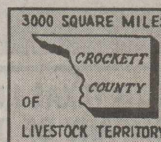

## Forestry Service provides free equipment to Fire Department

Ozona Volunteer Fire Department took advantage of equipment aid available from the Texas Forest Service. The department acquired a free pickup truck, courtesy of the Federal Excess Personal Property (FEPP) equipment program administered by the agency Under the FEPP program, equipment acquired through the military is transferred to qualifying fire departments at no cost.

Additional free equipment is available to rural fire departments, thanks to the Volunteer Fire Department Helping Hands program, through which companies and or-

ganizations donate used fire equipment for use by volunteer fire departments. Companies interested in donating industrial fire equipment should contact the TFS Rural Fire Defense Section at 936-639-8130 for more information.

Volunteer fire departments may save money through several other programs administered by the Texas Forest Service. A self-insurance vehicle liability insurance pool offers liability coverage for \$200 per vehicle, ambulances excluded. Fire departments can also purchase firefighter clothing, hand tools and water handling ac-

cessories at discount prices through the Fire Safe program. TFS regional fire coordinators located across the state now provide local training in wildland firefighting techniques and assist fire departments with applications for equipment and financial assistance.

Detailed information on volunteer fire department assistance programs is available from the Texas Forest Service regional fire coordinators and from the agency's Rural Fire Defense Section, P. O. Box 310, Lulkin, TX 75902-0310.

## Make plans now for the David Crockett Birthday Festival

Ozona Chamber of Commerce is working on the 10th Annual David Crockett Birthday Festival and fundraiser scheduled for Saturday, Aug. 3. The event will once again be held at fairgrounds park next to the rodeo arena. Festivities will begin at 10:00 a.m. with the Friends of the Library Lawn Mower Race. Arts and crafts, food and beverage and activity booths will be open to visit until 5:00 p.m. Those interested in entering the parade can

line up at Calib's Restaurant at 5:15 p.m.

Admission into the festival is \$1.00 per person. There will be games throughout the day for both the young and young at heart. The sidewalk chalk art, blind man's wheelbarrow race, sack race, the lemon roll, hula hoop contest, watermelon eating contest and the water balloon contest are just a few activities that will be available.

### News Briefs

#### Time to enter rodeo queen's contest

Entries are now being accepted for contestants for the Lions' Club Youth Rodeo Queen's Contest. The competition is open to girls in grades 9-12.

Entrants are required to compete in horsemanship and interview divisions and must be a contestant in the rodeo.

Girls in grades three through eight are eligible for the Princess Court, and they also must be contestants in the youth rodeo.

#### County to have new area code

Two new area codes taking effect next year to handle economic growth in West Texas are 432 and 325. Crockett County will have some of each. The major portion of the county will be included in the 325 code, but the northwestern tip will extend into the 432 area code. All numbers in the exchange boundary area covered by the 392 prefix will remain together.

In February, the Public Utility Commission (PUC) issued an order that divided the 915 area

code into three individual area code regions. The Commission designated the El Paso area to retain the 915 area code because of its concentrated population, extensive bilingual network and well-developed international commerce. The rest of the current 915 area code will be divided by two north-south boundaries. The new area code will be 432 for the central section and 325 for the eastern section.

Current estimates predict that the 915 area code will run out of numbers in early 2004. The three-way split approved by the PUC will prevent the need for additional area codes in the three regions for an estimated 17 to 20 years.

While approximately two-thirds of customers in the current 915 region will have to change their area code, the PUC determined the three-way split is the best way to preserve local interests. For example, the three-way split allows the Midland-Odessa metropolitan area to continue sharing a common area code (432). The three-way split also allows customers to keep seven-digit dialing for local calls. The approved plan received overwhelming support from both residential and business customers during the public comment period.

The current schedule introduces the two new area codes April 5, 2003 with permissive dialing using either the 915 area code or one of the new ones. Mandatory dialing using the new codes becomes effective Oct. 5, 2003. Customers dialing the old area code will get a recorded reminder until Dec. 7, 2003. An extensive customer education program to introduce customers to the new area codes will begin in early 2003.

#### Commissioners accept new subdivision plan

A preliminary plan submitted by Texas Land and Ranches for the Rimrock Ranch Subdivision was accepted by commissioners July 15. Renée Howes presented the plan with a request for variances.

