reliability Council of Texas (ERCOT) to provide transmission services to independent power producers who request interconnection services.

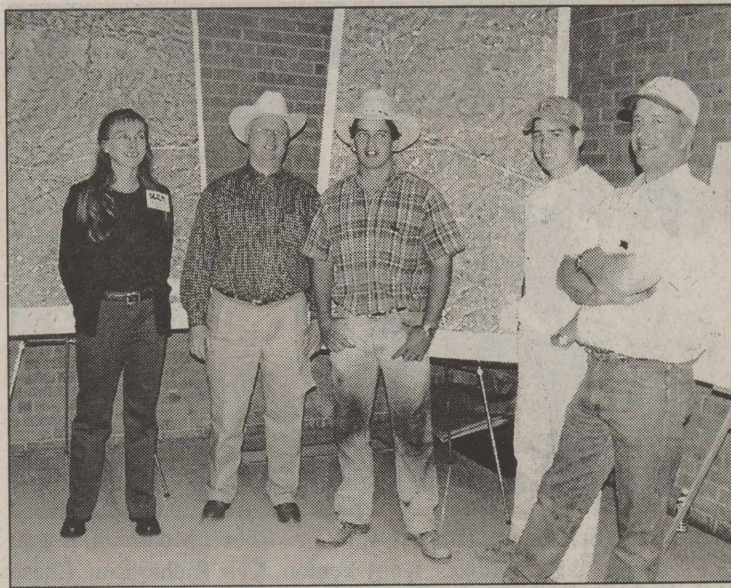
Meetings such as the one in Ozona give potentially affected landowners an opportunity to view the proposed routes for the project and provide comment. Once routes are finalized, LCRA Transmission Services Corporation must apply for certificates of convenience and necessity (CCCN) from the Public Utility Commission of Texas. The application will include a preferred route and a varying number of alternate routes for each project.

Applications are typically submitted within six months of the open house. During this period, landowners and other interested parties are encouraged to contact LCRA Transmission Services Corporation with any questions they have concerning the project or the filing. The corporation will immediately notify affected landowners about the PUC process upon submitting its applications. A final notice will be sent to affected landowners when the CCNs are approved. The approval process can take up to one year.

LCRA Transmission Services Corporation will purchase easement rights along the path of the transmission lines to allow for construction, operation and maintenance of the lines. Owners of land directly affected by the lines will be contacted and all efforts will be made to minimize disturbances to landowners and their property.

After completing any work on the transmission lines, the surface of the easement property will be restored. Landowners may continue to use the easement property for activities such as farming and ranching, as long as the activity does not interfere with the lines' construction, operation and maintenance and does not jeopardize the safe use of the easement area.

Walter May of LCRA was present to answer questions about

electric and magnetic fields. These fields exist everywhere electricity is used, he explained, including hairdryers, computers, television and power lines. Although there has been extensive scientific research, no direct link has been established between exposure to power lines and adverse health effects. Neither the state government nor the federal government has established any health standard relating to electric and magnetic fields.

The Texas Legislature created the Lower Colorado River Authority in 1934 as a conservation and reclamation district without taxing authority. LCRA's traditional service area covers all or part of 58 counties. The LCRA is governed by a 15-member board of directors appointed by the governor and confirmed by the Texas Senate.

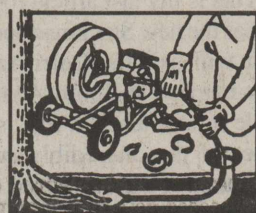
The LCRA is funded by sales of electricity, water and other services, it receives no local, state or federal tax appropriations. The LCRA operates three power plants, produces hydroelectricity as a by-product of water supply management and buys power from West Texas wind farms. It provides electricity to 43 wholesale customers serving more than one million people.

The LCRA operates and maintains 3,300 miles of transmission lines, 264 substations and a system operations control center.

It manages a 600-mile stretch of the lower Colorado River and operates six dams that form the Highland Lakes northwest of Austin. It manages water supplies in the lower Colorado River basin, providing water to cities, industries and farmers. Additionally the LCRA designs, builds, upgrades and operates water and wastewater utilities that service a wide range of needs.

About 16,500 acres of land owned by the LCRA are open to the public for recreation along the Highland Lakes and the lower Colorado River. The LCRA has about 40 public recreation sites, including parks, environmental learning centers, river access points and nature preserves. LCRA also provides technical assistance and matching funds to communities for local park development projects in the service area.

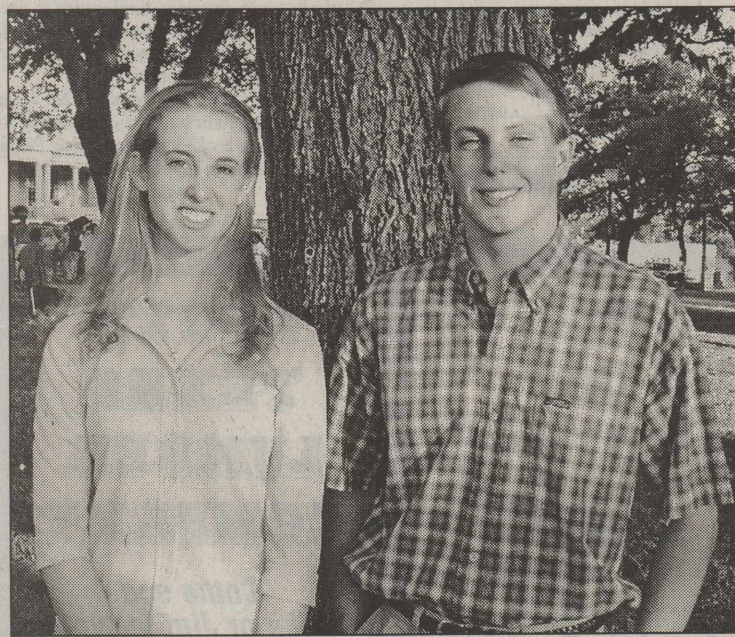
