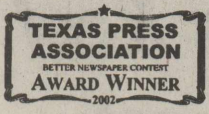


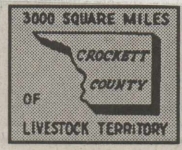

Taylor bound for state track meet Crockett Maintenance wins Outstanding Team Award

On the weekend of April 25-26, the Ozona Lions regional qualifiers did battle with Region 1-AA's best at Abilene Christian's Elmer Grey Track Complex.

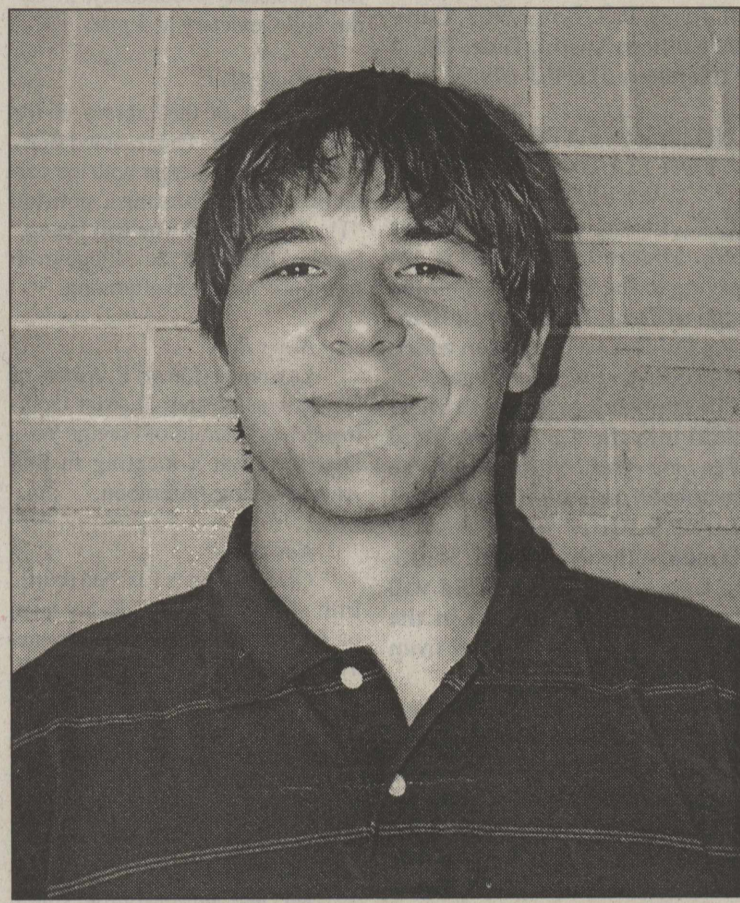
The Friday results saw junior Jarryd Taylor qualify for state with a second place finish in the shot put. The qualifying throw was 49-7, just behind Idalou's Emmanuel Peralez's throw of 49-9.25.

Jarryd will compete at the state meet in Austin on Saturday, May 10 at 2:00 p.m. He is the fifth shot putter to qualify in Ozona boys' track history for the state meet since 1958. The other state qualifying shot putters were Jake Young, Gary Pagan, Gary Sutton, and David Pagan.

Earlier in the day on Friday, Eliseo Treto placed fourth in the 3200M run with a season best of 10:27.85.

Taylor and Ramon Trujillo threw well enough in the discus to make the finals in this event. Taylor threw 143-3 to finish in fourth, and Trujillo threw 139-3 for an eighth place finish.

During the running prelims, Brad Mayfield hurdled his way to a time of 15.02 but came up .01

short of a qualification time. In the 100M dash preliminary, Ryan McNeely ran 11.24 but failed to qualify for the finals. In Saturday's races, Treto finished ninth in the 1600M run with a time of 4:55.92. The Lions finished with 14 points as a team.

Coach Tom Duncan remarked, "The boys overcame a lot of obstacles and remained greatly competitive. The season saw many positives and much improvement by the tracksters. I

wish to thank all of the fans who kept cheering and hopefully we will continue to represent them in the future seasons!"

Coach Duncan also added, "Deep personal thanks go out to everyone who helped us stage the finest track meets the area had. The list of names would fill the whole newspaper. The tradition of Ozona track and field will certainly remain strong because of your concern and volunteer help."

Whether it's on the softball field or back at the office, the Crockett County Maintenance Section has demonstrated that teamwork is extremely important in conducting business as usual.

"The members of the Ozona Maintenance Section manifest the real meaning of teamwork, and all the employees have gone above and beyond their share of responsibilities," summarized a memo to announce this group as the San Angelo District's Team of the Year for 2002.

