view the proposed routes for the project and provide comment. Once routes are finalized, LCRA Transmission Services Corporation must apply for certificates of
convenience and necessity convenience and necessity
(CCCN) from the Public Utility Commission of Texas. The application will include a preferred route and a varying number of alternate routes for each project.
Applications are typically
abmitted within six months of the submitted within six months of the open house. During this period,
landowners and other interested parties are encouraged to contact LCRA Transmission Services Corporation with any questions they have concerning the project or the filing. The corporation will immediately notify affected landowners about the PUC process A final notice will be sent to affected landowners when the CCNs are approved. The approval process can take up to one year. LCRA Transmission Services Corporation will purchase easement rights along the path of
the transmission lines to allow for construction, operation and mainconstruction, operation and mainland directly affected by the lines will be contacted and all efforts will be made to minimize disturbances to landowners and their property.

After completing any work on the transmission lines, the sur-
face of the easement property will be restored. Landowners may continue to use the easement property for activities such as farming and ranching, as long as the activity does not interfere with the
lines' construction mes construction, operation and
