When Jared Shaffer enlisted in the Navy, he never dreamed he would go off to war or be the man flagging a plane carrying the President of the United States as it landed on an aircraft carrier. Jared, who turned 19 on board the USS Abraham Lincoln, joined the Navy last year during spring break from Ozona High School.

"I called Dad from the recruiter's office to ask for my Social Security number," Jared said. "He knew where I was from the caller I.D. and told me I could back out if I wanted to. I was stubborn. I went for it," Jared said.

Upon graduating from boot tended aviation school at son, Jared, when the USS Abraham Lincoln docked. Pensacola, FL, learning to be an aviation mechanic. He chose to be "undesignated", a status that would allow him to learn several jobs rather than locking into one thing. After a stint at aviation mechanics, he realized he "wanted to be what everybody sees on TV, one of the yellow shirts signaling planes". From being a mechanic, he became a blue shirt (a tractor an anti-war demonstration in Hadriver) then a yellow shirt, a flight deck director.

During Operation Iraqi Freedom, Shaffer "shot off" (signaled plane departures) 35 planes assisted by a lieutenant and will continue to work on his "shooting" qualifications.

For his long-time contributions, Dec. 19, 1994, was declared A. O. Fields Day in Crockett County by the County Commissioners' Court.

He continues doing income taxes for others, serving on the museum board and as an Ambassador for the chamber. He is active in First Baptist Church and in Senior Citizens programs.

There truly was a lot to talk about Saturday afternoon while guests enjoyed refreshments. Identical cookie cakes bore the photographic image of Fields in his military uniform and were served along with punch and nuts.
