Billed as "The X-Man" on ne framed document, Fields is an "X" C. G. Morrison Company manager, self-employed tax preparer, Deputy County Tax As-sessor-Collector, U. S. Army China, Burma, India Theater vetVFW Quartermaster, U. S. Gov ernment Range Inspector, U . S . Postmaster, Crockett County Democratic Chairman, two-term County Judge and Justice of the Peace for 24 years.
He was bookkeeper for James Motor Company, Franklin
and Cowan Drilling Company and Cowan Drilling Company, pany, Layne-Franklin Drilling Company, Franklin Motors, Ozona Community Center, United Methodist Church, Flying W Eggs and Crockett County School

"I couldn't hold a job," Fields likes to quip when asked about his