During a special Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) staff meeting on Feb. 28, the Ozona employees were honored by members of the Employee Recognition Committee with certificates and gifts. Each honoree selected either a camera, telephone answering machine, cordless telephone, binoculars, framed scenic photo from TxDOT's Travel Division, or a US Savings Bond.

Following the staff meeting, the Ozona crew hosted a barbecue luncheon at the Ozona Civic Center to celebrate their award with staff members from the San Angelo District Office, including District Engineer Walter McCullough.

The local San Angelo District Outstanding Team is the second recipient of the prestigious Outstanding Team Award that was introduced last year. Initially, the Employee Recognition Program began in 1998 to recognize employees for being selected by the Employee Recognition Committee as Outstanding Employee of the Quarter.

Multiple nominations cited examples of how a majority of employees worked together for five months, assisting the Big Lake Maintenance Section during a transitional period between supervisors. One of the roles of this group was to help train new employees during the search for a new supervisor in Big Lake. The remaining staff in Ozona assumed additional duties to maintain a high level of production.

The nomination form acknowledged the group for working together as a team: "All the members of the group worked so well together and showed they were a team that looked out for each other, supported each other, and were always willing to do what was asked."

The supervisor in Ozona agreed that the employees pulled together. "Ozona's group is an outstanding team that is united

Crawford sets record..... Ladies finish season at regional meet

The Lady Lion track team met with other regional qualifiers at the region 1-AA track meet in Abilene last weekend. The highlight for the Ladies came when Colbey Crawford ran the 400M dash. In the race, she finished third, making her an alternate for state. Her time of 60.98 (automatic time, the hand timing clocked her at 60.42) set a new school record for the Lady Lions. Colbey broke the previous record of 61.22 set by Claudia Avila in 1990.

Britney Ramos was the only other Lady Lion to garner points

at the meet. She placed fifth in the 1600M run with a time of 5:45.30. This race was a gutsy one for Britney considering she has been hampered with a leg injury over the past several weeks.

The Ladies' other competitors were Katy Churchill in the 300 hurdles, Heather Ybarra in the 200M dash, and Casey Ybarra, Ruth Cervantez, Brandi Buchanan, and Heather Ybarra in the 800M relay.

"These girls ran on Friday in the prelims but did not advance to the finals. The injury bug really prevented us from performing our best, and it was a real credit to the heart and desire of the girls to get as far as they did," remarked Coach Steve Osborn.

It is the concern and responsibility of every person to see that soil resources be conserved and managed properly and water quality and quantity be maintained to assure the welfare of all citizens.

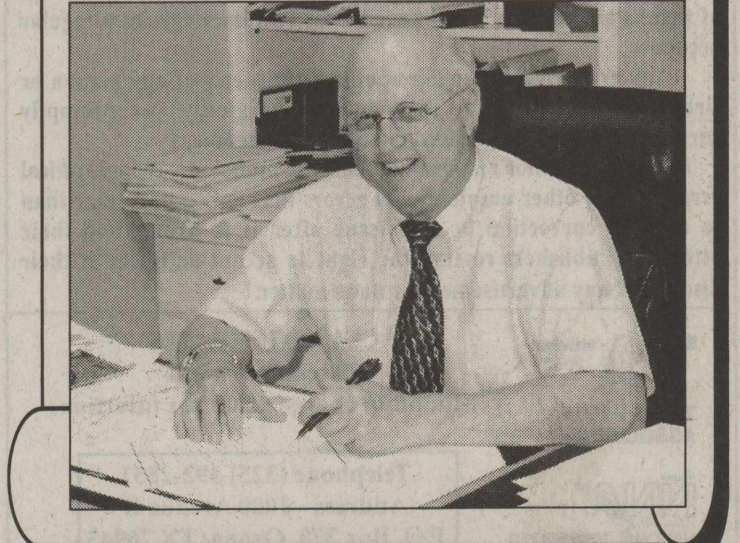
Soil and water conservation districts provide a practical and democratic organization through which landowners are taking the initiative to properly use and protect these resources.

CDA is the only major national effort to improve childcare by evaluating and recognizing the skills of individuals providing care. The first credential was

awarded 25 years ago, and now 46 states plus the District of Columbia include CDA in their childcare licensing regulations.

As part of the CDA assessment process, every candidate for the CDA credential is observed working with young children or families by an early childhood professional. In addition, the candidate must demonstrate the ability to work with families to develop children's physical and intellectual capabilities in a safe and healthy learning environment.

Crockett County History

"This is the way it was"

Crockett County Rodeos

Ranchers in Crockett County had rodeos and a celebration from 1898. The roping was held west of Johnson Draw where the school is.

In 1926 a group of ranchers formed a fair association and purchased from T. A. Kincaid 23.9 acres of land. They fenced in an arena for roping and built an outside fence for a race track (horse racing). Both fences were wire.

Of course, there was no public address system or lights.