Court members voted to accept this preliminary plat, grant variances and consider the final plat at their next regular meeting, which will be Aug. 12.

A plat submitted for the Erby Chandler Industrial Addition #1 was also approved by the court with the conditions that the final plat comply with all county regulations.

Court members and County Attorney Bill Mason discussed possible revisions and clarifications to the county's subdivision regulations. Mason is to review the existing regulations and rec-

ommend any needed changes at a future date.

Fuel bids from Shelton Oil and Gas, C&W and Eddins -

Walcher were reviewed with the bid from Shelton being accepted.

The remainder of the meeting was spent in budget review.

#### Stockman earns TPA award

The Ozona Stockman was recognized for its 2001 sports coverage when the Texas Press Association held its 123rd Summer Convention in Corpus Christi.

Competing in a section with 22 other newspapers, The Stockman placed second. In addition to being commended for its sports coverage, judges' comments included praise for the quality of night football shots.

Entrants are required to submit two issues for each category entered, one from a month speci-



fied by contest rules and a second entry chosen by the publisher.

This year's TPA Better Newspaper Contest was judged by the Missouri Press Association. A total of 113 newspapers submitted 1301 entries broken down into 10 divisions in which papers compete against peers of similar size.

#### Bikers travel to make patriotic statement

Friends Tracy Tippetts of Escondido, CA, and Larry Barrett of Portland, OR, passed through Ozona last week on a 33 day, 9,000 mile journey a year later than planned. A lot, including the purpose of their trip, has changed in that year.

"Who would have believed the Twin Towers wouldn't be there now," said Tippetts.

"This trip is to make a patriotic statement," Tippetts said. "We're not interested in being politically correct, we want to be powerfully correct."

Among the slogans guiding the men as they cycle from California to Key West to New York City, Toronto and home are: "Freedom isn't free. The Spirit of the USA - Can't take that away. We may be different, but we're not divided," and "Let's Roll".

Tippetts said he was not a Scout as a youth but now, at age 52, he was moved to download the Scout Pledge. He is learning the Scout Law from flash cards while traveling across the country.

If more people lived by the Scout Law, the world would be a better place, he said.

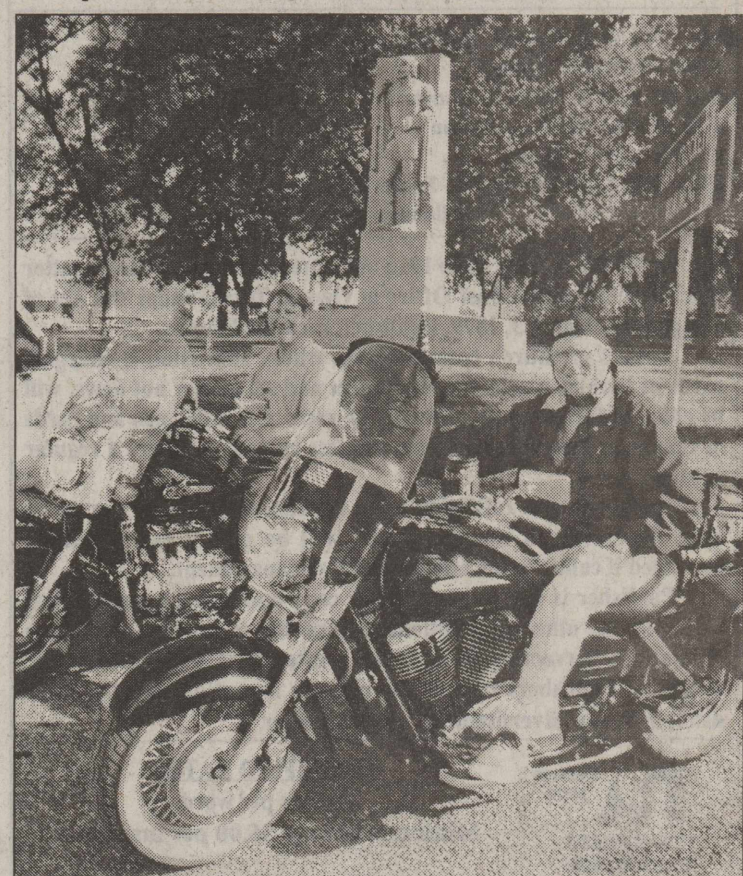
Tippetts came through Ozona at the age of 15 while vacationing with his family. A journal kept

by his twin brother shows Ozona to be one of the best stops on the vacation, Tippetts said.

