



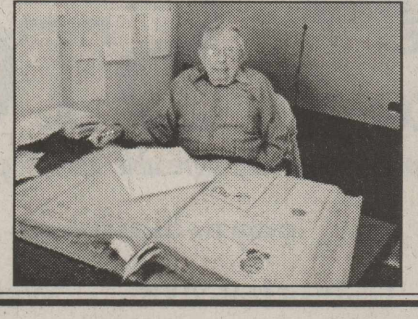

## Crockett County History

"This is the way it was"

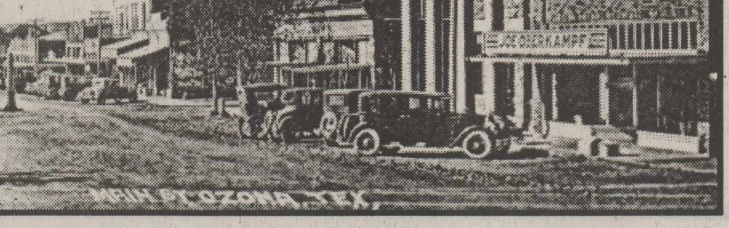


January 25, 1935  
 Something long gone is the tent theater that used to come by and stay a week. A different play was presented each night by live actors.  
 The first one I remember in 1926 or 1927 was the "Chataqua" tent show. It was a nationally known show. In the early Stockman it was reported they came here a year or so, then other shows, such as the Morgan Helvey show, came. The shows always had a piano and small orchestra.  
 We are in the February 15, 1934, issue of The Stockman. An article about a truck accident on the big hill just completed (later we called it the Sheffield Hill). The driver picked up some hitchhikers. Near the bottom of the hill at high speed the truck seemed to explode. The flywheel (old trucks) flew up in the cab, crushing the leg of the woman sitting in the middle of the front seat. The driver suffered a mangled thumb. The

other two were okay. A piece of the metal was hurled out of the cab and went nearly 200 yards and hit a camp shack of Miles Construction Co. located at the bottom of the Sheffield Hill.  
 April 20, 1934  
 Soft Ball Comes to Ozona  
 A new popular sport is taking hold in many West Texas towns. The merchants played a practice game - a lot of people were interested and it is thought at least four teams for a league here.  
 May 30, 1935  
 Heavy rains over the whole ranch country give the drouth a final out.  
 The Fair Association voted to abandon the show and sale. A group of citizens are going to try and have a rodeo. No sheep show, sale or horse racing. That is gone.

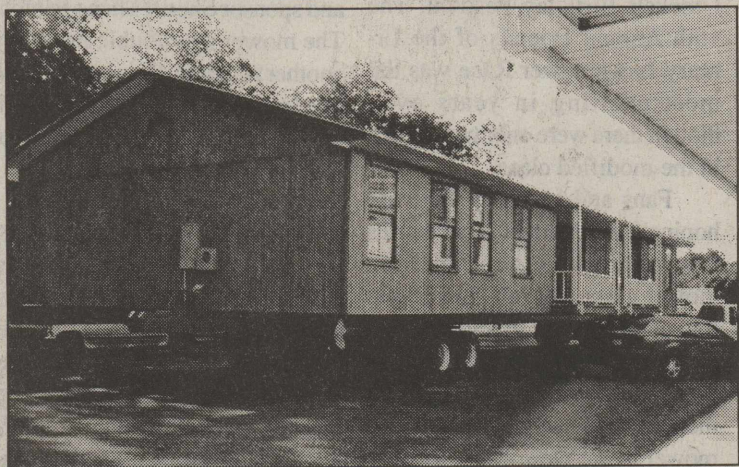

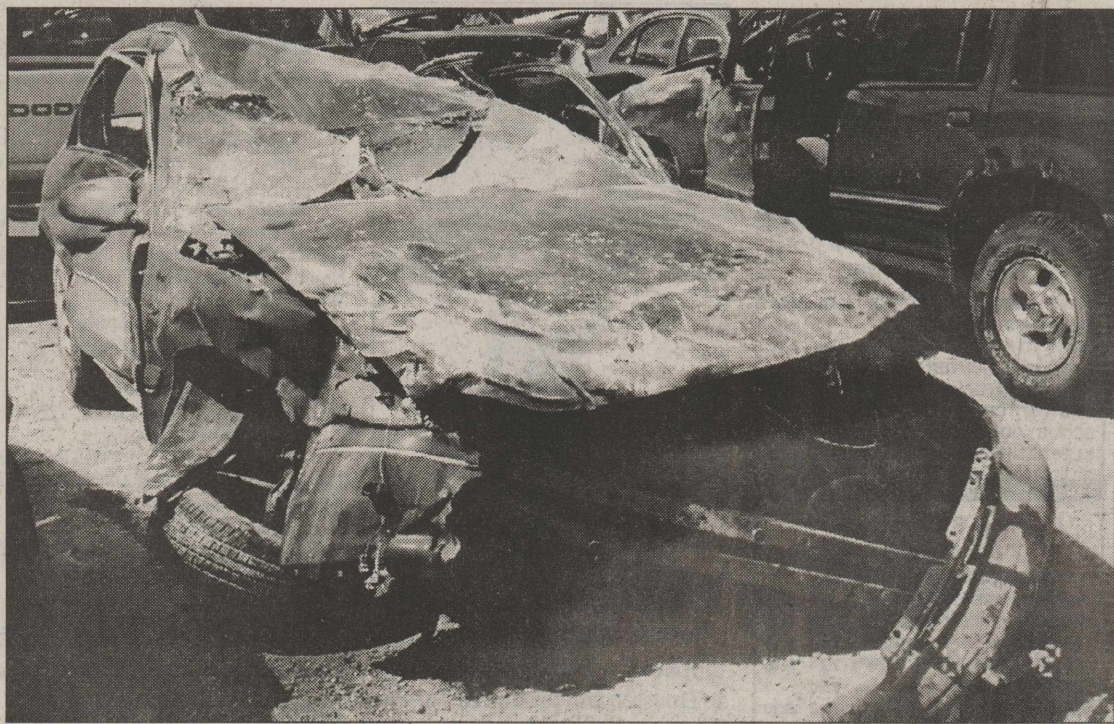

The river wasn't very deep, and it twisted and turned and there were even a few sandbars in the middle. Standing on the riverbank we watched the other fishermen for a few minutes. They were catching a few, but mostly small ones. The young man who brought us to the spot had led us to believe that we could catch big fish here, and that we would all catch our limit. He left and shortly returned, pulling a small boat. He had us get into the boat and pulled us to one of the sandbars. He brought the bait (it didn't look attractive to me) and told us to put our lines in the water on the shallow side of the sandbar. There we stood, the only ones on the sandbars (everyone else on the riverbanks), using some weird bait, in shallow water, and hoping to catch a lot of big fish. It sure did take a lot of faith.

# Crockett Birthday Festival and fundraiser a success

The Ozona Chamber of Commerce recently held its annual festival and fundraiser, the 10th Annual David Crockett Birthday Festival, Saturday, Aug. 3. The event was held at the park next to the rodeo arena and convention center.

"The chamber of commerce sponsors this festival each year for two reasons: one, it provides an activity for our community, which we can also promote to bring in out-of-town visitors, and two, it is our annual fundraiser," said Shanon Biggerstaff, executive director.

It provides a summer activity for the people in Ozona. Many vendors stayed overnight, which provided revenue to our motels. The people either participating or attending the event impacted all our RV parks, restaurants and grocery stores," said Biggerstaff.