In 1926 they had a July 8 celebration with sheep show and sale, rodeo and horse racing. On Dec. 31, 1926 and Jan. 1 1927, there was a mid-winter race meet and rodeo.

July 4-6 of 1927 Ozona had a sheep show and sale, race meet, rodeo and free barbecue. Committees were appointed for each event, including the barbecue.

The fair association built a 100'x100' dance platform and a grand stand. Neither were covered. Of course, they had sheep barns and horse stalls.

They expected about 5,000 for the show and rodeo for the three days.

Barbecue necessities included: 3,400 pounds of beef, 500 loaves of bread, 10 pounds of tea, 25 pounds of coffee, 25 pounds of fat pork for the beans, two pounds of black pepper, three pounds of brown sugar, three gallons of vinegar, 160 pounds of sugar, 200 pounds of beans, 75

pounds of onions, 30 gallons of pickles, 50 gallons of stew, 1,200 pounds of ice, 75 pounds of salt, two pounds of red pepper, 4,000 plates, 3,000 tin cups, 40 galvanized buckets, 15 - 30 gallon cast iron pots, 12 galvanized tubs, 4,000 small tea spoons, 25 wooden or steel barrels.

On Dec. 22-23, 1927, the second annual mid-winter race meet and rodeo was held. All this was in rain and mud along with a football game between Ozona and Sonora. (This was the last mid-winter rodeo.)

The 1932 fair was cancelled due to the Depression. Local people had a July 4 rodeo and barbecue.

The first public address system was installed in 1934. The last year for the free barbecue was 1936. The last show sponsored by the fair association was 1939.

Ms. Stradford reports that the recipient of Justin's heart is doing extremely well. He has become a very active individual. Before the transplant, the recipient was very ill and was unable to participate in daily activities.

The recipient who received Justin's kidney and pancreas is doing very well and both organs are functioning well.

The recipient of Justin's liver is also doing very well and has returned to doing daily functions.

The recipient of Justin's other kidney is doing great and was able to attend summer camp because of the precious gift he received from Justin.

Ms. Stradford sent the following letter from a recipient to the Stuarts along with her own expression of gratitude for their decision of organ donation.

"Dear Friends,
"We were so happy to hear from you. For the longest time we have wanted to write to you, and let you know how my husband has been doing. He is doing very well,

and we hope you are doing better. We thank God for giving my husband a second chance, but sad under the conditions. It will be three years this April, and there isn't a day that goes by that we don't think of your precious Justin. My husband says that maybe his donor was a good eater because he is forever eating. We can eat at the same time, and an hour later he is hungry. The thing is, he doesn't gain or show it, and I do.

"We have three sons and 10 1/2 grandchildren. The 1/2 is due in March, possibly on Justin's birthday. Wouldn't that be wonderful. Our grandchildren love their grandpa so much, they cry when he leaves. We are always reminded of what a beautiful gift Justin has given us.

"We are so happy to have heard from you and really want to continue hearing from you. You know, reading your letter, you would think it was describing my husband. He is so much like Justin was. They call my husband "Borrado" meaning hazel eyes.

"God bless you and your family. Love and regards from mine."

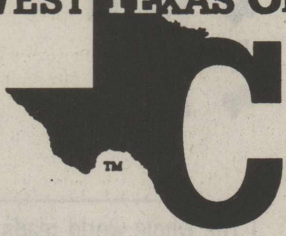

most basic issue any society faces, and one of the most complex. Food for the future will come from those people and nations fortunate enough to have the soil and water for agricultural production, the ability to provide stewardship for the land, and the freedom to pursue their agriculture in peace. The Crockett SWCD was organized for the purpose of offering farmers, ranchers and the local community a voluntary conservation technical assistance program through which individuals could seek and request conservation assistance to meet the capabilities and need of their land. "Basically it is the district's responsibility to provide technical assistance when requested relative to proper soil use and treatment, erosion control practices, solve drainage problems and assist farmers and ranchers with crop, range pastureland and wildlife management along with using trees and/or forest resources to assist in conservation," said Williams. The National Association of Conservation Districts has sponsored Soil and Water Stewardship Week in the United States since 1955, in cooperation with the nation's nearly 3,000 soil and water conservation districts. Informative material on the Soil and Water Stewardship Week theme is distributed each year through local conservation districts to clergymen, lay leaders, civic and educational organizations and to individuals interested in participating in the celebration. Information and materials for the 2003 observance of Soil and Water Stewardship Week have been distributed to local churches.

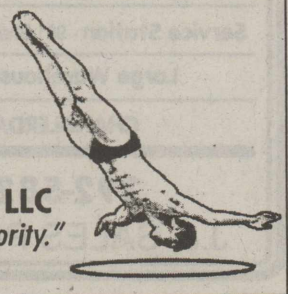