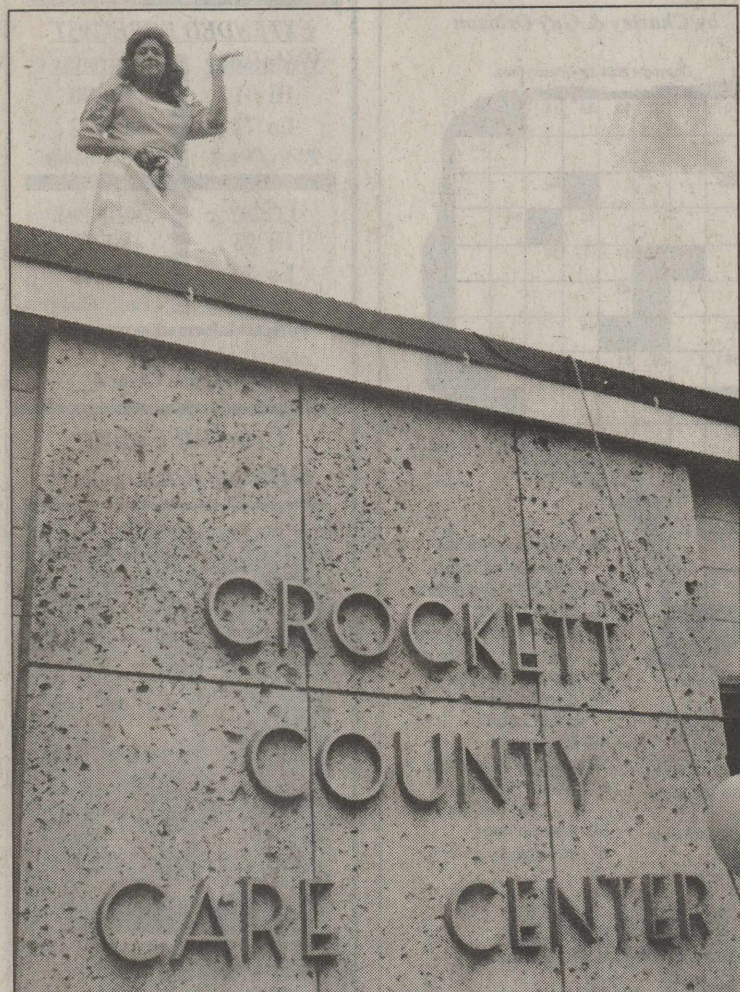
Both men agreed that Ozona and the welcome they received were special. Their overnight stay

### Crockett County History

"This is the way it was"

This story some will remember.

April 24, 1934. A drouth during 1933 and 1934 and the ending of the "Depression" has hurt the western counties of Texas, especially Crockett, one of the largest producers of cattle and sheep in Texas.

July 5, 1934. The government started a cattle buying program to help producers

June 8, 1934. More than half million cattle purchased in the state affected by the drouth. Government buying in full swing in county

July 12, 1934. Tuesday night 613 head had been approved for purchase by the government. 32 percent will be killed on the spot and the balance shipped.

The going price was from \$12 to \$20 a head for grown animals, \$10 to \$15 for yearlings and \$4 to \$8 a head for calves. Condemned animals are paid for at \$12. That is the condemned, not good, cattle. The average purchase is about 250 head per day.

July 19, 1934. P.L. Childress first rancher in county to receive check. The check for 159 cattle and calves with 400 being killed. Cattle sales to the government have brought \$90,000. Of the 8,365 head offered by 80 ranchers, 1,593 were killed out of 4,346. 80 ranchers so far in program

July 26, 1940. T. A. Kincaid and son Bud are in Salt Lake City at a meeting concerning the buying and slaughter of sheep and goats. At this time, there are 10,375 head signed up and 6,301 approved.

Aug. 2, 1934. Cattle moving again after a five day strike. Total value of cattle at this time shipped or killed \$115,000

Aug. 9, 1934. Government buying sheep may be started Aug. 20. Crockett County expected to be among the first.

You will note they are still buying cattle but are expected to start sheep and goats soon. The price has been set by the government at \$200 for sheep one year old and up. \$140 a head for Angora goats one year and up.

Aug. 23, 1934. Cattle buying has been curtailed here. 300 head a week - two day allotted county

Aug. 30, 1934. Sheep and goat buying by the government expected to start soon. The applications and inventory forms are being signed by ranchmen. With these the government can set quota for county.

More than 12,000 head of cattle purchased by the government according to figures in the office of J. S. Barlow in charge of livestock purchases here. The total amount approved is \$125,000 of which \$105,000 has been paid.

Sept. 6, 1934. There is a short delay as the applications must go to A&M College and Denver, Colorado for approval. 140,000 sheep and goats signed up. Less than expected.

Sept. 13, 1934. Sheep and goat buying expected to start Monday. 600 head a day rate of purchase, 136,000 offered. T. A. Kincaid Jr. named sorter in county. The ruling the animals killed on the range must be skinned and the pelts delivered to the shipping point before payment.

Sept. 25, 1934. More than 25,000 head killed the first day. Only 12 percent shipped. All available labor given jobs skinning carcasses. The program continued until the inventories completed. The government also had a feed loan program.

This is history in the ranch country. The drouth 1933, 1934 and 1935.



# Obituaries

## July 16 service for Lola Mae Daniel



Retired missionary Lola Mae Daniel died Saturday evening, July 13, 2002. Funeral service was held at Austin's Weed-Corley Funeral Home Tuesday with burial in Eastend Cemetery in Stephenville that afternoon. She would have been 100 Sept. 21.

Childhood dreams of serving in the missionary field led her to volunteer for missions in 1920 while in high school. She had grown up hearing her father, a Baptist minister, talk about legendary missionary to China Lottie Moon.

To prepare for the mission field, she attended Howard Payne University. After graduating in 1926, she applied to the Foreign Mission Board and was accepted.

However, the Depression hit and the cooperative program was only one year old and there was no money to send any of the 302 missionaries ready to go.

She began teaching school,

which left her free to do mission work in the summers. She spent three summers working with the Billy Graham crusades. During his historic 16-week crusade in New York she worked in the office during the day and counseled at the services each night. Almost a third of those she counseled each evening were Chinese.

When she had not been appointed to China by the age of 35, the maximum age for a foreign missionary, she was disappointed, but continued to hope.

It was in 1962 while she was teaching in Ozona that she learned of the need for English teachers in Taiwan. The age limit was 60. Proceeding on faith, she bought a ticket to Taiwan and made application. She was approved the day before her flight, and she reached 60 the month after she arrived in Taiwan.

She came home at the mandatory retirement age of 75, but she knew in her heart she would go to mainland China someday. It was in 1986, 66 years after she had surrendered to go, that she finally reached China.

When she left mainland China to return home, more than 300 Chinese came to the airport to see her off.

Back in Texas, she served as an volunteer missionary-in-residence at Howard Payne.

## Martinez takes part in ship decommissioning

The mine-countermeasures support ship USS Inchon (MCS 12) was decommissioned at a ceremony June 20, 2002. The Navy intends to sink the ship by using it for target practice later this year.

Navy Petty Officer 3rd Class Leroy G. Martinez, the son of Augustine and Yolanda Martinez and brother of Jerrie Lynn Fierro of Ozona, was a personnel specialist on Inchon who worked as a reenlistment clerk.

Sailors began serving on Inchon in 1969 when it was designated as an amphibious warfare helicopter carrier. During Operations Desert Shield and Desert Storm, it was determined that a permanent command ship was needed to oversee mine countermeasures operations. By the middle 1990's, Inchon had been converted for mine countermeasures support.

The ship was scheduled to be decommissioned in 2005, but when the ship suffered an accident the Navy decided to hasten its retirement instead of paying for costly repairs. On October 19, 2001, a fire on Inchon killed one sailor and caused considerable damage to the vessel.

This disaster, however, was not the ship's defining moment. Thousands of Sailors will remem-

ber the ship as a place where they made landmarks in their careers.

"I am proud of the all the qualifications I earned, especially my surface and air warfare specialist badges," said Martinez, a 1993 graduate of Ozona High School.

Though Inchon will not go on to serve the United States, Martinez and others from Inchon will go on to schools and to other jobs throughout the fleet.

"I plan on staying in twenty years. The next place I'm going to go to is Gulfport, Miss.," said Martinez, a three-year Navy veteran.

As Martinez leaves Inchon behind, he takes with him the experiences gained from serving his country aboard a fine ship. Martinez and others who served on the ship will ensure that Inchon is remembered.
